First Women Mason Batch trained at Cairn Rajasthan Centre | A CSR Initiative



Barmer Though 'Skill training' is the new mantra for India and is driving force of Government but it is still a far cry for women in western Rajasthan where even stepping out of their household is a big achievement.

Thanks to a CSR initiative of Cairn India in partnership with ILFS

India, a group of tenacious women have broken this social barrier and stepped outside to travel a new path. This started when a group of 26 women enrolled themselves for three months vocational skill training in masonry offered by Cairn

Skills. It was not easy for these women initially to get permission from their family to enroll for the programme. However after constant counseling and discussions by CSR team with the family members of these women they finally could get their family nod to enter the programme. The two Swach Bharat campaign of months training gramme consisted of use of modern methods of teaching including use of multimedia and audio visual aids. A lot of emphasis was also put on practical aspect of the training so that they could also learn hands on apart from only theoretical know how. During the period apart from learning the art of the trade they were also made functionally literate. Now they know how to sign their name, count currency notes and even can read documents. This ensured that after completing the training the women are not only financially independent but are also equipped to face a new world.

The idea of the initiative was to empower village women and make them self-reliable. After completing the training the women have now become self-employed and are currently working as masons for constructing toilets under

GoR supported by Cairn India. On an average they Rs.500-600/day which was unimaginable for them even a few months ago. With increased income, socio economic status, this has been path defining for them. Now their opinion is sought in all family matters and they are seen as winds of change in the vil-

For a 44 year old trainee of the group, Shugni Devi this is a major change, not only for her but for her family members as well. Today they treat her with much more respect and dignity.

"I am not just another woman, I am confident of speaking my mind now. The training programme is changing the lives of women in each house of our Dhani. I hope Cairn continues this nobel initiative."
