The BMVSS has since fitted this Stanford University Jaipur Knee on thousands of disabled both in India and abroad, Ambassador Verma said during the visit of the Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi to the Silicon Valley in US, he gave

the example of the Jaipur Foot as a truly "Make in India" product that has acceptability all over the world.. He said the Jaipur Foot because of its high technical quality and durability is serving large number of disabled who are provided this artificial limbs free.

Ambassador Verma discussed with D.R Mehta on the scope of collaboration between United States and BMVSS where the United States will be a willing partner in the progress Ambassador Verma also spoke to the disabled and knew how the Jaipur Foot was helping them in making their lives better. He also inspected a prototype of a special wheel chair developed by the MIT which is being made in India now. The field trials of this wheel chair was conducted by the BMVSS and the improvement suggested.

### TRI is running coaching scheme

Udaipur : Manikyalal Verma Tribal Research and Training Institute (TRI), Udaipur in the tribal areas has initiated various coaching schemes for a brighter future of students. Tribal Regional Development Commissioner Harsh Sawansukha said that additional TRI in planning the annual coaching job to be supplied under the welfare fund of the Treasury of the budget has been allocated for withdrawal. Functioning at the district level for pre-competitive exam coaching Dungarpur, Banswara and Pratapgarh Project Officer (ST) offices directly by the Department for the implementation of the Scheme has been transferred amount.

Udaipur : RTO has notified the owners of more than three thousand taxis and Maxi Cab operating in the district and asked them why their permit, registration booklet should not get cancelled. RTO Dr Mannalal Rawat has informed that during the departmental scrutiny it was found that these vehicle owners didn't deposited taxes assigned by state government; hence they were given warned and given notice.

The tax owners are asked to reach RTO office on 5th and 6th March at Public Grievance program and clarify why they didn't deposited the taxes timely, if they cannot respond reasonably; strict action will be taken against them which might include seizing their vehicles and cancelling their license.

Other than taxi owners, all dealers of Udaipur are also notified to present the records of all vehicle sale of last 5 years.

**UMC introduces Fire Fighting Motorbikes** : When big fire fighting trucks are unable to reach in the densely populated old city areas because of narrow lanes, Municipal Corporation has solution for it as the civic authority introduced Fire Fighting Motorbikes. It is fast and equipped with everything necessary equipment to control emergency situations like fire.

Udaipur has 18 wards situated in old city and it is unfeasible for fire brigades to reach these areas because of narrow lanes. After introducing fire fighting motorbikes the response time will increase. The fully sophisticated and modified Royal Enfield bikes are equipped with two cylinders of 10kg filled with fire extinguishers; the bike also has an emergency siren and other tools. Mayor Chandra Singh Kothari said that it is a major step towards making the fire fighting department more capable and responsive. Udaipur is the first city of state to introduce motorbikes in fire fighting.
