Jaipur: Veteran Congress leader and former chairman of the state commission for disabled persons (Nishakt Jan ayog) Damodar T hanvi died on Saturday after falling down on a railway platform from a moving train at Jaipur junction here. Thanvi, 78, was taken to a hospital where he died during medical check-up, railway police said. "Thanvi came here from Phalodi (Jodhpur) in a train this morning. He was sleeping when the train arrived here at 5 am and he woke up when the train was about to leave the station," Hajari Lal. ASI-GRP said. He hurriedly tried to get off the train, which had started moving by then, but fell on the platform and sustained some internal injury. He, initially, went to home with his grandson but when he felt after felling uneasy, he went to SMS hospital for check up where he died, he said. The body was handed over to his family members after postmortem, the ASI said, adding, exact cause of the death would be clear in the autopsy report. PCC President Sachin Pilot condoled the death of Thanvi, a PCC member who served the party on different positions.

Kuldeep's hard work paid off, says father

Udaipur: The family of Kuldeep Singh Naruka was in a celebratory mood after coming to know that he was declared a joint topper in the Class 12 science results announced by the state Board of Secondary Education on Friday. Kuldeep scored 98% in the examinations. "We never had to tell Kuldeep to study, as he always followed his schedule of giving 4 hours to his studies in a day. We never expected he would top," said Mahaveer Singh, Kuldeep's father, as the topper was in Jaipur to appear for an entrance exam for BITS Pilani. Kuldeep, his only son, completed schooling from Shishu Bharti School of the city. "Kuldeep has always been an above average student and topped his class from class Nursery to 12." said the proud father, who works as a manager in a private firm. He said when he called his son to tell him the result, Kuldeep was surprised and thrilled. "He had not expected to top. But his hard work paid off," said Singh.

Medical student commit suicide by jumping in front of train

Udaipur: A 20 year old medical student, studying in a private medical college, allegedly committed suicide by jumping before a running train at Debari tunnel here on Thursdaynight. Police found his mutilated body parts on Friday morning after getting a call from one of the passerby. The circumstances of death is not immediately known, but investigators believe the boy's death to be an intentional act as a suicide note was found in his pocket which indicated love failure to be the reason of depression which led him to take such a step. "Dilip Patidar, was a first year student here who hailed from Dungerpur. His father runs a tea stall in Mumbai " informed Chandra Purohit, circle inspector of Prataphagar police station. The incident took place on Thursday late night as the victim jumped before the Udaipur-Ratlam express. The body was dragged to some 200 meters and torn to pieces.

Udaipur: Despite limited flights, Udaipur is in the most serious state in the whole country in case of birds getting hit by aircraft (bird hitting). Whereas, the lowest bird hitting is at Mumbai airport, where aircraft fly like birds from moment to moment.

The situation came to fore in figures released recently in the year 2014 byDirector General of Civil Aviation. At Maharana Pratap Airport, situated at Dabok, 24.3 birds were hit per 10 thousand flight, which is the highest in the country. In Mumbai, the figure was 3.1. Birds, dogs, etc. animals hitting 25 million loss of aircraft. The data that was unfolded states that 38 percent of the birdhitting accidents happen when the flight lands and 22 percent when it takes off.

According to bird exxpert Reza Tahseen, airport in Udaipur have plenty of crows. A 1-kilo bird flying at a speed of hundred kilometres, then the collision would hit 5 tons. However birds often collide with feathers, the fans get damaged but it does not harm the aircraft. To avoid this kind of hitting, crackers must be burst before flying and artificial eagles must be flown using a remote.

Recently Director of Civil Aviation (Air Safety) Manish Kumar, in a conference in Mumbai, had discussed measures to prevent bird hitting. It was reported that the nonavailability of National Bird Map for aviation is the reason the pilots does not what kind of birds are teeming at which airport. With this map, bird hitting can be avoided to a great extent.

Mob barge into legislators office in Nimbahera, destroy property

Udaipur: A large group of people mostly from the Mali community barged into legislator Srichand Kriplani's office at Nimbahera in Chittorgarh district on Friday noon and harmed the property. The people were reportedly angry as one of their community men had died of electrocution in the morning and the legislator didn't turn up in the hospital when he was called. After a written complaint from the party workers, police has arrested 7 men under various sections of the IPC.

According to police, a 26 year old man Nanalal Mali who worked in some factory in Nimbahera, was admitted in the general hospital after he suffered burn injuries of electrocution. He died in the morning lacking medical care as most of the doctors and staff were not present on duty time. This irked his family members and relatives who immediately called up MLA Kriplani to complain about the medical negligence in the government hospital. The family members cried that even the legislator turned a deaf ear instead of being sympathy which instigated the community men. Afterwards, some 20 to 25 men barged into the leader's office in the afternoon, threw stones and dismantled the office property and papers. Kriplani was not in the office, only few workers were present who immediately called the police, "It was a mixed bag of people not from specific community that trespassed and damaged property. No one was hurt, we have arrested 7 people while others too will be caught soon" said Boraj Singh, Circle Inspector of Nimbahera Kotwali police station. However, the legislator refuted charges of negligence and claimed otherwise. "It was me who called up the hospital authorities to ensure the victim's family is extended all facilities. I even arranged for the postmortem. People who laid attack on my office are not from any specific community but anti social elements who were pitched by someone to settle political rivalry" legislator Kriplani said
