Mandate with responsibilities

A thumping majority, literally a clean sweep, and a historic mandate – Yes, Aam Aadmi Party lead by Arvind Kejriwal has registered an incredible victory against a brigade of stars of politics. His victory establishes the fact that people now only want to talk about issues and performances. People now evaluate the work done, the plans ahead, and credibility of the candidate before voting. Gone are the days when people could be impressed only by rallies and speeches. They still come to listen to their leaders but when they fail to find any substantial content in the speech, they feel disappointed and look for other options. Delhi election was a manifestation of positive versus negative campaigning.

Arvind Kejriwal and his spokespersons on one hand were only talking about their plans and issues, other parties including BJP were only aiming at Kejriwal. This way Kejriwal not only got positive publicity from his own campaign, he also scored lot of negative highlight. No wonder for one reason or other, he was always on media and in newspapers. People either liked his ideas or hated him, but they were always talking about him.

His intelligent plans and campaigning style won him unprecedented mandate. He was up against nationally established parties which had limitless money and other resources. But Kejriwal had only his supporters and well-wishers who lead him to the phenomenal victory. Kejriwal used his resources very well to counter two major parties in Delhi and still was able to beat them. The social media was utilized to its optimum by AAP as they were posting messages and videos every other minute which kept the subscribers engaged.

Kejriwal himself has been campaigning door to door with his people and had asked every contestant to establish a personal kind of touch with every dweller or every colony. It was the result of months long hard work after they resurrected the party post the Lok Sabha debacle and fiasco. This was not a fight of prestige for AAP, it was a matter of existence. Had AAP lost Delhi elections, keeping volunteers motivated till next 5 years would have been a daunting task. Also AAP could have never justified its own model of governance which challenges the traditional governance model in many ways. While Kejriwal and his supporter reached lower class people, asked their problems, they also launched a Delhi Dialogue program in which the youngsters shared their issues. Having collected all the problems, they created a manifesto elaborating solutions of these problems.

This endeavor connected AAP with people of Delhi very well. They saw their daily lives issues were being promised. These issues were not as intangible as India's foreign relations or GDP; these issues were like water pipe lines, electricity bills, last mile connectivity, and women safety. Many of their ideas like installation of 15 lacs camera across Delhi and free Wi-Fi though were questioned by many and would appear distant dreams but these are novel ideas and youth would love it. IT actually happened and youngsters who had lost faith in the youngest party realigned with the party manifesto.

This win also scripts a new wave of people's mood. People now are very impatient and can't wait for five years to only find that most of their promises are copied from last manifesto. This new wave has jolted the traditional politics and ideas like Janlokal, transparency in operations and funding, report cards of MLA etc would become imperative for all parties. Indeed Acche din are ahead.

cept of paid news. Sukhadia University's Vice Chancellor Prof I V Trivedi praised the management for a good introduction and said that this newspaper in English lan-

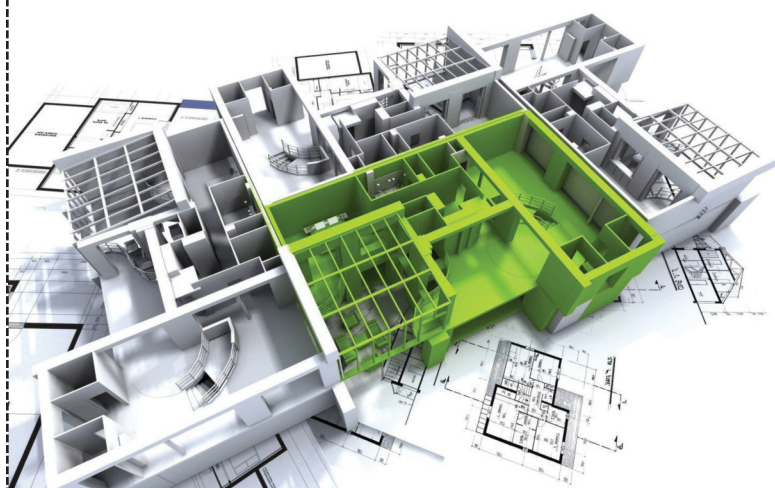
