Keeping this in mind, the Municipal Corporation has printed two million papers of multiple choice questions. The public will tick on the option they think they want. In the first phase of the scheme, 150 counters in 55 wards were put up on 27th September. Peasants of forty villages demand total ban on Sand Mining & compensation for the damage to crops due to failure of monsoon in Meval region

Demand for total ban on Sand Mining & compensation for the damage to crops

Avara (Bambora), Udaipur. Peasants of forty villages out of about one hundred villages in Meval region met on last Sunday and resolved to stop sand mining in the region. They had collected for a meeting in the Primary School Avara, at the call of Lokmanch, an organization of peasants of the region. President of Lokmanch Kuber Singh Shaktawat, addressing the meeting of about three hundred peasants stated that the indiscriminate sand mining had destroyed the rivers in the region and as a result the water level of the wells



has gone down, the big Mango and Mahua trees had dried up and the villagers were forced to migrate in search of livelihood.

Criticizing the role of the elected representatives like MLA, MP, Pradhan etc. he said that they are not concerned with the problem. On the contrary some of them have themselves been involved in sand mining.

Advocate Manna Ram Dangi, activist and leader of the peasants of Meval region told that Meval region is spread in 1800 square kilometers, which is the catchment area of world famous Jaisamand lake. This region has four rivers and about ninety nine small streams. These rivers and streams fill the Jaisamand lake. He stated that till 1980 the rivers and streams were full of sand and the water level of the wells in the region was about 20-30 feet. Since the year 1980 sand mining started. In 1990, the government of Rajasthan started giving contracts for sand mining on royalty basis. This continued till 31st March, 2014. In these twenty five years about 90kms of river bed in a width of average 200 meter and depth of 10-20 feet was excavated by large scale indiscriminate sand mining. This resulted in a steep fall in the ground water level and drying up of vegetation including big trees of Mango and Mahua. Advocate Manna Ram Dangi said that this has disturbed the ecological balance as well as harmed



the biodiversity in the region.

To stop further degradation of environment a PIL was filed in the High Court of Rajasthan. This Civil Writ Petition 11428/2012 was admitted by the honourable court and on 11-4-2014 the court ordered the Government of Rajasthan, the Mining Department and the collector of Udaipur to stop illegal sand mining in the Meval region effectively. But the court order was not implemented effectively and the illegal mining continued with the involvement of the local police and administrative officials. It was heard among the peasants collected for the meeting, that the police took bribe up to Rs 8000 per truck. The sources who did not want their names to be disclosed, blamed the local Sarpanchs also of their involvement in sand mining. Looking at the failure of the state government to curb sand mining, the people approached National Green Tribunal (NGT) and filed a PIL against the Government of India and the Government of Rajasthan Vide Application number 140/2014. Noted lawyer and environmentalist Advocate M.C. Mehta is pleading this case at NGT. After obtaining the report of the court commissioner twice in December 2014 and April 2015 and listening to the reply of the government, NGT was convinced that sand mining in Meval region was disastrous and therefore issued two orders on 4-3-2015 and 7-4-2015 respectively to the state government to impose complete ban on sand mining in Meval region. NGT has fixed personal liability of the Secretary, Mining Department, Collector of Udaipur and SP of Udaipur to ensure that sand mining is

effectively stopped in the region. The government of Rajasthan imposed an official ban on sand mining in October 2013 which continued till 31st March, 2015. The Government of Rajasthan removed the ban with effect from April 1, 2015. Due to the order of National Green Tribunal dated 4-3-2015 and 7-4-2015 presently the sand mining is banned. The farmers expressed alarm that the government of Rajasthan has filed an application to remove the ban imposed by NGT. They decided unanimously to oppose this move of the state government. Next hearing of the PIL is scheduled on 7th Oct. 2015.

It is worth noting that the lobby of influential and rich people is with the sand miners. They are very powerful politically. They had mechanized the entire process by using bulldozers, dumpers and heavy worth moving machines. By the order of the NGT about fifty units of filtering the sand were dismantled. The meeting was addressed by Kheta Ram, secretary of Lokmanch, Devi Lal, Sarpanch, Gram Panchayat Utharda, Former Executive Engineer Jawahar Lal, Bheru Lal, Sarpanch Idana, Gautam, Devi Lal, Retired senior engineer, Irrigation department, Mohan Lal Joshi, Comrade L N Mishra, Sohan Lal Regar, Prof. Hemendra Chandalia and many peasants of the region. The meeting passed a resolution that due to complete failure of crops, the government of Rajasthan must give compensation to the farmers. The activist Advocate Manna Ram Dangi read out the seven point demands of the farmers which were supported by all the farmers by raising their hands.



Maharana Pratap's statue unveiled at Railway Station

Udaipur : Home Minister Gulab Chand Kataria unveiled the life-sized statue of Maharana Pratap at the Rana Pratap Railway Station on 26th September in a grand ceremony.

In his address he said that development fund of Rs. 1300 Cr allotted by RUIDP, Smart City, AMRUT Scheme and Hindustan Zinc, that will be utilized for development of Ayad River, establishment of Maharana Pratap Gaurav Kendra, filming of documentary on Pratap and other useful propositions.

Talking about the railway budget, Kataria said that soon second entry will be opened at the City Railway Station with the help of Nagar Nigam and MLA's Rs. 1.60 Cr fund. For gauge conversion between the Udaipur-Ahmedabad Rs. 300 Cr allotted Mayor Chandra Singh Kothari during the event



said that on Sunday, suggestion forms for Smart City mission will be filled with general public's opinions on 12 various parameters and sent across to the government.

The event was presided over by Himmat Singh Barhath, Pramod Samar, Manohar Chaudhary, Hansa Mali, Dinesh Kothari and other delegates and officials.

Railway stations to provide more facilities to disabled: Sinha

Udaipur : Union Railway Minister Manoj Sinha said that there is a 50 percent discount for train travel for the disabled. But the ministry will consider afurther concession. The large campus on Sunday, Narayan SevaSansthan 251 children and adolescents former polio-free operation of the ten-day camp was speaking as the chief guest at the opening ceremony. The ministry, including railway stations Narayan SevaSansthan NGOs will also consider the responsibility of the various service functions. In the beginning, sansthan's founder Padmashree Kailash Manav welcomed the railway

minister and urged that Udaipur Railway Station along with all of country's railway stations, must have kiosks to assist the disabled. He thanked the Indian Government for choosing Udaipur as a Smart City.

MP Arjun Lal Meena said that Narayan SevaSansthan has worked a great deal in the tribal areas, not just disabled but also the poor and elderly destitute. He thanked the state's Railway Minister for allocating a budget of Rs 350 crore this year for Udaipur-Ahmedabad broad gauge. Because of this, Udaipur will connect to South Indian and set new dimensions.
