



Important Decisions In Cabinet Meeting

33,689 School Assistants To Be Recruited

Jaipur, The State Cabinet has approved Rajasthan School Assistant Subordinate Service Rules-2015 for recruitment of school assistants on 33,689 posts and took several other important decisions including setting up of Bhupal Nobles University in private sector at Udaipur and amendments in the Agricultural Market Yard Transfer Policy-2013.

The Chief Minister Smt. Vasundhara Raje chaired the meeting of State Cabinet at the CMO on Tuesday.

Parliamentary Affairs Minister Shri Rajendra Rathore told the media persons that the State Cabinet gave approval to Rajasthan School Assistant Subordinate Service Rules-2015 as per which 33,689 school assistants would soon be recruited. These posts would be allotted in government Upper Primary, Secondary and Higher Secondary schools. Main assignment of the school assistants would be record-keeping of mid-day-meal, enrolment and dropout children, promoting children to attend schools, sanitation and other non-teaching works. Candidates having experience in approved government and private schools under the government's educational projects such as Lok Jumbish, Shikshakarmi Board, Rajiv Gandhi Pathshala, DPEP, Sarva Siksha Abhiyan, Madarasa Board etc would be included in these recruitments.

Shri Rathore said that this recruitment would be based on 100 marks, of which 70% weight-age would be given for the marks scored in Senior Secondary examination. Bonus of 5, 10 and 15 marks would be given for one, two or three years experience respectively in government schools or government educational projects. A interview committee constituted at district level would conduct interview for 15 marks. Those candidates who were within age limit at the time of their first appointment in the Lok Jumbish, Shikshakarmi Board, Rajiv Gandhi Pathshala, DPEP, Sarva Siksha Abhiyan, Madarasa Board projects, but have now expired the age limit would be eligible for this recruitment. No bonus marks would be given for experience earned in the private schools, he said.

The Parliamentary Affairs Minister said that District Collectors and the Superintendents of Police Conference would be held between July 22 and 25. The Chief Minister would chair the joint conference of the Collectors and the SPs on July 22 and 23. District-wise meetings of the Collectors and SPs with in-charge Ministers, Secretaries, Divisional Commissioner and the Members of State Assembly would be conducted on July 24. On the last day of conference on July 25, decisions and action taken on the applications received during Sarkar Aapke Dwar (Government at Your Doorstep) campaign in Bharatpur, Bikaner and Udaipur divisions would be reviewed, he said.

Shri Rathore said that Government at Your Doorstep campaign would be conducted in Kota Division between

August 31 and September 7. In the beginning of the event all Ministers would be present at Kota on August 31. Jan Sunvai (Public Hearing) would be conducted at every Gram Panchayat headquarter and group hearing would be done at the block-level. On September 7, meeting of the State Cabinet would be held at Kota, he stated.

Parliamentary Affairs Minister said that about 12 lakh cases had been disposed off during the Nyay Aapke Dwar (Justice at Your Doorstep) campaign. The Cabinet expressed satisfaction over the progress of the campaign, he said. He added that in all about 2.75 cases of revenue record updation, about 52,000 cases of division of revenue titles, almost 14,000 matters of title rights, another 3.83 lakh cases of transfer of mutations and about 3.34 cases of revenue certificates were disposed off. Shri Rathore said that till date the state government had approved sanction for recruitment on 1,00,518 different posts in various departments to the recruiting agencies. Till date, appointment were given on 54,097 different posts.

The Minister said that the State Cabinet further decided to amend Rajasthan Public Service Commission (Conditions of Service) Regulations, 1974. As per this, the non-government Chairperson and Members retired from the Commission would be given monthly pension of 8,000 rupees and 7,500 rupees respectively instead of 650 and 500 rupees, he told.

Shri Rathore said that the Cabinet also approved to amend Rajasthan Journalists and Writers Welfare Fund Rules-2001. One-time assistance provided from this fund had been hiked from 25,000 rupees to 50,000 rupees and in special circumstances the assistance of one lakh rupees would be given instead of 50,000 rupees. Also, 50% concession in bus fare was approved for the accredited journalists for all Rajasthan Roadways buses on AC and Volvo category within operational within Rajasthan and for journey to Delhi, the Minister said.

The Parliamentary Affairs Minister said that for attracting investment in higher education sector, it was decided to establish Bhupal Nobles University at Udaipur in the private sector. He said that setting-up of this university would ensure quality improvement and promotion of research in higher education sector.

