Get your pet Tagged!

RH Team/ Pets to be Tagged. Yes, if you take care of a pet, you must have a registered tag for your pet. The tag will have owner's name and phone number. This step has been taken to put animals in order who unknowingly disrupt the traffic and at times also become a reason on accident which either leaves one injured or dead. Having announced this provision, administration will send the animals without a tag to kine house. Administration along with Urban Improvement Trust will start tagging stray animals soon while the pets will have to be tagged by their respective owners. Tagging is not only helpful in keeping animals in order but it will also help owners to find their pets in case if they are lost. There are many owners who milk their cows and buffalos and then leave them like stray animals so that they can have their food from other sources. Now, once this tagging is done, such owners will be identified easily and will be liable for action against them. A time frame of 15 days has been allotted by administration for owners to get the tagging done. In a case where a owner has good number of animals with them, they can request the veterinary hospital of Chetak Circle and staff members will visit the place of the owner to tag animals.

Rahul and Sonia accused PM of being anti-poor

The Congress on Sunday declared a full-scale war against the "anti-farmer" and "pro-industrialist" government over the land acquisition bill, with Rahul Gandhi accusing Prime Minister Narendra Modi of bringing an ordinance on it to pay back "loans" of industrialists.

The Congress vice-president, who just returned from a two-month absence from public life, said the new land bill is not only against the interests of farmers but also the tribals.

"I tell you how Modi ji won the election. He took loans of thousands of crores from big industrialists from which his marketing was done. How will he pay back that loan now? He



will do it by giving your land to those top industrialists. He wants to weak-

en the farmers, then snatch their land and give it to his industrialist friends,"

he said addressing a farmers' rally at the Ramlila Maidan.

"Through the Gujarat model, Modi ji showed that he can snatch the land of farmers quite easily and convinced the industrialists that he can do the same in the whole country. This is Modi's model -- weaken the foundation, then attach a ladder to the building, paint it and show to the world that the building is shining," Rahul said.

Congress chief Sonia Gandhi accused the Modi government of adding insult to the injury of farmers by bringing the land ordinance.

Promising to fight for the farmers' cause without making any compromises, she said: "Modi govern-

ment's attitude is totally against the farmers, the helpless and the poor. We have got a new energy here and we will fight for the poor and the weak.

"We will not allow those forces to succeed, who want to destroy the legacy of our freedom. We will fight without any fear against such forces. We might be out of power but we will not allow any leniency in our efforts in this direction," the Congress President said.

Former prime minister Manmohan Singh said the new government had brought the land bill to hurt the interests of the farmers as he alleged that Modi had "sold dreams" to farmers and youth to win Lok Sabha polls.

Vegetables on the Roof of

After farming on empty lands of schools, district administration is now set to grow vegetables on collectorate premises. Udaipur collectorate would be state's first place where cultivation of vegetables will be initiated on its terrace and garden.

For the success of this experimentation, District Collector Ashutosh A T Pednekar has called for plants from Pune and potted grow-bags from Bengaluru. These grow-bags have coconut sawdust and neem cakes in which bottle gourd, coriander, spinach, tomatoes, eggplant, okra, peppers, cucumber and bitter gourd will be grown. Four plants in 200 of the bigger grow-bags and 1 in 100 of the



smaller grow grow-bags are being planted. The administration will promote this endeavour of cultivation in homes of general public. These vegetables will come in use of patients.

The administration has decided for now that these vegetables grown at the collec-

torate will be provide free of cost to patients at M B Hospital. It is believed that the cultivation of vegetables will start in a month. The cultivation of vegetables has been started in the open porch near the meeting hall on the roof of collectorate.

Seeds and saplings have been planted in the grow-bags. Boards have been installed in front of each plant. Vinet have been laid on the roof so that the temperature in summers would not affect the plants.

If roofs and empty porches will be used for cultivation, awareness of good health among the public will increase and they'll get quality products to eat - Ashutosh A T Pednekar, District Collector, Udaipur

Allocate adequate funds for maintenance of National

Rajasthan Chief Minister Smt. Vasundhara Raje has suggested for allocation of adequate funds for maintenance of the national highways (NH) passing through the state.

Smt. Raje met the Union Minister for Road Transport & National Highways Shri Nitin Gadkari in this regard on Friday. She underlined that condition of the NH roads was not good and it was causing inconvenience in smooth passage of vehicular traffic on these roads. She informed that during year 2014-15 against the demand of Rs. 75 crore, only Rs. 14.87 crore were actually given for maintenance. Therefore, she asked for allocation of more funds under this head during the year 2015-16.

The CM raised the issue of those roads which were not being maintained by the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) and the state government was providing funds for maintenance from its own resources. She demanded for reimbursement of the expenditure incurred to the state under this head.

Smt. Raje said that the Uniara-Nainwa-Gulabpura-Shahpura (NH 148D), Ooncha-Nangla-Dhaulpur (NH 132), Manoharpur-Dausa-Lalsot (NH 11A and Extension) etc. are among the sections on which the state government carried out maintenance works from its resources. The CM further requested the Union Minister for early approval of a four-lane road construction project worth Rs. 621.43 crore at Kota-Darra section. She also thanked the union government for approval of new works worth Rs. 1558.07 crore for the national highways in Rajasthan during the year 2014-15.
