

Govt. at Your Doorstep in Kota From August 24

Ordinance For Uniformity In Elections Of Cooperatives Approved

Jaipur : Chief Minister Smt. Vasundhara Raje chaired a meeting of the State Cabinet at the CMO on Tuesday. Draft of the Rajasthan Cooperative Societies (Amendment) Ordinance 2015, which aimed at uniformity in the elections of these societies, was approved in this meeting. Other decisions include, launch of Sarkar Aapke Dwar (Government at Your Doorstep) campaign in Kota Division from August 24 onwards and free distribution of sanitary napkins to about 20 lakh adolescent girls in the state.

The State Parliamentary Affairs Minister Shri Rajendra Rathore told the media-persons that the Cabinet decided to modify the Rajasthan Cooperative Societies Act, 2001 by amending its sections 27, 30 and 32 and inserting one section 30-C. These amendments would result into time-bound elections of about 33,000 cooperative societies in the state at one time, he said. Presently, the Minister said, in the situation of appointing an Administrator on expiry of term of office of the executive board of a society, there was a provision of opportunity for hearing. Now, necessary amendment would be made for appointment of Administrator on expiry of term of office. Also, if an executive board was expelled before it completed half its tenure, elections would



be held for the rest of the term only. On the event of the board demitting office after the half-time mark in terms of its tenure, next elections would be conducted by the State Cooperatives Electoral Authority with other societies, he added.

Shri Rathore said that the Cabinet decided to organize this year's state-level Independence Day Function at Kota and launch the Government at Your Doorstep campaign in Kota Division between August 24 and August 31. On August 24, members of the Council of Ministers led by the Chief Minister would gather at Kota and a meeting of the State Cabinet would be held on August 31. Status and action taken in regard to the memoranda, complaints and applications received during the campaign events in

Bharatpur, Bikaner and Udaipur divisions would be reviewed at the CM and the Ministers' level.

The Parliamentary Affairs Minister informed that the Cabinet also approved for free distribution of sanitary napkins to about 20 lakh girls in the age group 13-19 years studying in class 6 to 12 under Rajasthan Kishori Swasthaya Evam Swachhata Karyakram. This would include girls of the BPL families as well. For implementation of this programme, a group of the Ministers and Principal Secretaries of various departments including Medical and Health, Women and Child Development, Education, Social Justice and Empowerment and Rural Development and Panchayati Raj had been formed.

Shri Rathore said that during Nyay Aapke Dwar (Justice

At Your Doorstep) campaign, which started May 18 onwards over 4,000 Lok Adalats had been held disposing off over 9 lakh cases. He said that during this, about 6.5 cases of judicial and quasi-judicial nature were disposed, which include about three lakh cases of mutations, two lakh of amendment of records and 1.5 lakh other cases related to revenue disputes. During the campaign, about 2.5 lakh land record certificates were also issued. This campaign would continue till July 15, he added.

The Minister said that the Cabinet further approved the Rajasthan Excise Laboratory (State & Subordinate) Services Rules, 2014. This decision would create opportunities of promotions for the officers and employees in the laboratories of Excise Department.

While addressing newsmen, the state Public Works Department Minister Shri Yunus Khan said that the Cabinet proposed and passed a Vote of Thanks resolution for the Union Minister of Road Transport & Highways Shri Nitin Gadkari for his announcement to provide assistance worth 10,000 crore rupees to Rajasthan for rejuvenation of road network and extension of transport services. It was for the first time that such a huge assistance was proposed for development of infrastructure in the state, he said. The Union

Minister had assured the state that for this, allocations would be made within six months of sending the proposals, the Minister added.

Shri Khan said that on December 13, 2014 Shri Gadkari had laid foundations of nine road projects with construction costs amounting to 3,900 crore rupees. Works had started on all these projects. He added that on request of the CM Smt. Raje the Union Minister had agreed to raise the CRF and give 700 crore rupees to the state. He had assured that as soon as the State Government would send a revised CRF proposal to the Centre, it would be given approval.

The PWD Minister said that of the 10,000 crore rupees assistance, about 1,500 kilometers of roads in the border areas would be linked with National Highways by spending about 4,500 crores of rupees. Jaipur would be among 10 major cities in the country selected for the Intelligent Traffic System. Other works include, construction of Ring Road for Jodhpur by spending 500 crore rupees; development of three bus terminals of the state on PPP mode; conversion of Barr-Jodhpur road into a Four-lane; and inclusion of 72-kilometer stretch from Anupgarh to Suratgarh under the Bharatmala Yojna as suggested by the CM.

