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Prestigious Award 'Dhaturatna' to Mr. Anil Agarwal



Udaipur: Mr. Anil Agarwal, Founder & Chairman, Vedanta Resources Plc, has been conferred the title of 'Dhaturatna', the highest award by the Bombay Metals Exchange (BME), to acknowledge his tremendous contribution to the non-ferrous metals sector. The award was presented by Cabinet Minister of Road Transport, Highways & Shipping, Mr. Nitin Gadkari and the Honorable Chief Minister of Maharashtra, Mr. Devendra Fadnis, who commended Mr. Agarwal for his work towards nation building, at a glittering ceremony held recently in Mumbai.

Now fly Udaipur to Jaipur

Since April 2013, Udaipur had no flight to Jaipur which was a blockage for the rising city of Rajasthan. Kingfisher airlines had called off its Udaipur Jaipur flight in April 2013 and since then no other airway was there between two highly popular cities of Rajasthan. But Spicejet Airlines has got the required clearances and approvals from government and regular flight will operate between two cities from July 15. Actually the flight between Delhi and Udaipur will now fly via Jaipur thus it will connect three major cities. Many tourists and businessmen among others would feel easier as earlier they would defer Udaipur visit after visiting Jaipur. Train and Bus journey though is comfortable between Jaipur and Udaipur but still many tourists who come on shorter timeline had no choice but to skip Udaipur. Now, Udaipur will have good connectivity and this will be much beneficial for economy and tourism. Spice jet will operate a medium-sized Q-400 aircraft and 75 passengers will be able to travel.

Biological park celebrates record visitors

Udaipur : Two months of inauguration, State's first Sajjanganrh Biological Park has already become a much sought after destination in the tourist city. The park has received a record of more than 46 thousand visitors in a month generating a revenue of 14 lakh rupees to the forest department. The main reason for the high amounts of visitors is believed to be due to the many animals that are now in the park. There are more than 60 animals of 21 species including tigers, panthers, lions, Ostriches, Alligators, Rhesus monkeys etc which are enthralling the visitors with their natural charm. Meanwhile, T-24 the majestic cat which was shifted here from Ranthambore sanctuary is getting acclimated to the new environment here.

" T24 is perfectly alright and nicely adapting in his new home and keepers. Water holes and mud clad area has been created to keep him cool in the peak heat hours while tin shades have been installed on the fenced walls to avoid his confrontation with a female tigress in the adjoining enclosure" Rahul Bhatnagar, the chief conservator of forest (wild life) informed.



The 1st ever International Yoga Day is being celebrated today. Prime Minister Narendra Modi led the nation in celebrating the 1st International Yoga Day by practicing yoga at Rajpath in New Delhi. Over 35 thousand people including Cabinet ministers, diplomats, foreign delegates, government officials, NCC cadets and students performed Yoga at Rajpath.

In Udaipur as many as 5 prominent places the excercises of youga were performed at Nagar Nigam premises students and other officials took part in youga DM Udaipur was seen during youga .

President Pranab Mukherjee also participated in an event at Rashtrapati Bhawan in New Delhi. Speaking on the occasion, the President said yoga can prevent and cure the physical disorders which arise from the modern lifestyle. The president said that these aspects of the discipline will lead to the well-being of humanity.

Several Union Ministers, MPs and legislators also took part in various camps in different parts of the state.

In the United States, External Affairs Minister Sushma Swaraj will preside over the International Yoga Day celebrations in the United Nations today. Swaraj will be joined by UN Secretary General Ban Ki-Moon, President of the

General Assembly Sam Kutesa, Congresswoman Tulsi Gabbard, spiritual leader Sri Sri Ravi Shankar and several other diplomats at the commemoration at UN headquarters.

Swaraj, along with the UN Chief and the UNGA President, would then head to Times Square where an estimated 30,000 people would participate in the event.

At Times Square In USA, thousands of people will gather to perform Yoga. The International Yoga Day coincides with the day of summer solstice too.

In UK, several Yoga events have been planned including at House of Lords in London, and across Edinburgh, Glasgow, Coventry, Leicester, Manchester and Birmingham. The Indian High Commission has issued a calendar of all events in the UK.

In Canada and in Russia,

overwhelming response has been recieved for participation in various events planned for the day.

The Asian countries too are showcasing palpable enthusiasm for the day.

India's neighbour Sri Lanka has made elaborate plans at Galle Face Green on the 21st morning which includes release of a special e-book on Yoga, telecast of PM Modi's message on yoga and Various Yoga demonstarations. The Consulates general of India in Jaffna, and Hambantota, and Assistant High Comission of India in kandy have planned events too.

Bangladesh has also planned events to commemorate the day. On Saturday a seminar had been organised at Banga Bandhu national stadium in association with Bangladesh yoga Association and Bangladesh martial Art

Confederation.

Myanmar too has outlined a number of events for the day. About 550 yoga practitioners are expected to participate in an event in Yangon. A similar event will also be held at Mandalay Thiri Football Stadium. At Thuvana National Stadium the audience will enjoy a show with 600 performers showcasing yoga in 3 parts. Beginner yoga, intermediate Yoga and Advanced Yoga.

