Bhamashah Yojana: Endeavor to Bring about Prosperity of People

Jaipur : In yet another endeavor to bring about prosperity of the people of the state, the present government has re-introduced Bhamashah Yojana. The ambitious scheme aims to ensure empowerment of women, financial inclusion and direct transfer of financial and non-financial benefits of government schemes to the beneficiaries in a transparent manner. The objective is to ensure reach of benefits to the beneficiaries.

There is a common misconception that the Bhamashah scheme is available only for BPL families, BPL women or for some specific category. However, it should be clearly understood that all the families of the state are eligible for Bhamashah cards and must enroll for the same to avail the benefits of the scheme. The delivery & distribution of pension, scholarships and ration has already been linked with Bhamashah and has been commenced to mark the beginning of the scheme. It is an ambitious scheme to ensure the easy and transparent delivery of benefits of different departments to the beneficiaries.

After the enrolment of the families and in between the process of verification and preparing bhamashah family card, data of bhamashah scheme is matched and cross checked with the data of the important



departments associated with the pension, scholarship and ration cards in order to bring about uniformity in the statistics. It will help ensure the delivery of cash or non cash benefits in a transparent way to those who are eligible for pension, scholarship and ration.

Under the Bhamashah Yojana, thousands of families are getting enrolled at the e-mitra centres across the state. Out of one crore 35 lakh families of the state, 2 crore 95 lakh families have already been enrolled under the Bhamashah Yojana so far. Process of issuing multi-pur-

pose bhamashah family identity cards to them is on. Free enrolment of families is being done till 31st December 2015 under the scheme. The State Government had organised camps at gram panchayat and urban areas for the enrolment of families under the scheme while at present the facility is available at Atal Seva Kendra and E-mitra centers permanently.

All the family members can get their enrolment done after due process. Facility of opening a bank account is also available at these e-mitra centres if the family is not having core banking account. Online enrolment facility is also available through the website of e-mitra center or Bhamashah yojana www.bhamashah.rajabasthan.gov.in

Bhamashah family card is issued in the name of the woman head of these families. Any member of the family can have his personal card by paying a fee of Rs. 30. The government provides an incentive of Rs. 2000 which is given to the lady of BPL family for getting the bhamashah card and this is deposited in the account of woman head of the family. The data collected under the Bhamashah scheme would be used as a single source for all government departments.

Rajasthan Crafts Council Constituted

Jaipur : The State Government has constituted the Rajasthan Crafts Council to consult, deliberate and give directions in respect of policy initiatives required for development of crafts in the state as well as identifying thrust sectors for focus development and key interventions required.

The CM Rajeev will be the Chairperson and Minister Industries the Vice Chairperson of the craft council. The members of the council include the Chief Secretary, Mr. Mira Mehrishi, Mrs. Jaya Jetley, Mrs. Rathi Vinay Jha, Mrs.

Laila Tyabji, Mr. Mitchel Abdul Karim Crites, Ms. Bibi Russel, Mrs. Anjali Singh, Mr. Varun Seth, Mrs. Neelam Chibber/Mr. Jacob Mathew, Mr. Vipin Sharma and Mr. Alon Molay. The other members of the council are Mr. William Bissel, Mr. Yash Agarwal, Mr. Mehul Gupta, Mr. Vibhu Arya, Mr. Arvind Singh, Mr. Arvind Ojha, Principal Secretary, SSI & KVI, Principal Secretary Tourism, Principal Secretary Finance, Managing Director RSLDC. The Commissioner Industries has been made the Member Secretary of the council.

The Rajasthan Crafts Council will advise the State Government in areas of design, innovations, product & skill development, quality control and branding, credit access, market access, cluster development. The council will have an executive committee. In addition, the Chairperson may constitute working groups, sub-groups as may be considered necessary and also co-opt members for specific inputs. The Office of Commissioner Industries will serve as the Secretariat of the Rajasthan Crafts Council.

Rajiv Mehrishi appointed as HS

Jaipur : The Prime Minister has approved the appointment of Rajasthan Cadre IAS Shri Rajiv Mehrishi, Secretary, Department of Economic Affairs, Ministry of Finance as Home Secretary, Ministry of Home Affairs for a period of two years with effect from 31.08.2015. He succeeds Shri L.C. Goyal. Shri Rajiv Mehrishi took over as Home Secretary, today.

