Shah discusses Parliament strategy with BJP ministers

New Delhi : Ahead of the monsoon session, BJP chief Amit Shah today discussed with senior Union Ministers the strategy to counter the Opposition in Parliament and is also meeting party chief ministers Vasundhara Raje and Shivraj Singh Chouhan, both of whom are facing controversy.

Rajasthan Chief Minister Raje, whose alleged involvement in the Lalit Modi row has seen her being targeted by the Congress, and her Madhya Pradesh counterpart, who is under attack over the Vyapam scam, will be presenting their side of the story to



the party so that the government can effectively deal with the Opposition, sources said.

External Affairs Minister Sushma Swaraj, Finance Minister Arun Jaitley and Information and Technology Minister Ravi Shankar Prasad were among those who met Shah. Chouhan is also likely to meet Prime Minister Narendra Modi later in the day. The Congress has sought resignations of both Chouhan and Raje. It has also demanded that Swaraj quit for helping former IPL boss Lalit Modi.

The monsoon session of Parliament, which begins Tuesday,

is set to be a stormy one as the Congress and several other Opposition parties appeared to be closing ranks to corner the government on a range of issues, including the Vyapam scam and Lalit Modi controversy.

Apart from pressing for the removal of Union ministers Swaraj and Smriti Irani, Opposition parties have indicated that they would raise the issue of scams and controversies allegedly involving BJP chief ministers Chouhan, Raje and Raman Singh of Chhattisgarh and demand their resignations.

Another feather in the cap of Gitanjali doctors

Gitanjali hospital has been able to deliver yet again with another complex case in which doctors operated on valve in the heart of a pregnant women. Doctors also delivered the baby through operation. Both the mother and child are hale and hearty now. Doctor Sanjay Gandhi who is a cardia surgeon and Dr. Anjana Verma claimed that this was only second time in the history of India. The first such successful operation was done in Delhi.

In this operation, along with Dr. Gandhi and Verma, Dr. Ankur Gandhi, Dr. Kalpesh Mistri, and Dr. Manmohan Jindal also worked hard and smartly. In this press conference in which doctors revealed about the process, challenges, and finally success of this operation, the CEO Ankit Agarwal announced to bear all educational expenses of this child till



class 12th. He also said that the medical teams and facilities are getting better and soon kidney, lever, and heart trans-

plant facilities will also be made available.

Divulging details about the case in particular, Dr. Sanjay Gandhi said that while the patient was pregnant, the problem of valve was diagnosed. They could have not taken chances with either of them. Mother was kept on medication for 2-3 months and then later the transplant and cesarean delivery was performed simultaneously and lives were saved.

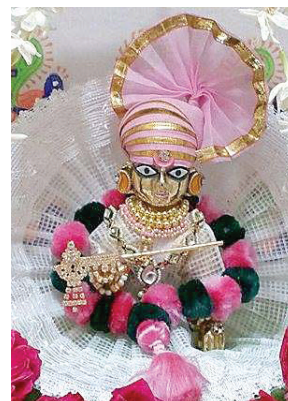
PWD under scanner for bad roads, ACB seize records

Udaipur : Acting on a complaint of grave irregularities in the construction of a road under the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY) in Gogunda block, the Special unit of Anti-corruption Bureau raided at the Superintendent Engineer's (SE) office here and seized documents. The investigation which continued on Saturday here has indicated not only poor quality of road built under the scheme, but also surprisingly found that the road had been not made between the villages for which it had been sanctioned but built at some other place in the vicinity.

"According to the villagers, there had been a demand of a link road between Shrimaliyon ki Madri and Mannaji ka Gura in Gogunda block. A tender was floated for the same and work order had been sanctioned for the road stretching to some 1.6 kilometers. Despite a display board

at the site indicating construction for the same, the road was not found there" informed Umesh Ojha, the additional SP. However, the road was found to have been built between Jaswantgarh, Saira to Raoji ki Madri, villages in the same vicinity.

"Not only for the deviation of site, but there had been complaints of poor quality of materials used in the construction. The departmental staff claimed the quality testing equipment to be out of order and they had to outsource reports from contractors" Ojha said. On Saturday, the ACB team did sampling from various sites and send them for FSL investigation. "We have to determine first whether the ingredients used in road construction are sub-standard ones. If they fail in the parameters, responsible personnel could be arrested" the officer added.

Vaishnavites had arranged more than 500 kilograms of flowers to greet the Lord, more than 100 welcome gates had been installed in various circles and lanes.

With more than 150 homeguards and volunteers cover-

ing the deity and police forces on toes to check the security, Lalan Prabhu was taken to Jagdish temple for the Vihar. According to the organizers, more than 40 thousand devotees are expected to come for Darshan of the lord in two days. Devotees from Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh and Maharashtra have arrived in the city to have glimpse of the Lord.

"Like other kids, we too

used to be immersed in the world of animation and games. One day our father said, 'Why don't you let the world watch your animation instead of two of you watching animation all day', said Pal and Chin to a national daily. The boys then started looking at the animation tutorials and within a year, they developed a few animated games. When Pal was 8, their parents took him to MAAC (a Ketan Mehta-promoted animation institute) in Mumbai and after analyzing his talent, the institute people allowed him to undertake an advance course in animation which is

generally not meant for children. Pal also joined the Mumbai Digital Academy for a short screenplay course and during the course, he assisted the institute's director for a short film. "The learning boosted the confidence of our family and they proposed to make a movie," said the duo. For the film, their house turned into a studio with Pal, Chin and their mother Manju being the lead actors as well as played the role of flightman, cameraman, VFX and animation designer, director and producer etc. While 80% of the shooting was done at their house, a song was dubbed in a Mumbai studio.