Gehlot steps up pressure on Raje, demands resignation

Ajmer : Former Rajasthan chief minister Ashok Gehlot on Tuesday stepped up pressure on his successor Vasundhara Raje, demanding her resignation over the controversial deal between her son and disgraced IPL czar Lalit Modi.

Gehlot's demand came in the midst of a raging controversy over Raje and foreign minister Sushma Swaraj's help to the former IPL commissioner get UK travel documents followed by reports that Dushyant Singh's company received '11.63 crore in investments from Modi in 2008.

Union transport minister Nitin Gadkari had met Raje on Monday and said that the BJP as well as the Centre are strongly behind her as the "accusations" against her have



"no substance".

Accusing Raje and her son of being involved in money laundering, Gehlot said that "the mother-son duo have been exposed to have looted the wealth of the people of Rajasthan".

"She should step down from her office immediately as

she has lost all the possible grounds that legitimise her stay as chief minister of the state," he added. Talking a dig at Prime Minister's earlier statement, "na khaunga aur na khane doonga" (Neither I will take nor would allow anyone to take bribe), Gehlot wondered why Narendra Modi was not taking action against people who have been exposed to have taken bribe.

When asked about a probe by the Enforcement Directorate against his son Vabhav, the former chief minister said, "I am happy that an inquiry has been initiated. Let it be over, Vasundhara and her coterie would be silenced once and for all for propagating false accusations against me and my family."

CM announces e-training for police

Jaipur : Chief Minister Smt. Vasundhara Raje announced that policemen would be given e-training to make them efficient in IT sector. She also announced that budget of Rs. 4-5 crores would be provided for it. Smt. Raje was addressing the convocation function after passing out parade of 368 Sub Inspectors at Rajasthan Police Academy (RPA) on Thursday. She called upon Sub Inspectors passing out from RPA to work in the interest of all communities and casts and make efforts to take Rajasthan ahead.

The Chief Minister said Rajasthan has turned into the state which is moving ahead rapidly. She said that the

upcoming Resurgent Rajasthan summit and the increasing investment flow in the state will augment the pace of development. She said we feel proud that our state has a force which is always ready on every front to handle any situation. She congratulated all new Sub Inspectors for completing the training successfully and wish them good luck. She also congratulated trainers.

Smt. Raje distributed awards to the best trainees and trainers. She also announced award of Rs. 15,000 for the overall best trainee.

Home Minister Shri Gulab Chand Kataria asked policemen to hear grievance of in equal manner as there is no

wealthy or poor, bigger or smaller for police. He said every achievement of policemen will be recorded in service book and it will form basis for their future prospect.

Trainee Sub Inspectors demonstrated physical exercises, gymnastics and other amazing feats. In the beginning Director General of Police Shri Manoj Bhatt welcomed the guests. Director, RPA Shri B. L. Soni proposed vote of thanks.

Chain snatching at Alkapuri area

Udaipur : By committing city's 3rd incidence of chain snatching in less than 10 days the accused has targeted another woman at Alkapuri area of Ambamata police station circle on Saturday morning while she was returning back to her house after leaving her son on his school bus. The mishap occurred on Saturday morning while the victim Mamla Sharma of Alkapuri was returning back to her house but while she reached few meters away from house an accused came from her back and snatched her gold chain, in the attempt of chain snatching one part of the chain got snatched by the accused while the other portion remained on the hands of the victim woman. Ambamata police informed that the victim woman has later informed the police and has lodged an FIR against her accused, she also informed the cops that the accused was wearing a black t-shirt and was a thin man. Later on the information of the victim police barricading has been lunched at Chetak Circle, Durga Nursery, Thokar Choraha and various other exits of the city. On 22nd June one Kalpana of Loha Bazar was targeted by the chain snatchers out of 2 chain snatchers one of the accused Sikander was arrested by the cops but his associate Akhtar are still absconding, police is still searching the absconding accused. Similarly another incidence of the chain snatching happened at Sarvrituvilas area where the victim woman was targeted by the accused while she was purchasing vegetables from the vegetable vendor, but accused were still absconding and their search is still going on.

