The villagers informed that last year the husband of the victim woman was also targeted by the bear and rushed to the hospital.

'HealthRise India' to raise awareness of Diabetes in Udaipur

Udaipur : The Catholic Health Association of India (CHAI) and the Health Institute for Mother and Child (MAMTA) will organize a three-year long community health project in Udaipur, Rajasthan as well as in Shimla, Himachal Pradesh. The program hopes to improve diagnosis and management of diabetes and heart disease. Reportedly, a high number of people in Udaipur are suffering from high blood pressure or diabetes may not have been diagnosed due to low awareness levels. Health workers face a shortage of essential equipment such as blood pressure cuffs and glucometers. These NGOs have been selected by Medtronic Philanthropy to implement this project named 'Health Rise India'. The focus will be on people who either cannot afford care or physically access treatment. Medtronic Philanthropy is funding the \$1 million project.

'Bihar election has shown that divisive politics has no place'

Ajmer : For mer Jammu and Kashmir chief minister Farooq Abdullah took a jibe at Prime Minister Modi's statement "My India is that of Imran Khan from Alwar" during his speech at Wembley stadium in London on Friday and said, "PM should have made such a statement on Indian soil instead of making it in London." "I will personally meet PM Modi to ask him to make such a statement here in the country so that his party men, who habitually make inflammatory speeches to disturb communal harmony in the country get a message," Abdullah added. The Bihar election results had proven that communalism or divisive politics have no room in Indian society, said Abdullah, adding that the days for negative politics are over and that the people of Bihar had shown the door to parties that made an attempt to grab power by dividing people on caste-list or religious lines. He was in Ajmer on Sunday to pay his respect at Dargah of Khawaja Moynuddin Hassan Chisty. The former J&K chief minister offered floral tributes at Sufi saint's mazar and prayed for peace and harmony in the country informed the dargah priest who performed rituals inside the tomb. Speaking on the beef controversy, Abdullah said, "We should not do anything that hurts harmony in the society."

Dowry Case Filed in Woman's Death

Barmer: Police filed a case of dowry death on Friday after a woman was found dead under suspicious circumstances in the house of her in-laws at Dhundada village in Barmer district. Gyan Singh Inda, SHO, Mandali police station, said Narayanram Bheel, the brother of victim Shanti Devi, in his case of dowry killing against her in-laws, alleged that they harassed hers.

295 MoUs worth Rs 3.21 lakh crores revitalise Rajasthan

- 9 MoUs in energy sector worth Rs 190,000 crores
- 122 MoUs in tourism sector worth Rs 5783 crores
- 40 MoUs in manufacturing sector worth Rs 11760 crores

Jaipur : The Resurgent Rajasthan Partnership Summit 2015, the two-day global investment meet organised by the Government of Rajasthan in association with the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII), attracted commitments of investments from 295 memoranda of understanding (MoUs) amounting to Rs. 3,21,199 crore with proposed employment for 2,39,694 lakh people.

The summit brought together leading investors from across the world to interact with the political leadership, government officials and local business leaders to discuss investment opportunities in Rajasthan. The summit saw a slew of announcements of strategic partnerships and investment intent in a number of thrust sectors identified by the State.

The largest number of MoUs were signed in tourism sector. At 122, the investment commitments stand at Rs 5783 crore. This is expected to generate 18617 jobs in the sector. The energy sector, with only 9 MoUs, attracted investments to the tune of Rs 1,90,000 crore.

The medical and health sector, with 36 MoUs and expected investments of Rs 4752 crore, will create the largest number of jobs, touching 81605. There were 40 MoUs signed in the manufacturing sector amounting to Rs 11760 crore and will lead to employment for 56698 people. The infrastructure sector attracted Rs 17038 crore as com-



mitments for investment that would create 46975 jobs. There were 10 MoUs signed in the agriculture sector worth Rs 2402 crore - this will lead to 5317 people getting employed. With 8 MoUs worth Rs 1807 crore, the education sector hopes to generate jobs for 12010 people in the State.

Under roads and highways, the state signed one MoU worth Rs 10,000 crore in addition to the 4 award of sanctions worth Rs 25446 crore. Nine MoUs were signed in the Skills sector. The Petroleum & Mines sector attracted proposed invest-

ments worth Rs 77,657 crore through 25 MoUs that can create 18,472 jobs in the State. Commenting on the MoUs, Shri Gajendra Singh Khimsar, Industry Minister, Government of Rajasthan, said, "This summit has been an endeavour by the State Government to promote and attract investments in the State. The warm response from the industrial fraternity has led me to believe that Resurgent Rajasthan 2015 has been successful in creating a unique partnership platform for industrial growth in the state of Rajasthan."

Objects over Entrance Fees at Sajjangarh

Udaipur : Coming strict on commercial activities at protected sites, the Archaeology department has registered its objection against the forest department for running cafeteria at Sajjangarh Palace, a protected monument and famous tourist spot here.

Objection has also been raised against the latter for revenue collection by means of entrance fees being charged by the visitors here. However, forest department refute all charges claiming that the fees taken is for the wild life sanctuary here and not for the palace.

