Rishab Jain bags ICRC award

Udaipur : photo journalist Rishab Jain bagged the third prize in the PII-ICRC 2015 Annual Awards this year. He won the prize for his picture on humanitarian subject that was flood which had drowned many parts of Udaipur city and suburbs in 2014. He shared his prize with photo journalist Biju Boro of Asomiya Pratinidhi. The award ceremony for the winners of 2015 Best Article & Photograph on humanitarian subjects organized jointly by International Committee of the Red Cross and Press Institute of India was held in New Delhi on Wednesday.

Independent journalists from different parts of the country bagged all the awards in the Best Article on a humanitarian subject category. While Neha Dixit from New Delhi bagged the first prize, it was Shazia Yousuf based in Kashmir, who was awarded the second prize. The third prize in the print media category was jointly shared by Guwahati based Priyanka Borpujari and New Delhi based Saurabh Yadav. In the Photograph category, photojournalist Biju Boro of Asomiya Pratinidhi and Rishabh Jain of Dainik Bhaskar jointly bagged the third prize. The first and the second prizes in the photograph category was not awarded this year. For both the categories, a total of 85 entries were received and they covered a wide variety of humanitarian issues, ranging from the floods in Kashmir to the earthquake in Nepal and reflected on how these impacted the lives of communities caught in their path. Some entries provided an exposé of the condition of women and children in emergency situations-issues that are often ignored by the mainstream media.

Air India to increase connectivity within Rajasthan cities

Udaipur : The Rajasthan government has sought proposals from Air India on having regular flights from Jodhpur, Udaipur, Bikaner and Jaisalmer. The airline is believed to have expressed interest in flying through these cities, which are a major attraction among domestic and international tourists. At present, a private airline is operating flights to Udaipur. The state civil aviation officers held a meeting with Air India CMD Ashwani Lohani on the subject last week. The state government too was keen on increasing air connectivity with the cities, as it would boost its tourism revenue.

Rajasthan Has Become Biggest On-land Oil and Gas Producer : CM

Chief Minister Smt. Vasundhara Raje has said that Rajasthan has become the biggest on-land oil and gas producing region of the country. Now, efforts are being made to establish a refinery very soon so that the state can get full benefit of its resources. She requested the Union Minister of State for Petroleum Shri Dharmendra Pradhan to ensure supply of domestic gas through pipeline in the cities selected to be developed as smart cities.

Smt. Raje was addressing a gathering on the occasion of dedicating Kota-Jobner Multi-product Pipeline and Jobner Terminal to the nation on Friday at Jobner near Jaipur. The CM said that she was prompt to respond on Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi's call to give-up gas subsidy through 'Give-It-Up' and 'Give-It-Back' campaigns. She said that it was good to learn that this subsidy was being directed to the BPL families.

The Chief Minister said that the condition of roads in the state was pathetic, but now Rajasthan is the second state in terms of construction or renewal of the National Highways. She said that the Gramin Gaurav Paths would resolve the issue of rural women. In Jaipur Rural region, of total 111 sanctioned Gramin Gaurav Paths, about 85 had been completed and the work on missing links was also on the full pace, she added.

Highlighting the issue of repeated snags in the plastic pipeline for drinking water supply in Asalpur area of Jobner, Smt. Raje requested the Union Minister of State Shri Pradhan to support laying of a new GI pipeline for water supply. She further requested for CSR and other funds for construction on an ROB in this region.

The Union Minister of State Shri Dharmendra Pradhan said that the state was progressing ahead and attaining new heights



of development. People from all over the world were reaching the state for investment. Such possibilities gained momentum during the recently convened Resurgent Rajasthan Partnership Summit. He said that the state was enabling itself in the leadership of Smt. Raje despite challenging financial situation.

On the CM's demand, the Union Minister assured for supply of domestic gas through pipeline in the cities of Jaipur, Ajmer, Kota and Udaipur selected to be developed as smart cities. He said that this facility

would be made available soon in Kota. He assured that the state would be extended full benefits of CSR funds.

The Minister said that the Union Government and particularly the Petroleum Department would give entire benefits to the Rajasthan. He said on certain occasions Rajasthan used to face shortage of petroleum supplies, but operationalization of new Terminal at Jobner would resolve this problem. Very soon, the IOC would also start a new terminal in Jaipur district, he added.

Double Your Memory In One Hour By SETP Tool

Udaipur : Dr. Arvinder Singh, CEO and CMD of Arth diagnostics and Raahat Hospital conducted workshop on increasing the memory. The workshop was done with Indian menopause Society in Geetanjali Medical College, Udaipur. In this interactive workshop various systems and tools of getting mega memory were explained. Dr Singh shared links system of memory, pegging system of memory and techniques of association formation. In this workshop it was demonstrated to medical fraternity that memory can be increased to many folds contrary to the belief that memory declines as age increases. Dr Singh emphasised that with training tools and techniques anyone can learn and possess amazing



memory. In this workshop participants learned the technique of listening 20 items only once and remembering those in backward, forward and random order. In

the workshop the mind power experiments were also done by demonstrating the power of psychic and mind-reading of the participants.

Dr Singh explained that healthy



lifestyle also helps to improve memory and mind power. One should do regular aerobic exercises, take proper brain diet for example green tea, walnuts, flex seed, omega-3 etc. In this work-

shop the need for development of right and left brain was well explained which helps to improve functionality of mind. He said that usually people use either left brain or right brain which leads to less utilisation of brain and required harmony is not achieved. One must do both hands writing and hand eye coordination exercises especially juggling of balls for better mind power.

Dr Arvinder Singh is credited for designing, developing and patenting the mind power tool of S ETP (Seven Effective Thinking Patterns). The tool is registered with the government of India and is published in various national and international publications for its efficacy to enhance intelligence and intellect.
