Water from Akodara Dam diverted to Pichola
Udaipur : Water Resources Department finally opened the gate of the main tunnel of Akodara Dam (Dewas-2) and diverted the water towards Pichola. After the completion of Dewas project, it was the first time that the water from Akodara dam had been diverted toward the lakes of Udaipur. Akodara Dam with 60 ft. filler capacity was only half feet empty while opening the gate of the tunnel. Dam remains inward. As soon as the gates are opened, the water moved northward towards Pichola through 11.5 km long tunnel. Late at night the water reached Pichola through Sisarma River and Amarjok River. Awaiting the launch of the project, it was feared that the water may be over flown and go to Gujarat.

: Remembering a Rishi

India is a nation that has always kept knowledge as supreme. Today we might name western philosophers like Foucault or Derrida as ones who talk of the power of knowledge but the history of India has shown that emperors have many a time abandoned their thrones in the pursuit of knowledge. It was well established that knowledge was the basis of ultimate happiness of man. The famous couplet in Sanskrit talks of knowledge as the source of humility which in turn makes people deserving leading to their ability to earn money. The money so earned enables them to practice religion which, the couplet says, is real happiness. The sources of knowledge were the learned and enlightened people who withdrew from the routine life of earning and spending and devoted their lives, time and energy exclusively to the pursuit of knowledge. Such people were Rishis who were treated with utmost respect in the society.

Pdt.Nagar was a Rishi in this sense. Though he did not abandon the worldly affairs altogether, yet he sacrificed the opportunity of his personal growth as a politician and also to some extent his place in the literary world for the sake of empowerment of the people through education. Having had an opportunity to get education in one of the premier institutions of the country namely Banaras Hindu University, he thought it his prime duty to impart education to the people who did not have access to it. Born on 16 June 1911 in the historic city of Udaipur, capital of the erstwhile princely state of Mewar, Pdt. Nagar was very much influenced by his mother Vijayalakshmi (Vijaya Maa) who was a bold, courageous, progressive and fearless lady with revolutionary ideas. She was a freedom fighter who contributed significantly to the rise of the spirit of liberation in the women of Mewar. His father Pdt. Pran Lal Ji occupied an important portfolio in the court of Mewar.

The movement of independence was at its peak. People were courting arrest, were participating in turbulent activities and



building up collective resistance against the colonial rule. It was natural for a young man to be attracted towards such activities. Pdt.Nagar did participate in such activities through his writing, spreading awareness and conveying messages. But more than anything else his heart was into educating the masses and thus enabling them to participate in the national mainstream.

Like an enlightened Rishi he had the capacity to look into future and build up the future of India, through a more sustained activity. Pdt. Nagar had a family to support. His children had to be educated and looked after but he chose to cater to a larger family of his countrymen. Like a Rishi he abandoned these private pleasures and concerns and devoted himself to the public good.

He created a huge pool of knowledge in the form of his poems, short stories and the epic novel Shankaracarya. Patit Ka Swarg, Uda Hatyara, Acarya Chanakya, Vaivasta Manu and Amritam Gamayah are the plays composed by him.He wrote more than two hundred stories.Two Collections of his stories namely Janardan Rai Nagar Ki Kahaniyan , part I and Part II are published by Rajasthan Sahitya Akademi. These stories had been earlier published in the magazines of national repute.His books Shala mein Balak,Ghar Mein Balak and Prathmik-Madhyamik Shiksha Yojana are

precious works containing his novel thoughts about education.'Ek Shant Alok Mein Prasanna' (A collection of prosaic poems) and 'Swapna Ka Sangharsha' (Autobiographical work) are great works of literature.His novel Jagatguru Shankeracarya published in ten parts consisting of five thousand pages and another work RamRajya are immensely useful treasure of Hindi Literature. The genre of prose-songs was his creation.Pdt.Nagar had firm faith in the power of word-the Shabda Brahma. He knew that words have the power to transform. He utilized this power in his writing as well as his speeches.

The main area of interest in his writings was philosophy. Pdt.Nagar was a great scholar of Adwaitwad as enunciated by Shankaracarya.He believed in the enlightenment of the self which he described as Chaitanya.To him the success of an individual's life was in elevating his Chaitanya.The personality of Pdt.Nagar with snow-white khadi apparel and ever bright Countenance had the aura of a Rishi.It is a refreshing experience to recall the memory of such a personality and to think that one had an occasion to spend some time under his brilliant canopy.

