**Udaipur :** For the occasion of Independence Day, a bike rally is being organized on Saturday that will traverse with the motto of freedom and patriotism. The Legendary Riders of Scenic Mewar (LRSM 6001) Club has organized the 'Rides for Victory' rally to remind people of the contribution of Mewar in independence. LSRM 6001 Club's joint secretary Jinu Samuel informed that the seed of independence was planted 400 years back in Mewar of which the Vijay Stambh in Chittor is the epitome. On 15th August, bikers with Royal Enfield Bullet, Harley Davidson motorcycle, American Bike Indian Chief Vintage etc. will commence the journey from Gulab Bagh at 10 AM towards Chittor. Executive Director of HRH Group of Hotels Lakshyaraj Singh Mewar will flag off the rally. The highlight of the rally would be world's first two Royal Enfield bikes purchased by the club.

## Vehicle Dealership service centers to conduct PUC Check

**Udaipur :** The authorized vehicle dealers with commercial service centers will establish PUC test centers in their premises. Regional Transport Officer Dr. Mannalal Rawat held a meeting with representatives and members of Udaipur Automobile Dealers Association in which important decisions regarding PUC and traffic control were taken. Dr. Rawat informed that vehicles which will be issued PUC between 15th and 31st August will be granted discount by Dealers Association or Rotary Club on the fees. He further added that Royal Motors Company will launch check points at various places across the city for PUC check where test would be conducted for free. It was also decided during the meeting that on purchase of every two-wheeler, the dealer will provide helmet to the owner.

## Lalit Panwar is RPSC Chairman

**Jaipur:** The state government on Wednesday appointed retired IAS officer Lalit K Panwar as chairman of Rajasthan Public Service Commission. The post had been vacant since September 2014 after former RPSC chairman Habib Khan Gauran resigned after his name figured in RJS paper leak. The long wait of more than four lakh candidates of Rajasthan Administrative and Allied Services (RAS) 2013 is set to come to an end with his appointment. The RAS preliminary (2013) exams were deferred after Gauran resigned. Panwar, who retired as Union tourism secretary on 31 July, 2015, is a 1979 batch official and belongs to Balotra town in Barmer district.

## Naga Accord

In what could give a great boost to government's efforts to curb insurgency in North-East India, the National Socialist Council of Nagaland-Isak-Muivah (NSCN-IM) signed a peace deal with the Government of India on Monday. The historic pact was inked at 7 RCR, the official residence of Prime Minister Narendra Modi in New Delhi, in the presence of top NSCN-IM leaders, including its founding leaders Thuingaleng Muivah and Isak Chisi Swu and Home Minister Rajnath Singh, Defence Minister Manohar Parrikar, Army Chief General Dalbir Singh Suhag, BJP president Amit Shah.

"Peace, security and economic transformation of North-East has been one of my highest priorities," PM Modi, who was presented with a Tangkhul Naga shawl and jacket by Naga leaders, said. Describing the peace accord as historic, the prime minister appreciated Naga leaders for showing 'wisdom'. "Unfortunately, the Naga problem has taken so long to resolve because we did not understand each other," PM Modi said. "I compliment the NSCN-IM for maintaining the ceasefire agreement for nearly 2 decades with a sense of honour. Nagas represent highest level of humanism, system of village administration and grass-root democracy should be a source of inspiration to the rest of the country," he added. Muivah said the government and Nagas were entering a "new relationship" but added that "beginning from now, challenges will be great."

The signing of the pact is the culmination of over 80 rounds of negotiations that spanned 16 years with first breakthrough in 1997 when ceasefire agreement was sealed. While the NSCN-IM is the biggest Naga rebel group which has been maintaining the ceasefire, another faction led by S S Khaplang continues to indulge in violence and was believed to be behind the deadly attack on army in Manipur in June that left 18 soldiers dead and 18 others injured. It was not immediately clear whether the agreement meets the main demand of NSCN-IM for integration of all Naga-inhabited areas in the North East across Manipur, Arunachal Pradesh and Assam. Details and execution plan within this framework agreement will be released shortly, official sources said after the accord in which NSA Ajit Doval played a central role.

## 'Diplomatic Victory' of Modi Govt.



### How old is the Naga political issue?

The British annexed Assam in 1826, and in 1881, the Naga Hills too became part of British India. The first sign of Naga resistance was seen in the formation of the Naga Club in 1918, which told the Simon Commission in 1929 "to leave us alone to determine for ourselves as in ancient times". In 1946 came the Naga National Council (NNC), which, under the leadership of Angami Zapu Phizo, declared Nagaland an independent state on August 14, 1947. The NNC resolved to establish a "sovereign Naga state" and conducted a "referendum" in 1951, in which "99 per cent" supported an "independent" Nagaland.