In Nepal, Apart from yoga sessions, Yogh Sandesh, a souvenir on Yoga that incorporates article son Yoga will be released to mark the day. Events have been planned in Birgunj, Biratnagar, Lumbini apart from other places.

In Afghanistan an event has been organised in the Consulate in Heart while The Indian High Commission in Islamabad has also planned events to celebrate the

International yoga day.

Asian Super power Japan looks to take advantage of the benefits of Yog. A Tokyo Yogathon 2015 will be organised.

In Spain, celebrations will take place in multiple places in Madrid, Puerto de la Cruz (Tenerife, Canary Islands), Valladolid (Castile and León), and Barcelona; in South Africa, yoga enthusiasts can join demonstrations in Pretoria, Cape Town and Johannesburg. Australia, too, has welcomed the move with the High Commissioner in India, Patrick Suckling, saying the celebration is an affirmation of the universal acceptance of yoga as a practice for mental and physical well-being.

As many as 192 countries will usher June 21, International Yoga Day, with some deep breathing and coordinated movements.

New Courses in Rajasthan Vidyapeeth : Prof. Sarangdevot

Udaipur: Vice Chancellor of Janardanrai Nagar Rajasthan Vidyapeeth University Prof S.S. Sarangdevot said that the new session will have famous treatise 'Shankaracharya' written by university's founder Pt. Janardanrai Nagar and each chapter from Ram Rajya and the students will get the opportunity to study them under Choice Based Credit System.

For foreign students who believe in Indian civilization and culture, certificate courses for 1 week, 2 weeks, 3 weeks, or a month to 3 months in Rajasthan archaeology and Yoga will be introduced from the new session. 3-year Hotel Management and catering as well master's degree in astronomy and a three-month palmistry course and 4-year BSc Agriculture course will be started. Apart from this, PhD in Physiotherapy will also be started in Vidyapeeth. According to the rules of UGC DLIT course for students will be introduced. Under the rules of UGC, the Choice Based Credit System



is being introduced at the PG level. The students will be able to choose two of his favorite subjects for the study.

DMLT & DMRT from this sessions:

After getting permission from the state government and Rajasthan Paramedical Council, Jaipur, from this session of Physiotherapy Medical College in Dabok will start a 2-year course of DMLT and DMRT.

Vocational Certificate Course:

In Jan Shikshan centres of rural areas, mobile repairing, home applications repairing, 1-month certificate course in web designing, e-accounting and other vocational certificate course will be started.

Law College from this session

Under the Career Basis Scheme, to start 3-year LLB and BALLB Integrated course at the University, Law College will be started from this session.

Skill Development Programs:

In community centres of Vidyapeeth, skill development courses like Tie & Dye, Batik Art, stenshil print, block printing, screen printing, jewelry making, soft toys, 3-D learning technology course will be taught to rural people and they will be given certificates so that they'll be able to start their own businesses.

Science courses and PhD:

Graduate level courses in Chemistry and other subjects of Science will be started at graduated level and a PhD course in Chemistry has been approved.

945 people benefited by Pacific

Devendra Dam to displace Four Hundred families, No provision for rehabilitation

Malwa, Parsad. A dam proposed to be constructed in village Malwa, near Parsad situated about forty kilometers away from divisional headquarter Udaipur by the side of National Highway Number 8 will displace and render homeless about four hundred families. These are poor and marginal peasants who have lived there forever and have small holdings which are the only source of survival for these peasants. The Sub Divisional Officer Sarada has been appointed as the Land Acquisition Officer to acquire the land destined to fall under submergence once the dam is complete. The SDO has already issued awards to about 109 families under the provisions of Land Acquisition Act 2013 and served notices to the landowners. It is ironical that the Act is titled "The Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition Rehabilitation and Resettlement Act 2013". Neither fair compensation has been ensured nor has any rehabilitation plan been prepared, before issuing the award or beginning the work on site. The work has already been started and if the construction is not stopped, this monsoon will be the last in which the peasant would be able to sow

the crops. From next year, all land will be submerged in water.

If we see the data of the government of India itself, there is no hope for the people of Malwa since National Policy on Rehabilitation, Government of India says that out of the total displaced people since 1951, 75% are still awaiting rehabilitation. According to a study more than 21.6 million people have been displaced by development projects in the country.

The order issued by the SDO says that the compensation awards have been decided on the basis of DLC rates and the assessment of Water Resources department. But the fact is that the Gram Sabha has not passed any resolution in favour of the dam. The villagers are in shock and feel insecure. Narayan, a youth told that a villager Maanji son of Ratna aged 55 years could not bear the shock and stopped taking food when the notice was served on him. He was unable to bear the shock and died. An old woman Dhanu wife of late Shanker told that her husband is dead, one of his sons is also no more and she is left with her widowed daughter in law and two minor children. "Where shall I go with my family at this age?" she asks.
