I had been to America last month & stayed there for one and half month. I visited few States of America including desert of California. I stayed most of the time in Houston city. There were heavy rains in Houston during my stay there & a few sunny days.

What should we do- If we follow their pattern of roof top rain water harvesting we can never have any shortage of water as we are facing today. Every house should rain water harvesting so that the purest form of rain water do not go to drains and flood the streets.

Every local self government body may be Nagar Nigam, Nagar Palika ,Nagar vikas Prayans , Panchyat should see that the people get the roof top rain water system installed.

They should not stop at only deducting the amount and leave it to the owner whether he gets this roof top rain water system installed or not. They should motivate the public through mass media in these months before monsoon so that coming RAIN do not go to the DRAINS as it is going every year.

They should be facilitated for this as by saving this precious rain water and putting into the Tube well/Well/hand pumps they are serving the society as they are recharging the ground water up to one kilometer radius and improving both the quality and quantity of the underground water.
