Udaipur: On the occasion of 33rd annual awards ceremony, Prof John D Smith, who started with teaching Sanskrit in London's Cambridge University; Piyush Pandey, who brought social revolution to ads; the eminent human rights lawyer Vrinda Grover; Padma Shri JadavMulaiPayeng, popularly known as Forest Man of Assam; Thermax Limited retired social worker Padma Shri Anu Aga will be awarded with international and national medals from Maharana Mewar Foundation.

The coordinator of the ceremony, Dr Mayank Gupta announced that the awards ceremony will be held on March 22, 2015, Sunday 4 pm at City Palace, Udaipur. Cai, famous actor-producer and director Lord Richard Attenborough, Abbas Saddiwalla, Rudolf couple, Sir Noon, Andrew Topsfield, Minja Yang, etc. He said that the south Asia executive chairman and creative director of advertising company Ogilvy and Mather, Mr Piyush Pandey is known for his creative advertising. Mr Pandey will be awarded with national level award Haldighati award for his contribution to awaken social consciousness through ads. Established in the year 1982, the Haldighati award has

Statue of Mahatma Gandhi unveiled in Parliament Square



The unveiling of the 9ft (2.7m) bronze statue marks 100 years since Gandhi returned to India from South Africa to begin his struggle for independence. The Gandhi Statue Memorial Trust raised more than £1m for the work which was described as a "magnificent tribute". The statue was unveiled by Indian finance minister, Shri Arun Jaitley, in a ceremony which also involved Gandhi's grandson, Gopalkrishna Gandhi. Prime Minister David Cameron spoke at the unveiling of the statue which he called a "magnificent tribute" British sculptor, Philip Jackson, was commissioned to create the work with his previous pieces including statues of the Queen Mother and Bomber Command. He said he was inspired by photographs of the civil rights leader outside 10 Downing Street on a visit in 1931. Prime Minister David Cameron said: "This statue is a magnificent tribute to one of the most towering figures in the history of world politics and by putting Mahatma Gandhi in this famous square we are giving him an eternal home in our country."