He told that the State Cabinet further decided to amend Rajasthan Agricultural Market Yard Transfer Policy-2013 as per which traders of the old agricultural produce market would be allotted shops in new markets as with mutual consent, he added. Shri Rathore said that at state-level the Civil Defence Department would be merged with Disaster Management and Relief Department for which the decision of amending Rajasthan procedural rules was taken. Disaster Management and Relief Department would be nodal for the Civil Defence Department, he said.

Important initiatives by Modi's government

Make in India: A couple of days back Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched a flagship "Make in India" campaign with an objective to make India a manufacturing superpower. In this campaign local and foreign companies were urged to invest in India. The Government has selected 25 sectors where India can beat the world. Major among these are automobiles, chemicals, IT, pharma, electronics, design manufacturing, mining, bio-technology, textiles, ports, aviation, leather, tourism and hospitality, wellness and railways. Ministers related to manufacturing are also participating in the "Make in India" campaign.

These 25 sectors will also focus on skill enhancement and job creation. To make this campaign a success, the government has made plans to relax foreign investment caps in construction. This will boost participation of companies in the '100 smart cities' project and affordable housing. The government has already made changes in the FDI caps in defence and railways and these have been eased to 49% and 100%, respectively. The initiative will be a success if India can control its corruption.

Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan

One of the biggest problems in India is lack of sanitation facilities and cleanliness. The Narendra Modi Government is going to tackle this problem by launching Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan on October 2, the birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi. The initiative will focus on cleanliness, waste management and sanitation across the country.

The first phase of the drive started on September 25 up to panchayat level and will last till Diwali.

100 smart cities project

The government is planning to build 100 smart cities in India with the pilot project in Bangalore. Design and creation will be region specific. Smart cities will have 27*7 water supply and electricity. The cities will be free from garbage heaps. These cities will provide quality education and sports facilities. There will be open spaces for recreation and for healthy living.

Manufacturing companies are sensing good business opportunities and want to reap the benefits. Faridabad, Gurgaon, Delhi, Jodhpur, Ajmer, Dehradun, Haridwar, Kanpur, Jaipur, Gwalior, Bhopal, Indore, Lucknow, Varanasi, Bodh Gaya, Allahabad and Kochi are in the list of smart cities. In the Union Budget, Finance Minister Arun Jaitley had allocated Rs 7,060 crore for the development of the smart cities.

Every Indian household to have a bank account: Prime Minister Narendra Modi promised that every Indian household will have a bank account. Most of the poor people who

do not have a bank account depends upon money lender for financial help. With this they enter into vicious cycle of debt. Modi launched a major initiative for providing bank account to every Indian. He wrote 725,000 emails to bank officials urging them to support the initiative. Welfare benefits will be directly transferred to the bank account of the holder leaving no space for bribery and corruption. This will also reduce the influence of moneylenders.

Though such an initiative is not new in India but banks fail to provide services made for poor. Banks must target specific audience and its needs. The poor must have a regular source of income to pay back the loan if he takes from bank. So along with bank account, providing skill-based education and work becomes mandatory. Industrial corridors: India needs well developed and connected roads, ports and infrastructure for the complete development and change in India.

To achieve this the government is working on many ambitious projects undertaking the development of infrastructure and roads in India. The Union finance minister in his budget speech proposed industrial corridors and 20 new industrial clusters.

Trio arrested for ATM loot

With the swift move of the Udaipur police a trio of robbers were arrested successfully while they were attempting to rob an ATM booth at Mavli police station circle on Friday night. The trio was spotted by the night patrolling team who later nabbed he accused in chase which continued for more than 4 hours. The trio was spotted by the night patrolling team of Mavli police station of the district on Friday night while they were trying to break the ATM machine of Syndicate bank. Seeing the police team the trio out of which one of the offender was standing inside the ATM booth and two were standing outside it fled away from the scene, leaving the ATM machine partially broken, soon the patrolling team of the cops started chasing them, the accused took the advantage of dark and somehow managed to hide them but the cops didn't have hope and continued to search them, at last after 4 hours of efforts the trio was finally nabbed by the police and rushed to the police station, Station House Officer of Mavli police station Rajendra Kumar said. Kumar further said that on Friday night he himself rushed to the crime scene with his team and initiated the search operation which continued for the whole night, the team of 20 police men searched the accused in various areas and eventually the trio that were hiding themselves in bushes were nabbed by the cops. The arrested accused were identified as Rashid Husain (20) of Kankroli, Gulam Husain (21) and Yogesh (18) of Rajasamand district, the trio was arrested and booked for attempting ATM loot, said SHO. SHO also added that the trio of accused has entered into the ATM booth with an intention of stealing cash from the ATM machine and also broken the machine but before they can reach to the cash they were notice of the active policemen of Mavli police station, but if the patrolling team could not spot them on time they can commit the ATM loot within few minutes as they have broken some parts of the machine as well as the Close circuit camera installed at the booth. Police has also recovered some tools and an iron rod from the ATM booth that were seized and the interrogation of the arrested accused is still going on.