"Sajjangarh is a protected site under our department and we spend for the maintenance and repairing works. But the place is under possession of the forest department which charge entrance fee from vis-

itors coming here. They are not entitled for revenue collection and hence a letter has been sent to the Director recommending necessary action" Mubarik Hussain, the Superintendent, Archaeology and Museums said. However, forest authorities refute the charges.

"The visitors are only charged for entering the wild life sanctuary while the Palace entry is free. Also there is no cafeteria operational at the premises but only a junction for the facilities of the tourists where just beverages and water is served" said Rahul Bhatnagar, the chief conservator of forest (wild life).

The department has nothing to do with the junction as it is managed by a local committee, he added further.

Paintings of Udaipur by Anurag

Udaipur : Anurag Mehta artist from Udaipur, started painting from an early age and is now known as one of the best artists of the city. Most of Anurag's paintings are based on Udaipur city. He says, "My birthplace is Udaipur and I have a deep fascination towards this beautiful city. I think Udaipur has got a wide range of subjects for a painter. The sparkling blue water of the lakes, vibrant scenes of Ghats and the unique Rajput style architecture is like a feast for my artwork."

On choosing watercolor medium, Anurag Mehta says, "Although watercolor is the toughest medium to handle, but its freshness and spontaneity attracted me always. For subjects such as landscape with water, watercolor is the best. It needs a long practice and patience to get mastery over it and I am trying hard for that."

Sher Khan granted bail by HC

Udaipur : Two accused of the mining Bribery case Dhirendra alias Chintu and business man of Sava Sher Khan have finally been granted bail from the Jodhpur High Court on Thursday, Advocate Ravindra Singh Hiran said.

Advocate Rajendra Singh Hiran and Advocate Vineet Mathur presented the bail applications of Khan and Chintu in the high court on Thursday. Both Hiran and Mathur pleaded to the court about innocence of their client Khan who had been forcefully dragged into the matter despite of having no involvement.

Moreover, they are businessmen and not government employees so the sections of

the IPC Act levied on them were inapplicable on them. On the other hand, the Public Prosecutor said that Khan is an influential businessman and he could influence the witnesses if granted bail.

Considering all the points of the advocates the high court finally granted bail to Sher Khan. All the 8 accused of the Bribery case including the suspended Secretary of the Department Ashok Singhvi were produced in front of Anti Corruption Court here at Udaipur on Thursday morning. The court has extended the Judicial Custody of the accused further till December 3, Public Prosecutor Ramesh Dhadke informed.

Besides this, the State

Government has also granted the Prosecution Sanction for the trio of accused-suspended Secretary of the Department Ashok Singhvi under section 409 of IPC, suspended deputy director and engineer of the mining department Pankaj Gehlot and PR Ameta under all the sections levied on them. Now the hearing of the case will be started after 3rd December, said AdSP ACB and Investigating officer of the case Shankar Dutt Sharma.

Sharma further added that as the case is still under investigation there is a hope of getting new facts in relation to the matter as soon as the ACB receives the report of Forensic Science Lab.

The British Council Launches 11th Language & Development Conference in New Delhi

This is the first time that India will be hosting this prestigious international conference. The conference's main theme will be - 'Multilingualism and Development' with three sub-themes: Multilingualism and the Metropolis; Language, Technology and Multi-literacies; and Multilingualism, Marginalisation & Empowerment.

Udaipur : The group of environment lovers that is walking across the globe with a motive of spreading the message to safeguard the environment and to keep it clean arrived Udaipur on Wednesday. The group has traveled across 10 countries till now including China, Nepal, Bhutan, Burma, China, Pakistan, Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Tibet and India by covering a distance of more than 2.9 Lac Kilometers.

Aavadh Bihari informed that he had lost his family members in the massive Flood that had destroyed his village and in that year itself, he decid-

ed to go on a world tour on foot and to spread awareness of conversation of environment. On July 30, 1980 he started his journey that was flagged off by the then PM Indira Gandhi. His journey has started getting recognition after Late Rajeev Gandhi met him and once again flagged off his journey in 1989.

While talking about his team Bihari said that 2 of his team members Jitendra Pratap and Mahendra Pratap joined him in 1995 whereas 15 others joined the group in the year 2000 out of which 4 of them are girls.

New herbal drug to up wellness quotient

Jaipur: Nearing 40 and already worrying about a bad knee or wheezing chest! Well no more.

The state medicinal plants board has developed a concoction of herbs that will help delay age-related pathogenesis and increase overall health span. The polyherbal formulation developed after over one year of research, is likely to hit the market after year-long clinical trials and is being seen as a major step towards 'Make in Rajasthan'. The drug JVN-8 or Jara Vyadhi Nashnam has been developed from eight different herbs after a thorough study of original ancient ayurveda texts, including Brahatruti, Charaka Samhita, Sushruta Samhita and Vagbhatta's

Asthang a Haridayam, said Deep Narayan Pandey, member secretary of the board.

"A team of ayurvedic doctors, under guidance of Sanjay Dixit, principal secretary, ayurved and Indian medicine department, identified relevant major illnesses, such as cardiovascular diseases, cancers, chronic respiratory diseases and diabetes (related to age) and then studied original ancient ayurveda texts," he said. "We also assembled a large database of scientific research on ayurveda, phyto-medicine and ethno-medicine published worldwide for each of the clinical condition relevant to delay the age-related pathogenesis."
