Description: His grandfather Sh. Bhargava ji used to treat the royal families of Rajasthan and was very famous for his treatment. Guni Varda ram has acquired all his knowledge from his father and grandfather. He has been healing patients with traditional medicine since last 45 years He was also a committee member in identifying gunis for their accreditation and certification by IGNOU (Indira Gandhi National Open university), QCI (quality council of India) and FRLHT (Foundation for revitalization in local health tradi-

His whole family helps him in preparing medicines, packing and then dispensing it. They all are perfect in treating various illnesses. He is a strong believer of God. Every year he celebrate Dhanwantry day along with his whole family. On that day he and his family members pray to God Dhanwantry to allow him to use all these medicinal herbs for one year. At the same time they also take permission from plants to use them for one year and in return promise them for planting more herbs every time they use them.

He has excellent system for packing the drugs. He has given numbers to all the medicines according to the disease and has written instructions, doses plus precautions over every packet. For oils and ointments he uses air tight bottles. Every week he prepares new medicines. He has given employment to around 8-10 people in his village who bring herbs from forest and deliver it further. So he pays them a good salary for their services. He has his own herbal

Education: 5thClass According to him that time's education was more difficult than today's. There was no teacher in his village so his father hired one teacher from other village. He used to stay with their family and taught Varda ram

Introduction to RGM: From last 25 years he is in regular contact with RGM. He learnt preparing powders of herbs, oils and also the ointments. Earlier he uses to give just raw plant part to patients. RGM always provide him with all the packing materials necessary for packing the oils etc. RGM help him in delivering his medicines to far off places.

According to him "RGM" has helped him in adding sources to his income. It is the constant effort of RGM that we all are recognized not just at district or State level but at the National level. We are in constant contact with gunis of other states. It's all because of RGM I'm able to sustain my traditional medicinal system in such a modern world.

Specialization: Impotency Normally 10-15 patients of impotency come to him every year. He first diagnoses the problem by asking related questions to the couple. And then try to identify the cause behind impotency. Only then he starts treatment. According to him after 40 years of age it is difficult to conceive for a women but he has handled such complicated cases with success. His course of treatment is for 15 days but patient normally finds relief on 3rd day.

Payment: Charge minimal of 40 rupees and that for only those who can afford. For poors doesn't charge anything.

Are the dark shadows of Emergency Back?

Are the dark black days of Emergency back? June 25th reminds every Indian of this dark period of Nineteen months which saw the suspension of the Fundamental Rights as provided in the Constitution of India for the citizens of this country. Senior BJP leader Lal Krishna Adwani has very subtly expressed his fear targeting the BJP led government. Well, the political power struggle in BJP may be an issue of debate within the party circles and may not interest people at large. But what affects each citizen of this country is the existence of the rule of law - and when we say rule of law it means the fundamental law of equality for every individual. No one is big or small before law. What affects individual citizens is their right to life and that means not just a right to keep breathing but a right to a life of dignity. What affects an individual is the right to freedom of expression, to contest against the wrong done to him by any agency, be it an employer or the state itself. What affects an individual is the right to follow a religion, to be able to worship the way (s)he likes and above all a sense of belonging to the nation, to the place he lives in. A citizen needs a confidence that the house he lives in will not be demolished by some vagrant arm of the executive at the behest of some corporate company or its political stooges. This is what reminds us of

Emergency. From 25th June 1975 to

March 1977 these were the questions that had bothered the nation. These are the questions that bother us now. The argument in favour of a strong union government has finally landed into a situation where all voices of sanity fall on deaf ears and the high sounding rhetoric of demagogy is repeat-

ed- "Four legs good, two legs bad". In the dark period of Emergency the state was the culprit which snatched away the freedom of Press and expression. Therefore it was easy to identify the enemy and target it. Now it is the owners of industry, the big media houses and the corporate owners of Private Universities who have curbed the rights of the employees and punished those who have dared to raise voice for their legal demands.

Recent example is that of employees of media houses. The services of journalists and non – journalists is governed by Working Journalists and Other Newspaper Employees Act 1955. According to this Act several Wage Boards have been constituted from time to time namely Diwatiya Commission, Shinde Commission, Palekar Commission, Bachhawat commission, Manisana Commission and finally Majithia Commission which was constituted by UPA government in 2007. The commission gave its report on 31st Dec. 2010 and the Union cabinet gave its approval on 27th October 2011. On 11th Nov. 2011 the notification was issued by the Union government. The owners of the

Newspaper moved to the Supreme Court against this order of the government but their writ was rejected by the honourable court. The Apex court ordered in its order dated 7 February 2014 that all the journalists and other employees should be given the revised wages from April 2014 and the arrear from Nov.2011 should be given in four installments. But the News Paper owners have not complied with the order of the Apex Court. On 7th Feb.2015 journalists and nonjournalists moved to the court asking for implementation of the recommendations of Majithia Wage Board. It is surprising that over seventeen thousand journalists and nonjournalists are appellants in this case of contempt of court but the media houses are so powerful that the state has failed to enforce its own notifi-

cation on them. What is more alarming is that the owners of Newspapers who take all benefits in the name of Press like huge advertisements, almost free land and subsidized paper for their industry have not only flouted the decisions of the Apex court but have started harassing the journalists and other employees. In Rajasthan Patrika alone about twenty two journalists and other employees have been terminated, about forty journalists and other employees have been transferred to distant places and a journalist has been suspended. The fourth pillar of democracy has crushed the democratic aspirations of the

journalists and press employees and flouted the very fundamental right to life by such repressive measures. Not just this, when some employees made an attempt to peacefully oppose the suppressive action of the management, the police was used to harass them. This is the black shadow of emergency that looms heavily over innocent people everywhere and the state turns a deaf ear to them because they are the opinion makers and their partners in political power game.

The same is true of all Private Universities and colleges in the country. Brought in existence by an Act of Legislation the Private Universities flout the regulations of the University Grants Commission in appointment of teachers and other employees and in paying them wages. There are about forty Private Universities and about ten deemed universities in the state of Rajasthan but except a few permanent teachers in some universities none of the teachers are paid UGC grades. The nature of appointment is contractual or payment on period basis. These teachers lead a life worse than a bonded labour and the owners of these Private Universities earn fat profits adding to their assets every year. Both the UGC and the state governments have not done anything to ascertain the implementation of UGC scales. The employees and teachers have no voice and there is no democratic forum to voice their concerns. This



is the dark shadow of Emergency which hangs over the academic institutions of the country. And above all, the ministry of HRD is headed by a minister whose basic qualification is dubious. Yet nobody in the ruling party seems to take cognizance of this pathetic situation.

And finally the notorious Land Acquisition Ordinances and the proposed Bill which has been criticized as anti-farmer. The Union government is not willing to listen to the people and is hell bent on getting it passed by hook or by crook. This bill snatches away the Right to life and Livelihood of millions of people, particularly the tribes. It is an instrument of exploitation of natural and human resources by the capitalists of the country who exercise a big influence on the ruling elite of the nation. The Emergency this time is not to be promulgated by the state. It is feared that the apathy and indifference of the state towards the people and their connivance with the capitalist and the corporate will create situations that might lead to greater suffering of people made worse by a paralysis of democratic institutions of the country.
