Artists Show Cased Tremendous Talent in Wood Carving at Zonal Sclpotr's Workshop, Shilpgram

Creativity is endless as artiste's creative minds always come-up with innovative ideas and concept to deliver something unique to the world of art. Using different materials and mediums Indian artistes have been producing their art works to express their words, thoughts, ideas and creativity to the world. Artistes always experiment with their creativity using some or the other materials.

West Zone Cultural Centre, Udaipur, one of the seven Zonal Cultural Centres of India organised a ten days workshop with an objective to promote young artistes of member states. In all 9 sculptors from Gujarat, Maharashtra and Rajasthan participated in the workshop under the curatorship of Sh. Mahendra Kadia(Renowned painter from Ahmadabad) at Shilpgram Udaipur. "Shilpgram is enriched with natural surroundings and offers congenial atmosphere for creative work" said Sh. Mahendra Kadia. He intended that the artistes who work in industrial material such as fibreglass, PVC and steel should use Wood for caving their art works. Wood has good material quality, tone, texture, longevity, soft for carving and affordable value. It is very close nature.

Sh. Mahendra Kadiya is also Honorary Director at L.&P Hatti Singh Visual Art Centre, Ahmadabad for 30 years and wanders around the world observing and organising art exhibitions. He has special love for Shilpgram as he has already organised Multimedia Sculpture Workshop in 2013. This ten days workshop concluded on August 6,2015 where I had opportunity to talk to all participants while seeing their works. Sh. Nema Ram from Sumerpur, Pali Rajasthan created a huge Toy Ambassador car carved in cylindrical shaped wood-



en sculpture attached with a metal rod and handle. Inspired by the beauty, history and culture of Udaipur, he painted lakes, parks and arches on the car. The grains of wood made wheels very natural

An "untilled" art piece created by Sh. Harshad Panchal, a self taught sculptor from Ahmadabad, Gujarat, who has been making sculptures for last 13 years, described the thirst of peacock keeping its beak open in search of rain. Two human hands are also shown stretched to hold clouds in the sculpture. "Our nature breaths around the rain" he said. Sh. Alay Mistry from Ahamdabad created family of parrots naming "Funny language of Parrots". He used American Pine wood for his creation. The art work was coloured and grinded so that one can enjoy the grains of wood. He works in multimedia but has created many art works in fibreglass and PVC.

Sh. Hardik Kansara, Post Graduate in Fine Arts from M.S. Univ, ,Baroda, Gujarat carefully selected wooden block and according to grains he created a face of a man giving expressions of Adbhut Ras(astonish).He pierced a small wooden

branch in the ears depicting effect of harsh words. Ms. Priti kahar, Post Graduate in Fine Arts form M.S. Univ, Baroda made a rectangular hole in the wooden block maintaining the texture of wood like a window. A tiny white coloured chair was placed with a painted shadow in back while thick lair coming downwards. Chair represents power. Her concept of this art work depicts that the ego would melt the

College, Ahmadabad created a jumbled water bottle placing a woodpecker on it with an intention to get some drinking water and named his sculpture as "Change in lifestyle". "While coming to Udaipur, I saw a bird drinking water from a plastic cup, so it struck to me that a woodpecker would pierce a water bottle to drink water, hence a wood this creation".

Rudra Thakur from Ahmadabad glorified motherhood in his sculpture of a pregnant lady. He painted toy animals to allure the child ready to come out. The art works created by the artistes were displayed on the closing ceremony at Kala Vihar, Shilpgram, Udaipur which was witnessed by art connoisseurs. Well known painter Prof. Suresh Sharma, while appreciating the works of participants said, 'This is the first workshop exclusively based on wood medium. Their creations will become part of the collection of West Zone Cultural Centre, Udaipur as modern heritage. Director of WZCC, Sh. M. Furgan Khan congratulated Sh. These centres will work to promote breast feeding among nursing mothers and immunization of children's to reduce infant mortality rate. National health mission's additional mission director and director IEC Dr. Neeraj K Pawan was speaking at a programme held in the city on importance of breastfeeding on the occasion of world breast feeding week. He further said that the city of Mewar has set many examples of sacrifice and dedication and the start of Divya mother milk bank is another milestone in this direction.

The function was jointly organized by Save the Children and Divya milk bank's today in the city, speaking as the chief guest Dr Pawan also said that there is around 18 lakhs child born in the State every year, out of which 1 lakh children die before celebrating their 1st birthday. We need to strengthen Navjaat Shishu Suraksha Karyakram. He said department is paying a lot of attention to make health workers sensitive towards the importance of breastfeeding. He said that female counselor Yashoda needs to counsel mothers before discharge and sensitization on family planning also needs to be done at the same time. Praising the efforts of Divva milk bank Dr. Pawan said that 10 mother milk banks will be established in the State and the staff can be trained at Divva milk hank

State programme manager of Save the Children Mr. Sanjay Sharma praised the efforts of mothers who have breastfeed their children and appealed everyone to give continues focus on breast feeding promotion activities throughout the year. He also requested Government of Rajasthan to establish Breast

ment offices and issue an advisory for promoting breast feeding for working mothers. Save the children believes that every child has a right to survival and they should get it at any cost. He said that an enabling environment and facility of counseling needs to be build for working mothers to enhance breastfeeding. Dr. OP Singh Save the Children's State health coordinator, cited that newborn not breastfeeding had higher chances of suffering from diseases. As per the development need of newborn there are changes in mother's milk naturally and this fulfils all the needs of newborn.

The founder of Divya mother's milk bank Yog guru Devendra Agarwal shared that till date 2513 mothers have donated 17000 unit milk which was served to 1482 newborns. He said that his organization aim is to ensure that every child receive mother's milk. He said that government should develop some regulatory guidelines to ensure that breast milk should not be commercialized and make law facilitating donation and storage of breast milk.
