Injectable polio vaccine campaign from Oct-Nov

Jaipur: Health minister Rajendra Rathore on Saturday announced a campaign for inactivated polio vaccine (IPV), an injectable vaccine, to be administered to children up to one year of age in Rajasthan from October-November. The vaccines from the Central government are expected to arrive by September end. Rathore was in Delhi to attend the two-day Call to Action Summit 2015: Ending Preventable Child and M at e r n a I D e at h s. H e a I t h ministers from 24 countries, state health ministers from India, international academic experts, health practitioners and global leaders from diverse sectors attended this leadership summit. He said the shift from oral polio vaccine (OPV) to IPV is part of the World Health Organisation's polioeradication strategy. Compared to the three doses of OPV required earlier, a single dose of IPV would now be required.

PM back down on land bill in Man ki Ba

New Delhi: Prime Minister Narendra Modi said on Sunday he was ditching the executive order aimed at making it easier for business to buy land, in a major setback for his reformist government. The PM, in his radio address to the nation, stopped short of directly naming the opposition but rued the 'misinformation' that spooked farmers

NDA's land ordinance,

which did away with a crucial consent clause that gave farmers the veto power on any land transfer, was opposed by farmers' collectives and opposition parties with protests also hitting work in Parliament.

"We are ready to amend land acquisition act to benefit farmers, who were subjected to misinformation leading to a lot of apprehension in their minds on the law. I have decid-

ed that the land ordinance be allowed to lapse. But 13 pointers that will benefit the farmers will be issued," Modi said in the 11th edition of his radio address Mann Ki Baat.

The government has had to issue the temporary executive orders three times since announcing the land bill in December after failing to push it through the chamber to make it permanent.