A Rishi is passionately devoted to his objectives to an extent that he becomes oblivious of his surroundings. He assumes a stance of trance and single-mindedly concentrates on the objectives he lays down for himself. For attaining these objectives he can sacrifice his personal happiness. Pdt. Nagar decided that he would work for social transformation through education. He went to remote areas of south Rajasthan amidst tribes and started institutions for educating them at a time when there was no transport available. He even went on horse-back to visit such places. Very small villages like Looron Ka Fala and Badrana in Jhadol tehsil were developed as centers of education. Hostels for children whose parents were too poor to provide for them or those children who had lost their parents were opened in villages like Kanpur, Teedi, Sakroda, Bedla, and Nai.A college run in evenings was started to cater to the

working class people. It was not easily accepted by the people in power in the field of higher education. They wondered how higher education could be imparted in an evening college. Amidst such criticism Pdt.Nagar remained unperturbed and undaunted like a Rishi who remains in a state of equanimity in conditions favourable as well as unfavourable.

Pdt.Nagar was a visionary. He knew what shape the institution will take in future. As back as 1948 he had conceived of Rajasthan Vidyapeeth as a university and had started using VishwaVidyapeeth as the nomenclature of the institution. It took another forty years for the institution to attain the status of a university. With its own printing press, agriculture farm, dairy farm, colleges, schools, vigyan mandir, community centers, newspaper, media center, cooperative store, dispensary, cafeteria and mobile library the institution was a commune in itself. This comprehensive vision is not possible in any ordinary individual. This great genius said adieu to this world on 15 August, 1997 in Udaipur at the age of 88years.

Today , there is a deemed to be University in his name. His vision of creating a University after the model of Banaras Hindu University which he had seen from close quarters, has been realized. But much needs to be done to make it a University of National repute. Efforts have been made but the University has not seen a person of his vision and dedication. The recent years, the University has passed through a rough time facing so many internal and external challenges caused by the policy of the state as well as the myopic vision of its administrators. Pdt. Nagar wanted it to be a People's University catering to the poorest of the poor. He had started many projects in his life time which aimed at alleviating the life of the masses but those very projects are either abandoned or have been neglected. Remembering on his death anniversary, one can only hope that his vision and mission will be taken to its logical conclusion by those who bear his legacy.

Need to retain meritorious students and improve research : President

Throughout the nation, 600 institutes participated in the video conference addressed by the Hon'ble president to the students & faculty of institutes of higher learning. In his speech to all the institutes and students, President started with expressing condolence on the sudden demise of Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam, and shared how deeply the world of academia is thankful for his contributions.

One of the key areas of the address was emphasis on research in Indian institutes. It also touched upon the importance of ecosystem of nurturing entrepreneurship in institutes of higher learning and use of information technology infrastructure in disruptive innovations. Talking about rankings of Indian institutes president Mukherjee said "Out of rankings given for BRICS nations, IISC Bangalore has stood 5th position and it's important for universities to take the place in top 200 universities of the world". Research in Indian Universities is not improving which is evident in the number



of researchers per million inhabitants. India has only 160 per million who are taking research as the career option, whereas Brazil has 720 and 364 in South Africa. Addressing this issue he said "The ecosystem for cutting edge research is missing in many universities in India". The research culture at all levels needs to be developed which shall also complement the economy related activities such as Make in India. Partnerships with international institutions for faculty, academic resources and pedagogy

should be established. Incubation centers, collaboration with alumni should be made at all higher level institutes to retain meritorious students within the nation.

The conference also involved Rahul Pandit from IISc Bangalore, Swarnendu Kumar Chakraborty from NIT, Arunachal Pradesh and a research student, Priyanka Dogra from IISER Mohali presenting to the president about the approach and achievements in research both in academia and sciences. The conference concluded with the vote of thanks by Prof. Girish Chandra Tripathi, Vice Chancellor, Banaras Hindu University. Students and faculty from IIM Udaipur have been part of this conference. President Mukherjee hopes to conduct such conferences at least once a month, to lift the education system of India to a global level. Hon'ble President ended this conference by asking the IITs to act as a knowledge partner for other institutions, and utilize their expertise which they have developed over time.

