





In his Mann Ki Baat programme on All India Radio, Mr Modi expressed concern over high number of deaths on Indian roads. He said one death occurs in the country every four minutes and every life is very precious.

Mr Modi said a toll free number 1033, ambulance for patients and how the victim will be treated well in the first 50 hours after the accident occur will be given priority in the proposed bill.

Speaking on the 10th edition of Mann Ki Baat, the Prime minister paid



glowing tributes to the martyrs of the Kargil war. Mr Modi complimented the farmers for 50 per cent increase in sowing of pulses and 33 per cent in oil seeds in this season. Mr Modi said, mygov portal which started on July 26th last year has been

"Challenges for the development of industrial infrastructure"

Udaipur : An interactive meeting was held at Chamber Bhawan by Udaipur Chamber of Commerce and Industries at the Aravalli auditorium on the topic Industrial Challenges for the development of infrastructure in Udaipur division'. M Wonder Cement Ltd managing director Shri DP Somani was the special guest and keynote speaker at the meeting.

DP Somani said in his lecture that the nation's economic development depends on industrial and commercial progress. Industrial development in the country depends on the fact that better infrastructure is available to the industrial environment and attract investment. Mineral Industries in Udaipur and has marble base. And logistics is their main problem. Approximately 25 to 30 per cent in the cement industry is spent on logistics. If available the better logistics costs can be reduced up to 50 percent. The road transport system Chittorgarh to Naya Gaon is bottle neck and Mr Somani expressed the hope that the Government will soon improve the route.

Saved in Geetanjali : 'when my own tooth posed a threat to my life'

Udaipur : Geetanjali Hospital's Gastroenterologist Dr. Pankaj Gupta removed a false tooth trapped in the food pipe of an 86 years old elderly patient by endoscopy. Dr. Pankaj Gupta said that the resident of Nimach patient Nanaram Sony (86) was worried because of the tooth stuck in his food pipe for the last 10 days. It got stuck in the food pipe (esophagus) while eating food due to which he started having difficulty swallowing food; he could only drink liquids. He consulted an

ENT physician in Nimach but they failed to remove the tooth. Then the patient visited Geetanjali Hospital and after meeting Dr. Gupta, the tooth was pulled out by the endoscopy. Dr. Gupta said that endoscopy is a form of telescope and with the help of a loop (metal wire), the tooth was removed from the food pipe of the patient who is healthy now. The stuck tooth also caused wounds at two places in food pipe and will heal within 5-7 days.
