Heat stroke cases: Govt alerts all Hospitals

Jaipur: As Rajasthan continued to reel under intense heat wave on Friday, health minister Rajendra Rathore directed all hospitals in the state to make arrangements to handle the patients of

The minister also asked the health department to be vigilant towards the problem arising out of warm and dry afternoon winds called loo.

He, at the same time, urged the public to exercise caution while stepping out, and to take medical help if they notice symptoms of heatstroke.

Noting that spreading awareness was crucial for protection against heatstroke, Rathore directed all hospitals and nursing homes to provide proper information to the public and ensure emergency services to heatstroke vic-

Children, elderly people, pregnant women, day shift labourers, travellers and sportspersons were more prone to falling ill during this period, he said.

He also directed hospitals and medical institutions to provide coolers, fans, cool water to patients and to ensure that oral rehydration solution (ORS) and all necessary medicines were available in their emergency kits.

Meanwhile, director of public health, Dr BR Meena, said that common symptoms of loo and heatstroke are headache, heaviness in the head, fatique, nausea, dizziness, excessive body temperature (105 F or more), redness of face, skin dryness and excessive thirst. He advised people to stay in shade from 10 am to 6 pm.

"If it's necessary to travel or work in the open, one should consume fresh and light food and drink good amount of cool water before stepping out. It is also important to use umbrella and cover the head with cloth." Dr Meena said.

He added that victims of heat stroke and loo should immediately lie down under shade and their skin should be daubed with wet cloth after loosening clothes

He/ she should be then be given cool water and brought to the nearest hospital for treatment. Temperatures in the state hovered between 41 and 44.6 degrees Celsius on Friday. According to MeT office, Kota remained the hottest place with a maximum of 44.6 degrees, followed by the state capital at 43.9 degrees Celsius

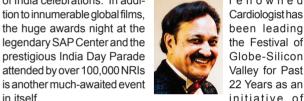

Syllabus to be changed from classes 1 to 5, says minister

Aimer: Minister of state for education Vasudev Devnani on Tuesday announced a complete change in courses for classes 1 to 5 from the upcoming session.

"With a view to prepare good future citizens who are aware of Indian culture and ethos, and are armed with a rational attitude, there will be an overall change in courses of classes 1 to 5 from the coming session," said Devnani. "We have pre pared new courses in such a way that Indian heroes and writers find more space in the syllabus." Devnani added.

New books for classes up to the third grade have already been prepared and work on books for classes 4 and 5 is in progress, the minister said. In addition, to bring about a 'qualitative change' in education, the government has decided to re-introduce board exams for class 8 in all government-run schools. Grading systems will be adopted to evaluate students, said Devnani, adding that action would be initiated against teachers where 50% or more students obtain grade D or lower. Devnani also said that establishment of separate toilets for boys and girls in 70.000 schools in the state would be completed by June 30, in time for the next session. Meanwhile, to ensure punctuality and re gularity of attendance of school teachers, the government is also considering introducing bio- metric atten-

very strong connection between hygienic menstrual practices and overall health. In India, despite the economic progress that has been made in the last several years, over 80% of women still do not have access to adequate sanitary protection during menstruation. In India, feminine hygiene and menstruation, being a sensitive topic, is not discussed openly, and women often continue to harbor myths and misconceptions about it, since no one amongst their familv and friends is able to educate them. Additionally, mothers are often not in a position to guide their daughters correctly, since their own knowledge is limited. Over time, unhygienic practices due to low awareness and education levels can adversely impact the health and productivity of these women. According to the report, awareness on basic health and feminine hygiene in India is very low, with 75% rural women lacking adequate knowledge on menstrual hygiene and care.

"We strongly believe that education dispels fear and prepares young girls to recognize men-