Double storey Floating Marina Houseboat will run in Jaisamand

Udaipur: The operation of Floating Marina houseboat on Jaisamand Lake is being prepared. The tourists will be able to enjoy the serene water and intense mountains by taking a ride of the double storey houseboat. Deputy Director of the Department of Tourism, Sumita Saroch said that in collaboration with Government of India the embodiment houseboat under the scheme meeting in artificial lake bottomless hydrographic, the tourists will witness the scenic view of the largest artificial lake. District Collector Rohit Gupta has taken steps to ensure innovative eas are initiated in this regard.

HZL to treat 100% house-hold sewage of Udaipur

Udaipur : Hindustan Zinc has come forward to make Udaipur a Smart City with Sewerage Treatment Plant. Under this project, city's 100 per cent domestic sewerage's treatment is planned. Between the State Government for approval zinc management is being pursued. Soon will be the final decision.

Hindustan Zinc Head-Corporate Communication Pawan Kaushik said with the government before the private-public partnership with a capacity of 20 million tons per day sewage treatment plant was installed, of which 30 per cent of Udaipur is sewage treatment.

The project is to cost Rs 170 crore. Udaipur is a daily 70 million tonnes of sewage. Clean India campaign under the new plan will increase the zinc plant's current management and will install a new plant in the future.

From gardens to sewerage, 285 million in funding will be provided

Udaipur: In the next five years, the city will see a network of sewerage, to develop the city transport, drinking water arrangements to strengthen the funds will drop 285 crore. RUIDP Phase 3 of the project Rs 120 crore and Rs 165 crore, a massive amount of nectar plan to be phased development.

RUIDP Phase 3 is approved by the state government on the plan nectar churned for two days running in Jaipur to Udaipur under the approved budget of 165 crores. Home Minister Gulab Chand Kataria said that, in RUIDP Phase 1, Sewagram bridge was made. In the second phase, the road in front of MB hospital was formed. In the third phase, city's effluent from the sewerage will be carried out through lines built on large-scale.

Not only this, a new sewerage line will be laid in Ayad River and all the sewers from homes will be released there. On the other hand, the Indian government plans to close 165 crore Amrut Yojana meet in five years. This amount will be properly planned development. Which way would spend this amount is also decided by the central government. The large amount of Rs 100 crore will be the cost for sewerage system.

Expenditure on Amrit Yojana
Sewerage: Amrita Yojana has allocated Rs 100 crore. The city's sewerage system will be developed in the areas of new habitation. Potable Drinking Water: Drinking water supplied from house to house, a great amount of work will be done

here. The new areas will be created in the water pipeline and tank. Where water tanks are needed, it would be complete. Currently over 115 liters per day water supply is a connection. 135 liters per connection met with better management, will be managing it. City Transport: For better city transport system a budget of 25 million has been fixed. The city will work to introduce better transport facilities. Sidewalks, bike path will be built. Over-bridge and under-bridge are also being made under the budget.Parks: To transform the parks to make them beautiful, a budget of 5 crores has been fixed. In this project, the city's protected parks will be made greener and children's recreational facilities will be provided to modernize them.

The bicycles with GPS feature begin from September in Lake City

Udaipur. Tourists from September onwards will be able to rent bicycles, which also will show them the way. GPS will guide them. The expenditure of these bicycles is Rs 55,000, for which the tourists will be charged Rs 10 per hour. Under the self-government to the promotion of non-motor transport vehicle department will start. In the first phase, 2,000 bicycles will be available four cities including Udaipur. These bicycles will be made available in Udaipur's bus stands, railway stations, large parks, scenic spots, squares and main markets. The bicycle could be taken from any stand and deposited at any stand. The government has given this task to a bicycle company. RTO Dr. ML Rawat points out that it's an important step towards promoting non-motor transport vehicles. With this, not only the tourists, but residents will also get a chance to go on the attractive bicycle ride. Apart from environment, it would be important in terms of health as well. Under this plan, Udaipur, Jaipur, Kota and Ajmer have been included.
