Socio economic philosophy Economic Democracy

Economic Democracy is a socioeconomic philosophy that suggests transfer of decision-making authority form a small minority of public stakeholders.

While there is no single definition or approach, all theories and real-world examples of Economic Democracy are based on a core set of fundamental assumptions. Overall, Economic Democracy promotes universal access to common resources that are typically privatized by corporate capitalism and centralized by state socialism. Supporting agendas include democratic cooperatives, fair trade, social credit, and the regionalization of food production and currency.



Deficiency of effective demand

According to many analysts, deficiency of effective demand is the most fundamental economic problem. That is, modern society does not earn enough income to purchase its output. Supply and demand are generally accepted as market functions for establishing prices. Organizations typically endeavor to 1) minimize the cost of production; 2) increase sales; in order to 3) maximize profits.

Economic Democracy as part of an Inclusive Democracy

Economic Democracy is described as an integral component of an inclusive democracy, in Takis Fotopoulos' Towards An Inclusive Democracy as a stateless, moneyless and market less economy that precludes private accumulation of wealth and the institutionalization of privileges for some sections of society, without relying on a mythical post-scarcity state of abundance or sacrificing freedom of choice.

Savings, investment and unemployment

In his 1879 book Progress and Poverty, Henry George argued that a majority of wealth created in a "free market" economy was appropriated by land owners and monopolists through economic rents, and that concentration of such unearned wealth was the root cause of poverty. If private savings are loaned out to entrepreneurs who use them to buy raw materials and hire workers, then aggregate demand is not reduced.

Reform agendas

Assuming the most basic requirement for social prosperity is a healthy, educated, and enterprising population; Economic Democracy seeks to close the gap between purchasing power and productive output. While reform agendas tend to critique the existing system and recommend corrective measures, they do not necessarily suggest alternative models to replace the fundamental structures of capitalism; private ownership of productive resources, the market, and wage labor.

The Market

Enterprises interact with one another and with consumers in an environment largely free of governmental price controls. Raw materials, instruments of production and consumer goods are all bought and sold at prices largely determined by the forces of supply and demand.