26 gamblers arrested in police raid

Udaipur : In a massive raid held on Friday noon, at different locations under 5 police station areas of the city, 26 gamblers have been booked by the police under the gambling act. Surprisingly, the raid which was held under the leadership of Additional SP Dr. Rajesh Bharadwaj, didn't involve teams from any of the city police stations, but 5 special teams were constituted for the task having 55 members from rural police stations, police line, SP office and the Mewar Bhil Corp. Police has seized 36,500 rupees cash, 11 mobile handsets and 4 motorcycles along with diaries indicating lottery numbers, Bharadwaj said. "No one would be spared even for the smallest of crime. 5 beat incharges have been suspended for it had been their responsibility to prevent illegal activities in their respective areas" said Rajendra Prasad Goyal, Udaipur SP. The concerning SHO's would also be served show cause notices seeking explanation on what they have been doing to control petty crimes, Goyal said. Goyal has recently taken over as the new SP of the city who said that curbing crime even of the lowest level would be his priority to maintain law and order in the district.

Police constable died in road mishap

Udaipur : A police constable that was posted at Kaliashpuri post of Sukher police died in a road accident after getting hit by a truck container on Saturday while returning back to the post from Delwada village. The mishap occurred on Saturday evening while the constable Bheem Singh Rao (55) was heading towards Kaliashpuri on his bike from Delwada, but as soon as he reached at the midway his bike was hit by a fast moving truck container coming from behind, after hitting the victim the accused truck driver fled away from the scene leaving the truck on the spot that was later seized by police. Few minutes later a team of Sukher police station rushed on the spot and hurried the victim constable to the M.B hospital in a highway ambulance for treatment, but due to the severe injuries the Rao succumbed to his injuries and his dead body was shifted to mortuary, said Sukher Police. An FIR has been lodged against the accused driver of the truck container for driving negligently and his search hunt has been launched, Police said. Sukher police further informed that the Rao was serving the police department since long and was posted at Sukher Police station from last 3 years.

MLSU : Minor Acts, now find a place in Law curriculum

Udaipur : In a first, deviating from the conventional syllabus being taught for years, the Law college of Mohanlal Sukhadia University here has annexed 'Minor Acts' that have been plaguing the courts but overlooked in law curriculums across the state so far. Law college students here, from the session starting this July, will have to take lessons on Acts related to Domestic Violence, Sexual offences against Children, Stamps and Registration of Property, Drug abuse, Electricity, Panchayati Raj, Delivery of public services to name a few, that were not taught in any universities so far. Law students will also be taught Framing of Charges and Judgement Writing. With the modified syllabus, MLSU becomes first in the state to adopt fifteen of the widely applied Minor Acts, in classroom teaching. The upgradation of course comes not only for the traditional LLB course but also for the 5 year integrated law curriculum. The new syllabus will also require students to attend live proceedings in the courts and file a project report on the observations made. This change would not only update

the future advocates, but also enable them to fight confidently for the judicial service examinations, authorities claim.

"The need for a modification of syllabus was strongly felt when we found some essential elements missing in the syllabi. Strangely, we observed that cases related to domestic violence, sexual offences, transfer of property etc were plaguing the courts

but none of the Acts were covered in the syllabus, in any of the Universities in Rajasthan" claimed Dr Anand Paliwal, Dean of the Law college. On the other hand, the RJS (Raj Judicial Services) aspirants are expected to have an in-depth knowledge of these Acts to clear the competition. "Even after graduation, law scholars not having theoretical knowledge of important Acts, lagged

them behind, also forcing them to pay extra fees for RJS coaching, which we thought must be remedied" Paliwal said.

A committee of experts recommended modifications at various semesters in the interest of the students and the Academic Council approved it. Also besides General English, a paper on General Hindi language too has been introduced in the course which is mandatory to be cleared by all students. "With the course tuned to the RJS syllabus, I can bet that our students can fight the competition confidently without the requirement to spend any money on extra coaching" the Dean asserted. The authorities have also planned for a short internship for the students who will have to get attached with practicing lawyers and join them in court proceedings to gain practical knowledge. Against the intake capacity of 60 students, the law college receives more than 250 admission applications for the 5 years integrated course while the number of students admitted for three years LLB course is more than 400 every year indicating the inclination of students towards the subject.

