Synthetic cloth godown gutted in fire

BHILWARA: A fire broke out at a synthetic cloth godown in RIICO industrial area fourth phase on Wednesday morning. However, nobody was hurt.

An inverter battery exploded at Murli Manohar Synthetics at 3.30am, which caused the fire in which synthetic cloth worth more than 3 crore was destroyed, said Ruchir Bansal, the godown's owner.

Six fire tenders reached the warehouse. Later, the district administration called 17 more from the Hindustan Zinc Ltd, Jindal SAW Ltd and nearby Chittorgarh district to douse the fire. "There was more than 2.5 lakh metres of

synthetic cloth in the godown worth more than R3 crore, which was fully packed and ready to transport for buyers, but it got damaged in fire," Bansal said.

According to Pratap Nagar police station, a labourer from a nearby factory informed the police as well as the fire station about the fire.

Additional collector Suresh Yadav, sub-divisional officer Avichal Chaturvedi and assistant superintendent of police Anand Sharma reached the factory about an hour after the fire broke out. "The flames are still to be fully doused at the godown," said Sanjay Mathur, acting municipal commissioner.

Efforts to save GIB will be made upto international level : Chief Minister

Jaipur:

Chief Minister Smt. Vasundhara Raje has said that her government was serious about saving the state bird Great Indian Bustard (GIB) from extinction and no stone would be left unturned for this. For this, all efforts would be made locally as well as national and international level. She was chairing a meeting of the State Board for Wildlife at her CMO on Friday.



Smt. Raje said that she would write a letter to the Union Minister for Forest and Environment Shri Prakash Javdekar seeking support and resources for conservation of the GIB. Support of international experts,

financial institutions and funding agencies would also be invited for this so that the existence of this heaviest flying bird. Presently, only a 100 population of this is alive around the world, about three-fourth of this is found in the state.

In the meeting, a presentation was given on the present status of the Desert National Park (DNP) for conservation and saving the GIB. On this, the CM asked the officials of Forest, Revenue and other concerned departments and the members of the Wildlife Board to team-up and visit in order to review the situation and propose an action plan.

While talking on the Tiger Safari Project in Ranthambore National Park, the CM said that objective of this scheme was to reduce pressure of

tourism activities on the core area of the Park. She directed the officials to prepare a detailed report for this project. Implementation of Van Dhan scheme proposed to provide sustainable and green livelihood opportunities to the people residing nearby the protected or conserved forest regions and development of green cities were also discussed in the meeting.

Smt. Raje suggested for setting-up wildlife clubs in schools, flowing in CSR funds from the private corporate for creating awareness among the masses on conservation of forests and wildlife and ensuring the local communities' partnership in different projects and schemes.

The Board gave approval for Jaipur Mega Tourism City, entry of

vehicular traffic upto Forest Lodge in Keoladeo National Park Bharatpur, problem of catfish in lakes in Bharatpur and other districts and study the efforts made to protect crops from damage by Blue Bulls in Gujarat.

State Forest and Environment Minister Shri Rajkumar Rinwa, MLAs Smt. Diya Kumar and Shri Man Singh, Chief Secretary Shri C.S. Rajan, Additional Chief Secretary Shri O.P. Meena, Principal Secretaries Shri Prem Singh Mehra and Shri Ashok Singhvi, Additional Director General of Police (Crime), PCCF CWLW Shri S.N. Singh, PCCF HoFF Smt. Savita Anand, other senior officers of Forest department, experts members of the State Board for Wildlife and officials of different departments were also present in the meeting.



MoU signed for Barmer and Balotra ITI

Barmer: The Directorate of Technical Education (DTE), government of Rajasthan and Cairn India Limited on Thursday signed a Memorandum of Understanding to upgrade government ITI at Barmer and Balotra. Man cheated for 4.98 lakhs

duo of accused has cheated a 72 old year man by falsely withdrawing an amount of 4.98 Lakhs through cheque. The accused has raised the cheque from the victim by pretending to be the representatives of a daily Newspaper of Udaipur.

On 4th May the accused has visited the victim Maan Singh Pangadia's shop situated at Loha Bazar of Hathipol Police Station circle and introduced themselves as the representatives of a well known daily newspaper of the city, they also talked about a scheme of the newspaper according to which against an amount of ₹399 one will get the annual subscription of the newspaper, said Victim Maan Singh.

After filling the subscription form the accused asked the victim to give a cheque of ₹399 instead of cash. The duo filled the amount and the name of the newspaper by

themselves in the cheque by their pen and took the signatures of the victim on the cheque, the soft spoken accused before leaving the shop reminded the victim that before presenting the cheque in the bank they will call him.

On Wednesday at around 1 pm the victim Pangadia has received a text message on his mobile phone informing him about a withdrawal of ₹4.98 lakhs from his Bank account from Punjab National Bank, after thoroughly reading the message he immediately rushed to the bank for its verification where he discovered that the amount was withdrawn from the same bank cheque which was given by him to the duo of accused, said the victim. Moreover when he reached at the office of the newspaper their he found that the newspaper staff does not have any information about any of the scheme nor they

are having any new staff members, Pangadia added.

Later the 72 year old victim rushed to the police station with his relatives and lodged a complaint against the accused.

Pangadia also found that the accused also visited around 20 other shops of the Loha Bazar area and has collected the cheques of ₹399 on the name of new scheme of the newspaper but it was their bad luck that all the shopkeepers has filled the cheques with their own pens.

Victim is also having a doubt that the accuse might have used a Magic Pen or any chemical for making changes in the amount of the amount.

The case has been registered and investigation of the matter has been initiated by the Hathipol police, the investigation is going on the basis of the CCTV footages of the cameras installed at the bank premises.

Wheat scam exposed at CWC godown

Udaipur : In a scam exposed at the godown of the Central Warehousing Corporation (CWC) at Madri area in Udaipur., Two persons including the manager and a clerk have been found guilty of malpractice by causing damage to the grains used in government supplies.

The accused men were found to have manipulated wheat bags kept in one of the stacks by dampening them so as to artificially cause weight gain. This had led to dete-

rioration of the grain quality that one of the client Kray-Vikray Sahkari Samiti from Bhinder block had rejected the supply. FIR against Vijaypal Singh the manager and Vishwanath Meena, the LDC have been lodged at the pratap nagar police station here

The two men wetted wheat stock kept in jute bags in the stack 16 while other stock kept in stack number 4 was found to be dry and kept in plastic bags" said Chandra Purohit, the SHO.

IT Commissioner Sent to 14 Days J C

AJMER: Income tax commissioner Pawan Sharma was produced before a local court on Wednesday in the embezzlement case and then sent to 14 days of judicial custody. Sharma was nabbed by the Central Bureau of Investigation in the first week of April for allegedly demanding 23 lakh bribe from a

businessman to reduce his tax liability. Police had searched the I-T commissioners' house and farmhouse in Ajmer from where they recovered 38 liquor bottles. The excise department then farmed case against Sharma for keeping liquor more than four bottles, as prescribed by law.