Elderly woman killed

In the series of elderly women killing in Udaipur another 80 year old woman was killed by an accused while she was asleep at her house on Thursday night here at Peepla Bhatda village of Semari police station of the district. The accused has killed the victim by twisting her neck and has also stolen the heavy silver anklets wore by her in her legs, but police is assuming that she was targeted by somebody known to her and he has created the scene as a loot to misguide the police and others. Semari police team along with DSP Ashok Meena rushed to the scene soon after getting the information of the incidence and started the investigation. DSP immediately called the Forensic Science Lab team to take samples at the crime scene. Station House Officer Hazari Lal Meena informed that the victim was identified as Leela Jogi (80) of Peepla Bhatda village whose dead body was found lying at her house with her twisted neck on Friday morning, one of the neighbour informed the police about the mishap. During the initial investigation the investigators found an empty pouch

of liquor, some utensils containing rice in them, seeing all that police is assuming that some body known to the victim is involved in her murder and has created a scene of murder for loot and has intentionally stolen the silver anklets and ear rings of the victim to mislead the police investigation, SHO said. Police also found that Leela use to stay alone at her house as her daughter in law stay at nearby village with her family, but from last few days Leela was sleeping at her neighbour's house after her house was targeted by thieves last month, SHO Meena added.

Anti tobacco drive formally launched at M.B Hosptial

In Rajasthan 180 people dies every day due to the consumption of tobacco products

Udaipur : The anti tobacco drive at RNT medical college and M.B hospital had been formally inaugurated by the Divisional Commissioner Bhavani Singh Detha on Saturday. The inaugural program was held at the auditorium of the medical college where other renowned names behind the anti tobacco drive including the Dr. D.P Singh Principal of RNT Medical college, Dr. Shalabh Sharma additional principal of RNT medical college, Dr. Rakesh Gupta Chairman of Rajasthan Cancer Foundation and Gajendra Jodawat President of Rotary club Udaipur were present at the function.

On this occasion Dr Rakesh Gupta has given presentation in relation to the hazards of tobacco consumption and also demanded the people to be part of the drive to make it a success within the premises of RNT and to make it like a law not to carry tobacco products in RNT medical college premises and M.B Hosptial compound. Dr Gupta has highlighted some figures of death due to consumption of tobacco, by doing so he said that in Rajasthan 180 people dies every day due to the consumption of tobacco products, as per study in 2010 in India 35% of the people died due to consuming tobacco products out of which 21% were those who chew tobacco.

Prior to this initiative similar initiative was taken by the administration of Jhunjhanu district in 2007 when Bhavani Singh Detha was the district collector there and the city had become country's first tobacco free city, Dr Gupta highlighted. By continuing his speech Dr Gupta further said that the implementation of no tobacco drive is possible but for that we have adopt a specific policy within the premises.

To make the drive a success all the students, staff members and even the attendants of patients will be involved in it but as it a gradual process it will take time and will soon emerge as a revolution. After educating and motivating the staff members and medical students if any non compliance will be found in following the no tobacco policy at the hospital compound then penalty will be levied on individual if required, said Dr D.P Singh while addressing the program. Singh further added that communications is the key of making the anti tobacco drive w success as RNT medical college is not only the first medical college of the state but the first one to initiate the anti tobacco drive within its premises to spread awareness amongst the people, more over any body needs any sort of assistance in quitting the tobacco products can call the toll free numbers 104 for assistance. This is considerable that state is having highest number of female tobacco consumer in the country with a percentage of 5.1 % where as percentage of the country in his catagory stands at 2.5%, said Dr. Singh. Highlighting the strategic needs of the drive Dr Singh said that it will be considered an idol drive once the quit rate will remains 90%, number of violation of the policy will reach upto 90% and the tobacco litter reduces up to 10%. At the end of the program Dr Singh added that around 65,500 Rajasthanis dies every year due to tobacco consumption so every one has to work as a team to stop to reduce the number of these deaths as it is a preventive figure and can be reduced with mass efforts. When asked about consumption of tobacco products amongst the doctors Dr D.P Singh claimed that the fashion of consuming tobacco products or chewing tobacco has gone below to great extend these days as they are self motivated and very well aware about the disadvantages of the deadly products but if any doctor will be found consuming them within the hospital and college premises then he will be penalized in same manner as any other individual will be.