Dhan Mandi police on Saturday arrested a man with fake notary seals, fake seals of Domestic gas agencies and with few Customer cards and dairies of the issued on the name of various people.

The accused has also accepted doing the black marketing of the domestic LPG cylinders. Accused Naresh Sahu of Lakhara Cowk was arrested by the Dhan Mandi police on Saturday afternoon and a huge number of fake seals and stamp papers and dairies of various gas agencies were confiscated from him, he is also accused of doing black marketing of the LPG cylinders.

Additional Sp City Dr Rajesh Bhardwaj informed that Police is further investigating about other people's involvement in the matter in making the fake stamp seals and issuing stamp papers to the accused, availability of Huge number of gas connection dairies of various gas agencies of the city with the accused is also an matter of investigation for police.

Station House officer of the Dhan Mandi police station Rajendra Kumar Jain said that he was getting the tipoff from last few days about the accused

activities, after verifying the information of the sources the team of cops raided the house of accused and has banned him for doing fraud. In the initial interrogation the accused Naresh accepted doing black marketing of the LPG cylinders and also selling them in the market for commercial use.

He also accepted making fake notary seal on the name of Notary Lalit Khamesra and informed the police that he has got it from a shop situated at Ashvani Bazar area of the city, when Lalit was called at the police station for verification of the seal he declared it fake and also denied of having any knowledge about that seal. Adsp city also added that if during the investigation of the matter it was found that the Domestic gas cylinders were sold by the accused illegally in the market for commercial use than he will be booked under various sections of Essential Commodities Act. A case has been registered against the accused Naresh by the Dhan Mandi police and police is now integrating him further to get the details about other people involved with him in the black marketing of LPG Cylinders.

Border roads to be linked with highways: Gadkari

Jodhpur : About 1,500 kilometres of border roads in Rajasthan will be connected with national highways under the Centre's Bharat Mala scheme, Union minister for road transport, shipping and highways Nitin Gadkari said on Monday, in a major boost to connectivity between towns and bordering areas.

The project will cost ' 5,000 crore, and work on it will start within six months, said Gadkari, who was in Jaipur to review the progress of nine national highways.

"National highway network in border districts like Barmer, Jaisalmer, Bikaner of Rajasthan would be extended to nearly 1,500 kilometres. The order to prepare a detailed project report (DPR) for it has already been passed and the work is expected to

start within next six months," he told the media in Jodhpur.

The border roads to be connected with national highways include 275-km-long Munabao-Sundara road at Indo-Pak border, 121-km-long road between Jaisalmer and Tanot, 397-km-long road from Sriganganagar to Raisinghnagar, among others.

Addressing the media, the Union minister said the foundation stone for nine national highways in Rajasthan was laid on December 13, 2014, out of which work has started on seven projects. The remaining two projects,



he said, will take off within a month after getting clearance from the forest department.

Gadkari said that on the request of chief minister Vasundhara Raje, 72-km road between Anupgarh and Suratgarh has been included in the Bharat Mala scheme - the central government's scheme to build

road network along the border and coastal areas. The union minister also said that out of 57 bridges on the Jaipur-Delhi highway, work on 52 bridges has been completed and the remaining would be completed by the end of December. Ten cities have been

selected to start intelligence traffic system to bring down the number of accidents and Jaipur is one among them, he said. Works are on to connect all district headquarters along with backward and tribal areas with national highways, he said.

In Jodhpur, Gadkari attended the inaugural function of Jodhpur-Pali highway and Beower-Pali-Pindwada division. The minister laid the foundation stone of road widening project on Jodhpur-Pokhran division on the occasion.

The BJP leader also said the Central government would soon pass an order to formulate a project report to develop a dry port by constructing a canal connecting the Arabic sea near Sanchole of Jalore district. Gadkari said that the government was focused

on reducing cost and improving quality. The union minister said that the Centre had decided to promote water transportation. "Around 101 water routes have been marked for transportation and orders have been passed to prepare DPR of 55 water routes," he said, adding that the Chambal river of Rajasthan was also one of these water routes.

"The Central government with the help of Australian technique has started manufacturing a boat that would run over eight metres above the water level. The cost of this boat is less than ' 5 crore and it would cover 60 kilometre in an hour," he said.

"The boat is expected to begin its trail in next three months and required approvals for the same have been obtained."
