Eid al-Adha: Feast of Sacrifice

Eid al-Adha also called the Feast of Sacrifice the Greater Eid, as an act of submission to God's command, before God then intervened, through his angel Jibra'il and informs him that his sacrifice has already been accepted. The meat from the sacrificed animal is preferred to be divided into three parts. The family retains one third of the share; another third is given to relatives, friends and neighbors; and the remaining third is given to the poor and needy.

In the lunar-based Islamic calendar, Eid al-Adha falls on the 10th day of Dhu al-Hijjah and lasts for four days. In the international (Gregorian) calendar, the dates vary from year to year, drifting approximately 11 days earlier each year.

Eid al-Adha is the latter of the two Eid holidays, the former being Eid al-Fitr. The basis for the observance comes from the 196thayah (verse) of Al-Baqara, the second sura of the Quran. The word "Eid" appears once in Al-Ma'ida, the fifth sura of the Quran, with the meaning "solemn festival". Like Eid al-Fitr, Eid al-Adha begins with a Sunnah prayer of two rakats followed by a sermon (khutbah). Eid al-Adha celebrations start after the descent of the Hujaj, the pilgrims performing the Hajj, from Mount Arafat, a hill east of Mecca. Eid sacrifice may take place until sunset on the 13th day of Dhu al-Hijjah. The days of Eid have been singled out in the Hadith as "days of remembrance". The takbir (days) of Tashriq are from the Fajr prayer of the 9th of Dhu al-Hijjah up to the Asr prayer of the 13th of Dhu al-Hijjah (5 days and 4 nights). This equals 23 prayers: 5 on the 9th-12th, which equals 20, and 3 on the 13th.

According to Islamic tradition, the valley of Mecca (in present-day Saudi Arabia) was a dry, rocky and uninhabited place. God instructed Abraham to bring Hagar (Hajar), his

Arabian (Adnan) wife, and Ishmael to the Arabia from the land of Canaan.

As Abraham was preparing for his return journey back to Canaan, Hagar asked him, "Did God order you to leave us here? Or are you leaving us here to die." Abraham didn't even look back. He just nodded, afraid that he would be too sad and that he would disobey God. Hagar said, "Then God will not waste us; you can go". Though Abraham had left a large quantity of food and water with Hagar and Ishmael, the supplies quickly ran out, and within a few days the two began to feel the pangs of hunger and dehydration.

Hagar ran up and down between two hills called Al-Safa and Al-Marwah seven times, in her desperate quest for water. Exhausted, she finally collapsed beside her baby Ishmael and prayed to God for deliverance. Miraculously, a spring of water gushed forth from the earth at the feet of baby Ishmael. Other accounts have the angel Gabriel (Jibrail) striking the earth and causing the spring to flow in abundance. With this secure water supply, known as the Zamzam Well, they were not only able to provide for their own needs, but were also able to trade water with passing nomads for food and supplies.

Years later, Abraham was instructed by God to return from Canaan to build a place of worship adjacent to Hagar's well (the Zamzam Well). Abraham and Ishmael constructed a stone and mortar structure – known as the Kaaba – which was to be the gathering place for all who wished to strengthen their faith in God. As the years passed, Ishmael was blessed with prophethood (Nubuwwah) and gave the nomads of the desert his message of submission to God. After many centuries, Mecca became a thriving desert city and a major center for trade, thanks to its reliable water source, the well of Zamzam.

One of the main trials of Abraham's



life was to face the command of God to sacrifice his dearest possession, his son. The son is not named in the Quran, but most modern Muslims believe it to be Ishmael. (The son's name, however, is named in the Torah as "Isaac," which is the name "Yitzhak" in Hebrew. Isaac was the son of Sara, Abraham's first, and only, wife. Hagar was his handmaiden and Ishmael, know in Hebrew and the Torah as "Ishmael," was the son of his relationship with Hagar.) Upon hearing this command, Abraham prepared to submit to God's will. During this preparation, Satan (Shaitan) tempted Abraham and his family by trying to dissuade them from carrying out God's commandment, and Abraham drove Satan away by throwing pebbles at him. In commemoration of their rejection of Satan, stones are thrown at symbolic pillars signifying Satan during the Hajj rites.

When Abraham was 99, God decided to test his faith in public. Abraham had a recurring dream, in which God commanded him to offer up for sacrifice – his son, whom God had granted him after many years of deep prayer. Abraham knew that the dreams of the prophets were divinely inspired, and one of the ways in which God communicated with his prophets. When the intent of the dreams became clear to him, Abraham decided to fulfill God's command and offer his son for sacrifice.

Although Abraham was ready to sacrifice his dearest for God's sake, he could not just bring his son to the place of sacrifice without his consent. His son had to be consulted

When is it performed

The Eid al-Adha prayer is performed any time after the sun completely rises up to just before the entering of Zuhr time, on the 10th of Dhu al-Hijjah. In the event of a force majeure (e.g. natural disaster), the prayer may be delayed to the 11th of Dhu al-Hijjah and then to the 12th of Dhu al-Hijjah.

What do people do?

