Need for reform in higher education: Governor

New Delhi : Governor of Rajasthan Shri Kalyan Singh has stated that the university grants commission has made necessary for qualifying the NET examination for appointment to the post of Lecturers which makes them competent in the direction of research but not capable in the teaching profession. Therefore, there is a need to devise a suitable policy in this regard.

The Governor Shri Singh was addressing the Governor's Conference on Tuesday at Rasthrapati Bhawan, New Delhi where the Hon'ble President Shri Pranav Mukerjee, the Vice President Shri Hamid Ansari, the Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, Governors of various states and Lieutenant Governors of Union Territories were present.

Shri Singh while enlightening upon higher education mentioned that every Government university has been directed to adopt one village which is being developed as 'Smart Village'. The archaic system of wearing 'gown' in convocation ceremonies has been replaced by Indian dresses. Directions have been

issued to formulate an exhaustive marking scheme. The present marking system does not adjudge the basic inner knowledge of the students. He transpired his feeling that there is a dire need to bring a qualitative improvement in the field of higher education.

The availability of houses is a serious problem for poor families. The State Government has focused prime attention to resolve it by formulating various schemes. He brought to the notice that the State Government in fulfillment of dream "Swachh Bharat Mission" of Hon'ble Prime Minister has constructed 16,48,000 toilets against the target of 14,93,000 in the current financial year and ranked at the top in the country. The State Government has

formed a department to provide employment to unemployed and skill development of youths. The Rajasthan has been honoured with the first prize in the field of skill development. The Governor pointed out that the territory of the Rajasthan is close to our neighboring country Pakistan, therefore in order to combat crossborder infiltration and terrorism, specialized equipment such as night vision devices, touch sensors, etc. are urgently required by our security and police forces, which needs funding from the Central Government

Gehlot seeks ACB probe in PRN scheme

Jaipur : The Rajasthan government should immediately order a probe by Anti-Corruption Bureau for unearthing irregularities in the implementation of Prithvi Raj Nagar (PRN) scheme, former chief minister Ashok Gehlot said on Tuesday

Gehlot raised the demand after urban development and housing minister Rajpal Singh Shekhawat was reported to be irked over the irregularities in regularisation of residential colonies in Prithvi Raj Nagar

"I had warned the state government that corruption in the Prithvi Raj Nagar scheme will create a problem for JDA (Jaipur Development Authority). Now, the urban development and housing minister himself has accepted

these charges," he said. Large-scale corruption has been reported in JDA on the alibi of construction of sector road and alignment work. Gehlot said, adding that the directions of the Rajasthan high court are being openly violated. In 2010, the high court banned constructions in areas earmarked for the Prithvi Raj Nagar scheme till JDA presents a plan to carry out development in a logical way.

He alleged that only those colonies inside cooperative societies are regularised which give in to the "demands" of JDA officials. "The regularisation camps are held even in areas lying vacant and also for new colonies. Such colonies are given the benefit of rule meant for colonies established before 1999.

Budget of 309.65 cr aims to create a smarter urban system ered lighting systems emerged

Udaipur: The annual budget of Udaipur city for the financial year 2016-17 tabled on Friday here Major thrusts on city beautification, sanitation and safety aspects of residents. As Udaipur has been chosen for the smart city project, the municipal budget too envisages upon investments and projects which are required to make the urban systems smarter, efficient and resilient to threats from pollution.

Mechanized cleaning, high tech and hydraulic ladder fire fighting system, solar powas the high lights this time. "With substantial private sector involvement projects like Ayad River cleaning, solid waste management, sanitation, sewage systems will be implemented with a view to improve the quality of life of the people of Udaipur" said Mayor Chandra Singh Kothari

Solid waste management (SWM) Amrut Jal Yojana, establishing a Chaupati bazaar at the SwaroopSagar bridge and creating a museum at the Jagdish chowk library are big projects on which major spends would be made. A whooping 10 cr would be spend for SWM while 110 lakhs for purchase of city buses, investment of 105 lakhs on solar energy, 2 cr for high mast lights, 16 cr for drainage construction and maintenance works, 1.5 cr for mechanized cleaning, 4 cr for Gulabbagh, new drainage lines etc are among the other projects highlighted in the budget which was passed without much melodrama owing to the thumping majority of the ruling BJP board.

Anganwadi Workers Protest against Govt.

Udaipur: Hundreds of Anganwadi workers staged protest outside the Collectorate on Monday and demanded positive action towards their requirement for better job prospective. Protestors raised slogans against the Government and handed over a memorandum to the administrative officer under the banner of Anganwadi Karmchari Sangh and warned for more violent protest if their demands will be ignored. Geeta Sharma the State President of Anganwadi Association informed that we want permanent job, as considered Government employees, The anganwadi workers should get minimum salary of Rs.15000 too, Geeta also said that they are protesting from last 6 months but no actions were taken in their favor.

Our other demands include periodic leave; all the elderly women employees who are already retired or going to be retired should be provided a gratuity amount of Rs. 5 Lakhs and Rs. 3000 as pension. The protesters in their memorandum also highlighted that the Government has started a process of appointing the supervisors directly on the basis of experience and in that around 25 women has to appointed but none selected yet.

Students protest, demand removal of VC

Udaipur: Hundreds of students belonging to the National Students Union of India (NSUI) staged a protest against the administration of Central University of Rajasthan (CURAJ) on Monday and submitted a memorandum to the district collector demanding removal of its vice chancellor (VC) and the research guide for abetting suicide of a PhD scholar

Mohit Kumar Chauhan, a PhD scholar of the university, hanged himself in his hostel room on Friday allegedly after being harassed by assistant professor Viddyutama Jain under whom he was doing his course. An FIR was registered on Saturday against Jain, head of mathematics department DC Sharma and dean (research) Aditya K Gupta after Mohit's father submitted a complaint against the three accused.

NSUI activists in Udaipur called slogans against the government outside the district collectorate on Monday and burnt an effigy of education minister Smriti Irani. NSUI vice president Deepak Mewara accused the CURAJ vice chancellor and Irani for the suicide of the scholar and demanded Prime minister Narendra Modi to look into the matter and remove inefficient ministers allegedly held responsible for the death.
