

Equipped With BrahMos, Super Sukhoi to have Fifth Generation Calibre

Jodhpur: Taking flight with a speed more than that of sound, the mainstay of Indian Air Force and the most ferocious fighter plane Sukhoi-30 MKI has now been equipped with even faster BrahMos Supersonic cruise missile. Not only this, it is also fitted with world's state of the art ASA radar which is going to make it a Fifth Generation Fighter Aircraft. Sukhoi-30, which can dominate the skies over neighbouring countries and can go deep into the realms of opposing military forces, is being developed, with the help of



Russia, at Hindustan Aeronautics Limited situated in Nasik, Maharashtra. It is important to note that the Air Force format of BrahMos missile had been prepared a long time ago and under the subjection of contract,

BrahMos Aerospace is supposed to have in Supersonic Cruise Missile this year. According to sources, the deadline would be duly met.

Sukhoi's Strength: The Super Sukhoi is not

only furnished with Indo-Russian collaborative venture, BrahMos Cruise Missile, but it will also be equipped with world's most sophisticated and advanced ASA radar. This way, India will get its fifth generation fighter aircraft. According to sources, the evaluation of air-launched BrahMos Cruise Missile, having supersonic speed all through the flight, will begin soon. According to sources, BrahMos missile has been fitted in the cavity between aircraft's engines, for which important equipment have already been fixed and set up. It is believed that the highly advanced radar will help carry the missile far out reaches and it can extend far inward to 300 kilometres and then the BrahMos missile can be launched at a target another 290 kilometres away. This aircraft,

while in its own region, will be capable of striking even heavily-armed targets like enemy air-bases.
Expense: According to sources, the total expenditure in modification of Sukhoi to make it Super Sukhoi will be decided only after a well-informed panel is selected. If sources are to be believed, the estimated cost of turning every Sukhoi into Super Sukhoi is \$2 Crore (which is approx. 100 Crores INR).
No Certain Number: According to sources, the Indian Air Force's flanker fleet needs a total of 270 Sukhoi-30 MKI aircrafts, of which 150 have already been included. The number of aircrafts to be modified into Super Sukhoi completely depends on Air Force. However, it is decided that this task will be completed at different stages.

Aam Aadmi Party leads in Delhi - exit poll



If opinion polls are to be believed, the much awaited and somewhat bitter contest of Delhi is between Bhartiya Janata Party and relatively new Aam Aadmi Party in the national capital. The congress which was reduced to under 10 seats in the elections held here in 2013 is being considered as no threat whatsoever to any of the parties. Interestingly, AAP is campaigning for the 49 days of governance where Arvind Kejriwal was chief minister while BJP has more than 8 months of achievements to convince voters. Congress though is still hopeful is counting on the 15 years of reign of Sheila Dikshit, a chief minister who lost to Arvind Kejriwal of AAP in a direct contest. While BJP is advocating a good co-

ordination between state and centre's benefits, AAP is banking on a check and balance logic. Opinion polls have given AAP an edge over BJP which can be felt by the fact the BJP had to deploy top government functionary to combat AAP. AAP on the other hand has been working to campaign right after their miserable defeat in Lok Sabha elections of 2014. The question of why such a state elections are being projected as larger than life is simple. Since the parliament election 2014, this is first considerable fight and challenge for BJP. Elections that it won since May 16 had been cakewalk because BJP was facing the same opposition everywhere and Modi magic was on its full swing. But here, in Delhi, the Aam Aadmi

Party has not only emerged as a better contestant than Congress, it has also challenged BJP substantially. Bringing the super cop Kiran Bedi in the poll arena and quickly appointing her the chief ministerial candidate was initially considered as a super move by BJP think tank but many experts feel that her inexperience with political framework could be costly affair for BJP. But, the fact of the matter is that none other than Kiran Bedi could pose a contest against the much popular and powerful Kejriwal. Kejriwal after losing his ground after parliamentary elections of last year has certainly did a superb job by regaining his base in Delhi.

Election equations - Panchayat Election in Rajasthan



Udaipur Shanti Lal Meghwal is elected as Zila Pramukh, Udaipur This is a season of elections. Be it Delhi or Udaipur, people are looking ahead for new future from worthy candidates. Delhi while has AAP as new choice, Udaipur still is set with traditional rivals Congress and BJP. Unlike since

state elections 2013, things have changed and the BJP and Congress both need to introspect on results. As far as Congress is concerned, despite charisma of top leaders' campaigning, the party could not make a significant mark. After Modi wave and clean sweep recently, Panchayat election has given a rise of 15% vote share to congress which is a revival news for the oldest party of the country. And as far as BJP is concerned, it has attained victory in 60% places while the remaining 40% has gone in the favor of Congress. BJP, a party which has 162

assembly seats and all 25 parliament seats, a 60% surely is not good figure that matches with its existing position. If we talk about Mewar, only Mahendra Singh Malviya of BJP could conquer in Banswara Zila Parishad otherwise rest areas of Panchayat Samiti have been won by Congress. In Doongerpur, Congress leads in 6 Panchayat Samiti while only 4 for BJP. In Udaipur, Congress was restricted to 5 Panchayat Samiti and the campaign lead by state home minister Gulab Chand Kataria ended up as most successful one. BJP has won 11

seats while one went to an independent candidate. In these 17 Panchayat Samiti 187 for BJP, 138 for congress, and 18 independent candidates have won. Zila Parishad election has also been interesting as in Udaipur alone 27 seats went to state ruling BJP while congress still has managed to get 15 seats and one has been grabbed by an independent. These elections have though been flowing with the last trends in state and Center but the way Congress has managed to count its presence proves that Congress still has lot of life.