Id-ul-Zuha is a festival that is celebrated with traditional fervor and gaiety in India and the world. Many Muslims wear new clothes and attend an open-air prayer meeting during Id-ul-Zuha.

as to whether he was willing to give up his life in fulfillment of God's command. This consultation would be a major test of his son's maturity in faith; love and commitment for God; willingness to obey his father; and readiness to sacrifice his own life for the sake of God. Abraham presented the matter to his son and asked for his opinion about the dreams of slaughtering him. His child did not show any hesitation or reservation even for a moment. He said, "Father, do what you have been commanded. You will find me, Insha'Allah (God willing), to be very patient." His mature response, his deep insight into the nature of his father's dreams, his commitment to God, and ultimately his willingness to sacrifice his own life for the sake of God were all unprecedented.

When Abraham attempted to cut his throat, he was astonished to see that his son was unharmed and instead, he found a dead ram which was slaughtered. Abraham had passed the test by his willingness to carry out God's command. This is mentioned in the Quran as follows: 100 "O my Lord! Grant me a righteous (son)!"

101 So we gave him the good news of a boy ready to suffer and forbear.

102 Then, when (the son) reached (the age of) (serious) work with him, he said: "O my son! I see in vision that I offer thee in sacrifice: Now see what thy view is!" (The son) said: "O my father! Do as thou

art commanded: thou wilt find me, if Allah so wills one practicing Patience and Constancy!"

103 So when they had both submitted their wills (to Allah), and he had laid him prostrate on his forehead (for sacrifice),

104 We called out to him "O Abraham!

105 "Thou hast already fulfilled the vision!" – Thus indeed do we reward those who do right?

106 For this was obviously a trial–

107 And We ransomed him with a momentous sacrifice:

108 And We left (this blessing) for him among generations (to come) in later times:

109 "Peace and salutation to Abraham!"

110 Thus indeed do we reward those who do right.

111 For he was one of our believing Servants.

112 And we gave him the good news of Isaac – a prophet – one of the Righteous.

— Quran, sura 37 (As-Saaffat), ayat 100–112

Abraham had shown that his love for God superseded all others: that he would lay down his own life or the lives of those dearest to him in submission to God's command. Muslims commemorate this ultimate act of sacrifice every year during Eid al-Adha. While Abraham was prepared to make an ultimate sacrifice, G-d ultimately prevents the sacrifice, additionally signifying that one should never sacrifice a human life, especially not in the name of G-d.

Candle Making by Tribal Women of Zawar with the help of Sakhi

Udaipur : 1000 candles already sold – Rotary Mewar orders 500 candles worth Rs. 1.50 lakhs Udaipur. Tribals are always been known for their culture and traditional that is why HZL has adopt a route of mutual craft exchange through making of perfumed candles by tribal women of Zawar, about 45 km from Udaipur. The candle making workshop has been organized by Hindustan Zinc under their rural and tribal-empowerment Project "Sakhi".

From slicing of raw wax into small pieces, boiling them at a desired temperature using induction stove, using colours and perfumes as per the shape and size of the candles and finally placing the wick (candle thread) and putting the hot wax into mould, everything has been done by these tribal women.

These tribal women came up with the idea of putting Turmeric and curry leaves for

the natural colours in the candles. They are learning and side-by-side making the final marketable candles. The project had it initially hic-ups as gathering these women, who live at distance, without proper transportation facility, was a challenge. "It was initially difficult to gather about 18 tribal women, who showed interest and participated in the candle making workshop, as their houses were located at a distance with problem of transportation", said Shikha Bomb who is conducting Candle Making Workshop. To help these women commute to the Sakhi Training Centre at Zawar, Hindustan Zinc arranged for vehicles for their pick-up and drop, that solved their problem, said Shikha.

The candles made by these rural and tribal women is receiving a good response. 1000 candles have already been booked with pre-orders and is expected to getting better close to

Diwali. "We initially made about 500 candles and they have already been booked. Now these women have already received confirmed order worth Rs. 1.50 lakhs from Rotary Mewar for purchasing 500 candles", informed Pavan Kaushik, Hansraj Choudhary, Chairman Rotary Mewar Service Trust, who was the first one to place the order of 500 candles says, " Rotary has always been supporting such initiatives

Sugna says "we are all enjoying and learning candle making and this is something new and exciting. We would be making candles for our homes also. The project also has provision of honorarium for all of us and this is a double bonanza. It is earning through learning." The company has a strong focus towards empowerment of rural and tribal women in Rajasthan particularly in the districts where it has its business operations.

Singhvi & others sent to jail, next hearing on 29th

Udaipur: An Anti Corruption Bureau (ACB) court on Saturday refused bail to Ashok Singhvi, the suspended principal secretary of the state mining department. Singhvi's lawyer had filed a plea for his bail in the court on Thursday.

Singhvi was arrested by the ACB sleuths from Udaipur on September 17 in the `2.5 crore bribery scam. Public prosecutor Om Prakash Mehta said that the court, after going through the case diary court and verifying the facts, turned down the bail plea of Singhvi. The court called the case "sensitive". Singhvi and four others are in judicial custody till September 29 in connection with the 2.5 crore bribery scam in the mining department. The court has fixed September 29 as the next date of hearing in the case.
