Maharana Mewar Charitable Foundation: Udaipur's Historic Initiative

Udaipur: Under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's global economy project "Make in India", Udaipur has tied up with France after which tourism, heritage conservation, education, history, research, multi-purpose projects like crafts, arts, cultural exchanges will commence between the two.

Under this tie-up, a 3 year MoU was signed by Maharana Mewar Charitable Foundation's Trustee Lakshyaraj Singh Mewar and France's Domaine National de Chambord's General Director Jean d'Haussonville on Thursday at Chateau de Chambord.

While Laalu Yadav was the Railways minister, he had announced to convert the Rana Pratap Nagar Railway station into a model Railway station. It's been years since then.

This station has no basic amenities for passenger till date, let alone the idea of model station. Some crawling development can be seen here but that seems to be completed in a century. As of now the foot over bridge is being constructed after which the platform number 2 will be usable. There is only one teen shade for thousands of passengers that travel daily from here. One teen shade is never sufficed to cater to all passengers. Same is with the number of benches which are countable and most of the people waiting for trains have to wait under the Sun. Other facilities like book store, caterers are far from available. While the historic station is devoid of basic amenities, the main railways station is not that good either.

An open parking in soaring mercury leaves



anyone baffled. It takes several minutes before the car or scooter becomes good enough to drive or ride. A small parking area for two wheelers which is covered remains

booked for the staff members of railway. This summer season when many tourists flock to Udaipur to spend time with family do not even get cold water to drink as water

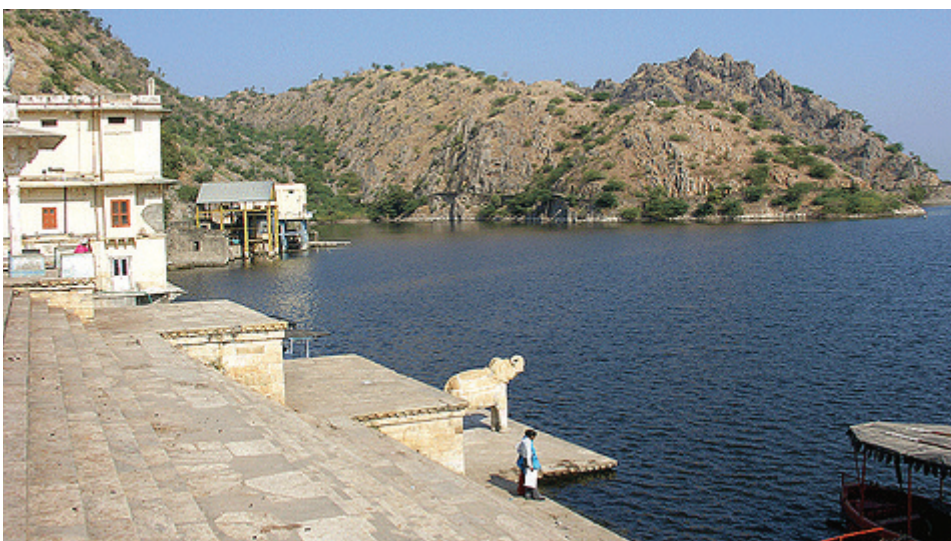
coolers are out of order.

The only things that brings some accolades to this station is the recently installed solar panels which brightens this station up with the green energy of the Sun. The first thing that a tourist sees in a city is railway station as this is the only highly connected medium for the people. No matter how shiny our historic monuments are or how serene lakes and garden look, the first impression must be counted. And Railways will have to not only understand this but also work towards betterment of these stations which open gates to the History.



Is Udaipur prepared to tackle water woes ?