### When did the peace efforts start?

Almost simultaneously with the resistance. On June 29, 1947, Assam Governor Sir Akbar Hydari signed a 9-point agreement with moderates T Sakhrie and Aliba Imti, which was almost immediately rejected by Phizo. The Naga Hills, a district of Assam, was upgraded to a state in 1963, by also adding the Tuensang Tract that was then part of NEFA. In April the next year, Jai Prakash Narain, Assam Chief Minister Bimala Prasad Chaliha and Rev. Michael Scott formed a Peace Mission, and got the government and NNC to sign an agreement to suspend operations that September. But the NNC/NFG/NFA continued to indulge in violence, and after six rounds of talks, the Peace Mission was abandoned in 1967, and a massive counter-insurgency operation launched.

### How did Modi travel the last mile?

For the NSCN (IM), the Modi government continues from where Vajpayee left. The RSS's Northeast veteran P B Acharya is currently Nagaland Governor, and Joint Intelligence Committee chairman R N Ravi, with his IB background, is an old Northeast hand. The state's political scenario has changed, with T R Zeliang's Naga People's Front, an NDA ally, persuading all groups in the Assembly, including the Congress, to become partners in an all-party government. The government finally succeeded to signed a historic accord with a leading Naga group, NSCN (IM), promising an end to India's longest running insurgency that caps almost two decades of peace talks.

### When did the armed movement begin?

On March 22, 1952, Phizo formed the underground Naga Federal Government (NFG) and the Naga Federal Army (NFA). The Government of India sent in the Army to crush the insurgency and, in 1958, enacted the Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act.

### What did the NSCN (IM) want?

A "Greater Nagalim" comprising "all contiguous Naga-inhabited areas", along with Nagaland. That included several districts of Assam, Arunachal and Manipur, as also a large tract of Myanmar. The map of "Greater Nagalim" has about 1,20,000 sq km, while the state of Nagaland consists of 16,527 sq km. The claims have always kept Assam, Manipur and Arunachal Pradesh wary of a peace settlement that might affect their territories. The Nagaland Assembly has endorsed the 'Greater Nagalim' demand — "Integration of all Naga-inhabited contiguous areas under one administrative umbrella" — as many as five times: in December 1964, August 1970, September 1994, December 2003 and as recently as on July 27, 2015.

### When did NSCN (IM) join peace talks?

Muivah, Swu and other top NSCN (IM) leaders escaped to Thailand in the early 1990s. While Nagaland Governor M M Thomas, a Church leader from Kerala, extracted the first positive response from the NSCN (IM), Prime Minister P V Narasimha Rao met Muivah, Swu and others in Paris on June 15, 1995. In November 1995, then MoS (Home) Rajesh Pilot met them in Bangkok. Subsequently, Prime Minister H D Deve Gowda met them in Zurich on February 3, 1997, which was followed by meetings with officers in Geneva and Bangkok. Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee met them in Paris on September 30, 1998. The Government of India signed a ceasefire agreement with NSCN (IM) on July 25, 1997, which came into effect on August 1, 1997. Over 80 rounds of talks between the two sides were held subsequently.

## Udaipurs shooter Adhiraj Singh Rathore selected the World Championship

**Udaipur :** National Rifle Association of India (NRAI) has selected Adhiraj Singh Rathore to take part and represent India at the World Championship at Lonato, Italy. World championship will start from 9th sept and finish on 18th sept. Adhiraj has secured his place in the team at the 3rd and 4th section trial that took place at Dr. Karni Singh Shooting range in New Delhi, he stood first in the trials.

Raghvender Singh, Adhiraj's father and President of the Rajsamand Rifle Shooting Association, informed that several shooters from Rajasthan have secured their place in the national team including Manavadiya Singh,



Anantjeet Singh Naruka, Maheshwari Chauhan and Shambhavi Kumari. In total the square comprises of 15 shooters from all over India. All these shooters will also take part in the Asian Shooting Championship in Tehran (Iran). Adhiraj has won a silver medal previously. Adhiraj has previously won a Silver medal at a Grand Prix in Kazakhstan. He has started preparing for the forthcoming championship at the Jodh Sagar Country Club and Shooting Range at Kelwa in Rajsamand. Other than these cups, Adhiraj has taken part in World Cup in Germany and Finland.

