## The Paulians Provided Roof over the Heads of the Orphans

The 10th class students of St. Paul's Udaipur under the Annual Social Service Camp, did Shramdaan in the construction of two pakka houses for the orphan children. The social service camp was held in Ogna, a small town about 72 km. away from Udaipur city. In their seven days camp from 9th April to 15th April the students consisting of 46 girls and 134 boys with 14 escort teachers put up at Asunta Bhawan Primary School, Ogna.

On the concluding day the Principal Father George V.J. inaugurated the houses built by these students. Dinesh and Prakash two orphan brothers from Ambri Village who lost their parents due to illness seven years ago were struggling for the basic needs of life. With the help of the local Sarpanch, Mr. Kaluram father George was able to locate these needy brothers. He found that the boys were in school but had no roof over their heads. He promised to build a house for them and the students did shramdaan in the same. While receiving the keys of the newly constructed house Dinesh the elder brother who has appeared in 10th board exam this year had no words



to utter in gratitude. He told the campers, "God will bless you for your generosity."

On the other side Lalita, Durga and Dinesh of Bhanwariya village didn't even know who these campers were and what they were doing near their hut. These three siblings of 9, 7 and 6 years respectively have lost their mother at a tender age and the father missing having lost his mental equilibrium. They are sheltered by their grandmother in a hut. Seeing a pakka house being constructed for them was a dream they had never thought of dreaming. Handing over the keys to these orphans father George pleaded the local sarpanch Mr. Ramlal to ensure their

education.

Speaking to the students the principal stated that thinking about self is good but thinking about the needy of the society and doing something for them is a noble task. He congratulated the campers for their noble deed and added that these type of gestures should also be carried out later when they become well to do in life.

The camp incharge Mr. Bernard Bhuriya stated that the students also took active part in the Swatch Bharat

Abhiyan by cleaning the surrounding area and the approach road at the camp site in Ogna. Together with 'hands on' work experience the campers put up various cultural programmes on the theme of the Academic Session 2015-16 i.e. "SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY" to bring about awareness among the local people thereby enabling them to ponder on the social dogmas that hinder their development and to break certain taboos that obstruct their vision in life.

St. Paul's Sr. Secondary School, Udaipur has been organizing Social Service Camps from its very inception. The purpose of these camps has been : Reaching out to the less privileged mass of the society; exposing the city children to the ground realities of the village folk and providing an opportunity to the students to interact and understand the lifestyle of the tribals thereby bringing awareness through various cultural programmes.

These camps provide a platform to the sophisticated city children to ponder on the hardships the villagers face and at the same time be grateful to the Almighty for the pleasures of life they enjoy. 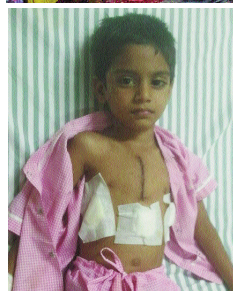
## Vessels for Birds Distributed in Baisakh

NSS has also settled many couples and have helped umpteen people in one or other ways. Kailash Manav who is a renowned personality had started a simple NGO years back and because his intentions were pure and he was committed to service, this NGO now has become a famous has become one point where people can look for help anytime. Prashant Agarwal who runs this NGO is following the path shown by his father religiously and as soon as he and his team receives information about plight of any human being, they rush to help and instill the light and happiness back into their lives.

Swati, a 22 years old married girl was diagnosed with a hole in her heart. She was abandoned by her husband and her father Lallan Prasad Yadav lost all hopes. Lallan's monthly income was merely 4000 that time and it was nearly impossible for him to get her daughter treated. When Prashant learned about this plight of Lallan, he arranged to send Swati to Narayan super Specialty hospital of Bangalore where she was operated and happiness returned to the life and fami-



ly of Swati. Similarly Sansthan also helped a family of Raktonia of Mujaffarpur. Rankumar who was a fit and fine boy three years back got his face

and then body in bad shape following diarrhea and fever. Then his parents approached NSS and now Rankumar is being treated in Fateh Ashram by physiotherapists. He is improving swiftly and hopefully will be alright soon.

A story which is close to Prashant's heart is—Divyansh, a four years old child of Baali of Paali district of Rajasthan had a hole in his heart since birth.

Narayan Sewa Sansthan got his treatment done free of cost. His father Mansingh runs a small tea shop and earns only 5000-

6000 and this amount was never sufficed to even run a family of six, let alone getting the operation done. With operation, NSS also covered all other expenses of the family like staying, food, transport etc. Today, the kid is hale and hearty. Besides sponsoring operations fully, NSS also provides relief to other under privileged sections and affected people liberally. Every month the organization provides free of cost ration to 577 women of widowed, old, and BPL families. "Each ration kit contains flour, pulses, rice, sugar, oil, spices, tea leaves, salt, and other grocery items required in a kitchen," reveals Vandana Agrawal who is the director of NSS. She also said that organization also distributes stationery, food, uniform etc to the schools where under privileged students study. There are many more charitable things that Narayan Sewa Sansthan does for the welfare of underprivileged section of society.

## IIMU will have a glimpse of old Udaipur

RH Team/ The under-construction IIMU (Indian Institute of Management Udaipur) building will carry the heritage look of historic Udaipur. The design of this new premises of India's one of the youngest IIMs would portray a look and feel of olden days' Udaipur. As there is the city palace at the bank of Pichhola, similar Lake would be constructed and the academic block would be constructed at the bank of this small Lake. The place of Jagdish Mandir will be given to a library in the premises. This magnificent and kind of unique style is being designed by architect Rajiv Kathpalia who was speaking in a dialogue in the Mohan Lal Sukhadia University premises of IIM. This idea indeed connects the premier institute with the city. And Udaipur will be first of its kind because according to Rajiv, no IIT or IIM has any cultural connection in terms of look and feel with their respective cities. Collector Ashutosh Pednekar on the occasion advised that some good spots should be planned in this initial stage of construction so that this premises can attract people from world over. Spread across 300 acres amid the lush green-

ery of Baleecha, the hilly area is dry and does not grow much greenery. the difference between the plane and hill is up to 100 meters.

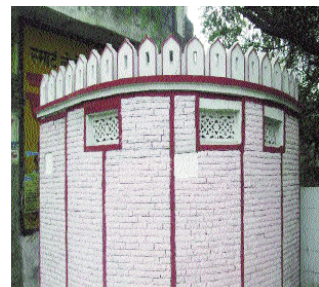
Although the circumstances are difficult but the planning is being done to find catchment areas where water could be stored. The slope on the hill is from 20 to 90 percent. Rajiv said that the old city of Udaipur is also developed in similar geographical conditions and this is why giving this IIM the heritage look of older Udaipur would be easier. The library would be situated between two academic blocks and will look like a bridge. Library also will break its ages old quite-reputation and there will be open space for discussion in it. In order to maintain the environmental serenity and cleanliness, the cycles would be promoted inside the premises while shuttle services will be available for senior people at every 100 meter distance. Hostels and quarters will be East-Facing which is good for viewing sunrise and also aligned with the Vaastu. The first phase will see work on 130 acres of land for the capacity of 600 students. This area will have five Lakes.