The level in lakes is good enough for Udaipur's water supply for next three months but the way summer is taking effect, people are doubtful whether the availability of potable water will last till it starts to rain in monsoon. Officials claim that enough water is available in the city and department will be able to cater to the needs of city for next three months without any problem. If the statistics of three months is believed, the summer can be tackled easily which remains the main concern for the citizens. The total supply to the city is 82 MLD. Maximum supply of water comes from the highly ambitious project Maansi Waakal which gives about 25 MLD of water to Udaipur's citizens. Mansi Wakal is followed by Asia's second largest artificial Lake Jaisamand which provides 20 MLD of water. Pichhola, the Lake in the city's periph-



ery provides as much as 18 MLD of water while over 13 MLD comes from Fateh Sagar. The Badi Lake also contributes with 1 MLD and remaining water comes from other sources. Department is counting on these sources and their water levels to serve people of Udaipur. People also when see these

Lakes full feel relaxed and assured. Albeit, there is enough water to be distributed, the lowered pressured or irregular supply is leaving people of some areas under threat. Administration on the other hand is all geared up to combat any issues. Department has marked out of order hand pumps and other villages wells and is on a

drive to fix them all. While government is active to provide good water availability, citizens will have to ensure that no water is wasted in any ways. Personal pools, fountains, car washing etc can be avoided. Also any leakage should be immediately reported to local pump house so that quick action can be taken.

Congress will fight for poor, always - Dr. Vyas

The hail fall and sudden rain that left farming and farmers devastated has been a hard affair for everyone. While government is claiming to be on the side of farmers, oppositions are looking to raise their concern for the poor farmers. But what a farmer feels at the moment and how much assured they are is the real matter of concern. Royal Harbinger got an opportunity to speak with the veteran politician Dr. Girija Vyas who looked completely dissatisfied with the Land Acquisition Bill of central government. "Most of the rules and laws that UPA had framed have been revised by NDA government only to benefit industrialists," she alleged. She said that our's has been a party of people and we

have always given top priority to welfare of farmers, poor, and minorities.

She opined that Congress led by Sonia Gandhi is working hard to unite the



entire opposition to pitch against the Land Acquisition bill. She alleged that government is trying to get this bill through by bringing small and useless amendments

but Congress is standing against such cheat. She also apprised RH that a huge rally is being organized in support of farmers in Delhi on 19th April which will be addressed by Sonia and Rahul Gandhi. Calling the government insensitive for farmers, she assured that she and her party will always fight against anything that affects poor and underprivileged.

City Buses Launched by HM Amount for four city buses from MLA quota

Udaipur: Home Minister Sri Gulabchand-Kataria, ensuring affordable and accessible transport system, has given eight city buses to the municipal corporation. On this occasion, as legislative head, he also announced to give four more city buses.

Home Minister, viewing Udaipur as a tourist attraction, stressed the overall effort and need for creating it more beautiful. He suggested to make Swarupsagar (Kala Kiwad) as attractive as Fatahsagar Overflow and that the lake be given four hundred meters of new area to develop the site like Chowpatty. Sri Kataria said that Sajjangarh Biological Park, in Udaipur, with a total cost of 26 crores is being added as a tourist destination. To fulfil the need of drinking water for animals, an amount of 70 lakhs will be taken from MLAs and MPs. A new entry at the City Station will also be provided for by MLAs and MPs.

Mayor Chandrasingh Kothari said that he is committed to the rapid development of municipal corporation city. The number of fire stations in the city has been increased from two to seven, LED lights all over the city, colourful lights in tourist destinations, drinking water supply from tanker to people of vulnerable settlements, continuing campaigns for posterless cities, the expeditious establishment of plant for solid waste disposal, an attractive food court at Sukhadia circle for glimpse of Rajasthani tradition and art and culture, the acceptance of 1 million for a second entry at the City Station, to remove illegal construction from the city, etc. are the key decisions that have been taken.

Deputy mayor LokeshDwivedi said that the first phase of city bus operation has been introduced on two routes. A total of 70.49 million have been spent on 24-seater buses.



Engineering Students' Contribution to Nation Building

Udaipur: Hindustan Zinc (Vedanta) CEO Mr Tom Albanis insisted engineering students of College of Technology and Engineering to contribute to nation building.
