Harish had no one to guide him as his parents were less educated. He would study for 4 hours after work to become a judge. After working from 10 AM until 5 PM in Nathdwara court, Devangini used to go for coaching in Udaipur and go back to Nathdwara at 10 PM. She always travelled with notes in her hands.

### 40 KM tunnel for Rajsamand

After the release of the list, the race of admission to engineering institutions will start. In the rank-list Yashwant Meena got 254th rank. It is important to note that in the last few days CBSE, in the rank list, has given a weightage of 40 percent of 12th boards and 60 percent marks of the mains. The director of Brainwave institute Manish Tyagi said that around 57 students from the institute were successful of which Yashwant was one. The director of Ikra Education Tanvir said that three of his students Murtaza Bohra, Runjhun Goswami and Apoorva got success. 13c students from MK Jain classes got successful. St. Antony's Senior Secondary School honoured promising student Sudeep Agrawal and his family members. It is notable that Sudeep scored 106th rank in the 2014-2015 JEE Examination among almost 13 lac candidates. Principal William D'Souza awarded him with a check of 25 thousand rupees and a trophy.

# Disabled Ira Singhal, tops UPSC Exam

Ira Singhal, a 31-year-old Delhi woman, created history on Saturday by becoming the first person with disability to top the civil service examination in which four of the top five slots were bagged by women.

Renu Raj, a 27-year-old doctor from Kerala, secured second rank in her first attempt.

Nidhi Gupta, an IRS officer from Delhi, came third, Vandana Rao bagged fourth rank while Suharsha Bhagat, also an IRS officer from Bihar, got the fifth position.

Ira, who suffers from Scoliosis a spine-related disorder - is an inspiration for women and disabled people as she overcame her disability to complete her computer engineering, MBA and several other courses. She also worked as Customer **Development Manager for Cadbury** India Ltd from 2008 to 2010.

#### Long and difficult road

Ira has travelled a long way and fought hard all along. In 2010, despite clearing the civil services exam and qualifying for IRS, she was not included in the service. The government thought that as a candidate having problems with both arms, she was eligible only for IAS and not for any



Ira, who has 62 per cent disability, took the government to the Central Administrative Tribunal and, after a

battle, won the case to get inducted into the IRS last year.

"Probably, this would help others in viewing women and disabled in a better way," a beaming Ira said in Hyderabad where she is undergoing training as an IRS officer. As messages of congratulations poured in, her father Rajendra Singhal and mother Anita said she was an allrounder and one who was not bogged down by adversities.

Vandana, the fourth rank holder. is the topper in the OBC category while fifth rank holder Suharsha is a Chemical Engineer from IIT-Bombay. Nitish K from Karnataka secured

eighth rank. Altogether, 1,236 candidates have been selected for the civil services this time. Among the selected, 180 will be chosen for IAS, 150 for IPS and 32 for IFS. Remaining will be given posting in Group A services (710) and Group B services (292) depending on their ranks.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi congratulated those who successfully cleared the civil services exam. "My best wishes as you begin the journey to serve the nation. To those who didn't clear the exam-such moments are a part of life. This must not deter you from your future endeavours," Modi tweeted

## Dean with Vyapam Scam link found dead in Delhi

Arun Sharma, dean of Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Medical College and Hospital in Jabalpur, was found dead in a Delhi hotel

The dean of a medical college in Madhya Pradesh, who was assisting the police in probing the MPPEB scam, was found dead in a hotel in southwest Delhi on Sunday, adding yet another twist to the

Police said there was no prima facie evidence of foul play in the death of 64-year-old Arun Sharma, the dean of Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Medical College and Hospital



in Jabalpur. Officials said it could be a case of natural death though they did not rule out suicide. There were no injuries on the body.

In a strange coincidence, Sharma's death came exactly a year after Dr DK Sakale, the former dean of the same medical college, was found

dead in his official bungalow. On Saturday, Delhi-based television journalist Akshay Singh died suddenly while on an assignment in Madhya Pradesh to interview the parents of a woman who died in suspicious circumstances after her name figured in the massive admission and recruitment scandal.

Sharma, who was also head of the radio diagnostics department of the medical college. was to retire in 2016. He came to Delhi on Saturday and was on his way to Tripura as a member of an inspection team of the Medical Council of India.

There is no effective treatment but with less use of tobacco, its risks can be reduced. The problems of throat like cancer affects the part behind the nose, mouth, esophagus and wind pipe. Doctors believe that as soon as the patient accepts that he has cancer, the cancer can be treated in an effective manner. Because cancer in early stage is easy to conquer.
