Home guards urge Modi, Raje for Demands

Udaipur: Hundreds of Rathore added. annoyed home guards in Udaipur on Wednesday sought per mission from the Prime Minister, President and chief minister to commit suicide over their irregular job status.

JS Rathore, the state president of Rajasthan Home Guard Employees Union said, following their demands to regularise their services, hundreds of them have written letters with their blood to the President, Prime Minister and chief minister. Besides writing letters, the home guards have did not consider their demands then they should be given permission to commit suicide.

Rathore further said that the

home guards are only deployed during emergency situations like law and order, election and natural calamities but never appointed as permanent employees. Moreover, the Human Rights Commission had earlier favoured an order that they be appointed as permanent employees and given salaries equivalent to police. Rathore said that their protest, which they call as Rakt Kranti Camp, is a statewide campaign which started on September 1 at Jaipur and till districts of the state.

There are over 31,000 home guard jawans in the state

and the department deducts a certain amount from their wages in the name of welfare fund, but it is neither given to them nor spent on their families at the time of emergency. Infact the amount is either used for retirement party of their officers or for the maintenance of their office, the home guard jawans have claimed.

The jawans also said that the CM during her Swaraj Sankalp Yatra had mentioned on page number 50 of her declaration letter that the home guards would given regular other points. But no major decision has been taken on either of the points, they lamented.

Declare both Meena and Mina as same

at the grounds on Shipra Path

Jaipur: The Rajasthan government should immediately send a letter to the Centre stating that 'Mina' and 'Meena' are the same surname of a community, along with the affidavit submitted in the high court, Lalsot legislator Kirori Lal Meena said on Friday.

The National People's Party legislator warned the government if no action is taken on the demands, then he would move towards Jaipur from Dausa with 50,000 people on October 10. In support to the demands, a mahapanchayat will be organised in Karauli on November 1, he added.

The Rajasthan high court had issued a notice to the BJP government last year, seeking a clarification on reservation being given to people with Meena and Mina surnames after the Centre had informed that only Meenas belonged to the ST category.

At the Meena Aakrosh Rally

in Mansarovar, the Meena leader also demanded the Vasundhara Raie- led BJP government to withdraw the circulars issued by the social justice and empowerment department, dated Sept 30 and December 23, 2014, which banned the change of Meena sur name to Mina. The two orders had led to non-issuance of Scheduled Tribe certificates to those having Meena as their

The Union tribal ministry has been asking the state to clarify the controversy over 'Mina' and 'Meena' surnames. The state government, therefore, should immediately send stating both are same and

they get the SC/ST reservation included in the Ninth Schedule of the constitution, . His other demands include forming an effective Lokayukt

to end corruption, implement-

ing a ban on liquor and stopping ST caste certificates to Dhanak, Dhankia, Dhanuk and Dhanka castes. In his speech, Meena asked the state government to send its representative to take his memorandum and warned if no one comes then, he would stage a sit-in till the representative arrived. "I got a message from the police that health minister Rajendra Rathore is at the Shipra Path police station to take the memorandum and I want him to come and take it at the meeting," he said.

"If the minister is not coming, then I will submit the memorandum to Prime Minister Narendra Modi as he is my good

friend and he (Modi) will reprimand the state government...," he claimed.

Meanwhile, there was heavy police presence to control the large gathering in Mansarovar.
