Acharya Lokesh Muni addressing the International Human Rights Awards '5th Bhartiya Manava Adhikar Samman 2015' organised by National Council Of News & Broadcasting (NCNB), Asian Human Rights Council (AHRC),

Vidyapeeth's silent march after a stay order from High Court

Udaipur : Janardnray Nagar Rajasthan Vidyapeeth University constitutional amendment to repeal the decision of the Deputy Registrar Cooperatives Udaipur Rajasthan High Court stay order on Friday at the organization's workers and students marched silently. People were holding placards, the Deputy Registrar Cooperatives crack-down, police had written the name scare those demands strict etc. The procession arrived at the collectorate and workers from Rajasthan Vidyapeeth University Deputy Registrar Cooperatives submitted a memorandum on the crackdown. The School of the 2nd of September 2014 revised constitution was rejected by the



Deputy Registrar Cooperatives Ashwani Bhardwaj. School had filed against it in the High Court. Bhanwar Lal Gujjar said the chief law against this decision was challenged in court to tell. Deputy Registrar of the

Court is not empowered to pass an order. In the past, the High Court gave judgment in this regard. According to the former head of the High Court ordered a stay of the decision is considered contempt.

State sends Rs. 6400 Cr for smart Smart City Proposals

Udaipur : State government is scheduled to send proposals worth Rs. 6400 Cr to the central government for the development of proposed smart cities. The plans were approved by high powered meeting under the chairmanship of CS Mr. Rajan. The four smart cities are Jaipur, Udaipur, Kota and Ajmer around which the project plans will cover specific area based, as well as region based development. The plans to be sent before December 15th will cover sustainable mobility management system, heritage conservation, public transportation and solid waste management components under urban development. Out of the suggested proposal, Jaipur has received the most part of the share with Rs. 2404 Cr followed by Rs. 1493 Cr for Kota, Rs. 1300 Cr for Ajmer and Rs. 1221 Cr for Udaipur.

AVVNL JEn caught red handed

Udaipur : Udaipur's Anti Corruption Bureau (ACB) has arrested a junior engineer working at electricity department AVVNL while he was taking bribe of Rs. 15000 in return of providing permanent electricity connection.

The accused engineer Anil Kumar resident of Pratap Nagar was trapped and caught red handed by ACB team on Monday 7th Dec.

According to ACB SP Brijesh Soni, the accused is working with AVVNL as JEN since 2012 and recently transferred to Hiran Magri Branch. He allegedly demanded the bribe from a resident of Sarvritu Vilas who has an under construction office at Sub city center Savina and wanted a permanent three-phase electric meter for his office.

Nagar Nigam to launch Fire-Fighting Bikes

Udaipur : We have often come across certain challenges where the fire engines are incapable of responding efficiently to situations of fire eruption due to late arrival because of congested lanes or they have to return as the vehicles get jammed on narrow roads of the old city. Soon this problem will be resolved with the arrival of fire fighting bullet (motor bike) introduced by Udaipur Municipal Corporation that will serve the purpose of extinguishing fire in the houses situated in the old city.

On Wednesday, Mayor Chandra Singh Kothari, Chief Fire Officer Harish Tharvani and Jai Singh took the demonstration of the bike in the town area. Veniram Salvi, president of Apdha Prabhadhak Fire

Brigade Sahayata Samiti of Nagar Nigam Udaipur informed that the tender process of the facility will be soon initiated. This is to consider that Nagar Nigam Udaipur presently owns 10 fire engines which seems unable to meet the requirement of the time of emergency which is a matter of concern as there are 18 wards situated within the walled city area; being the most crowded too.

The bikes are designed as fire fighting vehicles equipped with 10 Liter of fire extinguishers on each side. Besides, these bikes will also have small equipment attached that can be used at situations of fire caused by short circuit. Built with alarm system, the bikes will be able to rush towards the scene hassle free.

Gross violation of Human Right in India

Ludhiana : India became free on 15.8.1947 but the fruit of freedom is not available to the citizens. Only handful elite class of IAS, IPS, wealthy persons, political leaders and their stooges. Rest of the citizen is still treated like slaves. Even some of them do not know their rights including human rights such as right to dignity.

Today on International Human Right Day many NGOs and other organizations celebrated the day in hotels and restaurants with fan fare only for the sake of photo sessions. Only some organizations, NGOs conducted seminars meetings and distributed literature to serve the society but it is not enough. RTI & Human Rights Activist, Ludhiana, organized meetings in different parts of the city to create awareness amongst the common

man special emphasis was on the violation of human rights of domestic worker totally an unorganized sector. Mostly children and female work as domestic help are not only exploited but have to live in inhuman conditions and also subjected to violence. There is no one to listen to their victimization, neither police nor NGOs working in the cities.

It is also noticed that even child labour is also rampant. In one of recent case in Ludhiana a girl child was rescued which revealed that about 25-30 such children are working but the police did not took any interest for investigating this case. Similar are the stories of lacs of such case in India which go un-noticed.

RTI & Human Right Activist President, Shri Paul Sharma and Chairman, Sat Pal Sharma,

said "main cause of violation of human right in India is poverty and lack of education."

The Govt. enacted many laws including Human Rights, RTI but most of the acts are only gathering dust in the offices. So acts has added to the corruption instead of redressal of public problem.

The chief guest of the day, Anita Sharma, National President, Belan Brigade, call upon the women folk which is 50% of the national population to come forward and fight for their rights through active participation and make the country citizen free from all sort of violation of human rights and stand by the public spirited NGO for restoration of Human Right ensure and compliance of Human Rights acts, 1993 to ensure the dignity of countrymen.