Shri Mehrishi succeeds Shri L.C. Goyal, IAS (KL:79) who voluntarily retired from service.

Cabinet gives approval to the bill for repealing of incoherent & redundant laws

Jaipur : Various important decisions were taken in the State Cabinet meeting held at Chief Minister's office on Thursday including approval to the Rajasthan Laws Repealing Bill, 2015, proposed amendment in the RTE Act, 2009 and e-Governance and IT/ITeS Policy 2015. The meeting was presided over by Chief Minister Smt. Vasundhara Rajee.

Talking to media persons after the cabinet meet, Parliamentary Affairs Minister Shri Rajendra Rathore said the state government had undertaken a comprehensive review of laws with a view to remove incoherent and redundant laws and a committee had been constituted to review such laws. The committee, after consultation with all administrative departments had identified 60 Principal Acts and 187 Amending Acts which are no longer needed. To repeal such obsolete Acts, the draft of 'Rajasthan Laws Repealing Bill, 2015' was given

approval by the state cabinet on Thursday. The Bill will be tabled in the next session of the State Assembly.

Shri Rathore said the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education (Rajasthan Amendment) Bill, 2015 was also given approval by the cabinet. He said amendment in section 8, section 16, section 21, section 24 and 29 of RTE Act, 2009 has been proposed in this Bill. The amendments will ensure achievements of class appropriate learning level by every child of the age 6-14 years. Provision has been made in the amendment bill that if a child has not achieved appropriate level in a class, the child may be held back in that class, provision has also been made to ensure that teachers perform their duties. The amendment in section 21(2) of the RTE Act, 2009 will enable School Management Committees to monitor teachers if they are performing their duties well or not.

The Parliamentary Affairs Minister informed that to achieve the target of e-Governance and make Rajasthan the best IT destination and IT hub, the 'Rajasthan e-Governance and IT/ITeS Policy-2015' was given approval by the Cabinet. He said the objectives of the IT Policy - 2015 is to establish 7 smart cities in Rajasthan by 2020, to provide employment to 5 lakh people in IT sector by 2025, positioning Rajasthan as best IT Investment Destination, positioning and branding Jaipur as IT and ITeS Hub in North-West India, to increase the current investment in IT/ITes sector by 10 times, to increase the IT turnover to Rs. 50,000 crore and to increase IT exports from Rajasthan to Rs. 5000 crores. Besides this the policy aims to make to individuals (at least one female) in every household e-literate, establishing complete participatory & transparent open governance along with citizen centric IT

and e-Governance for the people of Rajasthan. Shri Rathore informed that under the IT Policy-2015 provisions have been made to provide benefits of investment subsidy and employment generation subsidy.

The Manufacturing Enterprises investing up to Rs. 5 crores, Rs. 5 crores to Rs. 25 crores and more than Rs. 25 crores will be given 30%, 60% and 70% investment subsidy respectively in VAT and CST deposited for 7 years. He said Manufacturing Enterprises investing up to Rs. 5 crores, from Rs. 5 crores to Rs. 25 crores and more than Rs. 25 crores to be given employment generation subsidy of 20%, 10% and 10% respectively in VAT and CST deposited for 7 years. The Enterprises shall be given 50-50 percent exemption from payment of Electricity Duty and Land Tax for 7 years.

ing section 60 of Rajasthan Police Act, 2007 provision shall be made as any person found drunk or incapable of taking care of himself or causes obstruction, inconvenience, danger or damage to people on road or any open place and public place shall be liable to a fine of Rs. 500 for the first time, fine of Rs. 5000 for the subsequent two offences and fine of Rs. 10,000 for every subsequent offence after the conviction of third offence. Provision of imprisonment of not exceeding 8 days has also been made. Currently the Rajasthan Police Act, 2007 provides fine of Rs. 50 along with imprisonment of not exceeding 8 days to such person found drunk or riotous or who is incapable of taking care of himself.

The state cabinet also decided to review the abolition of posts of lecturer and senior teacher in Urdu subject and revive the posts according to the requirements if needed.