## Swachh Bharat rankings Udaipur ranked 417

Mysore city in Karnataka has topped the Swachh Bharat Rankings of 476 cities in the country with three more from the State figuring in the top 10. West Bengal does well with 25 cities/towns from the State finding a place in the top 100 cities. These rankings are based on the extent of open defecation and solid waste management practices in these cities. The city of Mysore leads the cities with minimal open defecation and extensive adoption of solid waste management practices.

39 cities from the Southern states are among the top 100 followed by 27 from the East, 15 from the West, 12 from the North and

7 from the North-Eastern States.

15 of the 27 capital cities surveyed figured among the top 100 performers while five were ranked beyond 300. Bengaluru leads the list of capitals at 7th rank while Patna came at the bottom at 429. Udaipur ranked

Among the bottom 100 cities, 74 are from the North, 21 from the East, 3 from the West and 2 from the South. The top 10 ranked cities being : Mysore, Thiruchirappalli (Tamil Nadu), Navi Mumbai, Kochi (Kerala), Hassan, Mandya and Bengaluru from Karnataka, Thiruvananthapuram (Kerala), Halihsahar (West Bengal) and Gangtok (Sikkim) in that order.

## Prayer saved the lives of 190 students

**Udaipur :** Five students of a government senior secondary school Karawada village suffered injuries after a portion of the school building collapsed on them on Saturday morning. The incident occurred around 8.45 am on Saturday when the staff and students were busy with the morning prayers on the school ground, teachers and district officials said.

The four rooms that collapsed housed classes 8 and 9, library and computer lab. Some of the students who were still in the classes were trapped under the rubble but were rescued by teachers and the villagers, teachers said, adding that the victims escaped with minor injuries.

Some parents claimed that no repair or maintenance work had been carried out in the school since it started operation in 1984.

They also said that during verification the tahsildar found that the condition of the school was very bad and many of its walls had cracks.

District collector Rohit Gupta said he would write to government about the mishap and ask it to either repair the school building or provide a new building.



## Darshan Dental College leads Public service activities

**Udaipur :** Loyara situated Darshan Dental College has been imparting useful information about dental care and providing free dental checkups, camps to urban and primarily to rural people for a long time.

College's MD J.K. Tahilia informed that the college is accredited by Rajasthan College of Health Science, Jaipur and Dental Council of India in which new admissions of BDS and MDS students this academic year are being trained with highly specialized equipment to provide quality dental facilities.

General Manager N.S Khamesra said that the college holds camp at nearby villages including Rama, Chhatiyakhedi, Kachapa and Dangiyoka Guda and provide free dental services. Also, camps are organized at Blind School, Asha Dham, Narayan Seva Sansthan, Theosophical Society and Vigyan Samiti.

The college has been organizing Nukkad Natak, rallies to spread awareness among people about dental care and harmful effects of tobacco consumption and drugs. Various departments of the college including oral medicine & radiology, prosthodontics and crown & bridge, oral surgery, periodontics, orthodontic and oral pathology work together.

Principal Dr. Sheetal Hungad informed that Darshan Dental College provides new dentures, capping, implant surgery, operation of fractured teeth and jaw, root canal and organizes dental camps at schools and colleges in and around Udaipur.

## Longest gold chain with most number of rings

**Udaipur :** Iqbal Sakka, known to have created masterpieces which are as minute as fingernails is set to claim another world record with his creation of the longest gold chain with most number of rings to it.

Iqbal Sakka made 20 inch long gold chain using 0.300 mg gold and 1286 rings claiming to have broken the record set by an artist of Karnataka who had made 19.75 inch long gold

chain using 0.970 mg gold with 354 rings. Iqbal states that the use of 1286 rings reflect the number of languages in the world and 0.300 mg gold describes the number of total states in the entire world (300 states). Also the 20 inch long gold chain is directly related to the 20 UN councils in the world.

Hence, this gold chain is the epitome of unity in the world made to bring love, peace, unity and brotherhood in the world.

## TRAI directs Telcos to notify users on data usage

Mobile subscribers will be able to activate or deactivate internet service on their mobile phone by calling or sending an SMS to a new toll free number 1925 from next month onwards.

The new directive from telecom regulator TRAI follows a large number of complaints

from customers that mobile operators were keeping the process of deactivation very complex to earn extra revenue.

The directive issued on Friday mandates telecom operators to provide toll free number '1925' from September 1 to activate or deactivate mobile

internet service either by making a call on the number and following instruction or by sending a SMS.

Customers can send SMS to 1925 by writing 'START' to activate and 'STOP' to deactivate the service.

Telecom operators will have to immediately reply to cus-

tomers about status of activation and deactivation of their service.

The new amendment issued in Telecom Consumers Protection Regulations directs telecom operators not to charge subscribers for usage beyond subscribed limit without their explicit consent.
