



Best Smart Phones Under 15,000/-

LeEco Le 2

LeEco Le 2 is One of the best phone under 15000 you can get right now. The Le 2 is the upgraded version of Le 1s which was the first Le device launched in India. The smartphone offers high-end specs with premium build quality. LeEco Le 2 sports a 5.5-inch 1080P Full HD In-cell display. The display is crisp, the quality is much better than other smartphones in this price bracket.

Le 2 is powered by Qualcomm Snapdragon 652 Octa-core processor clocked at 1.8 GHz with Adreno 510 GPU. It has the most powerful processor which can handle any game with ease. It is loaded with 3 GB of RAM which adds more power for smoother performance. The device offers 32 GB of internal storage and skips external storage. It has a 16-megapixel rear camera with dual tone LED flash and 8-megapixel selfie camera. The rear camera performs quite well and the detailing is worth noticing. The selfie camera is good but not outstanding.

It houses 3000 mAh battery with Quick Charge 2.0. The battery performance is reasonably well and lasts a day easily. There is no 3.5mm jack instead, it has USB Type C CDLA headphones. It has a fingerprint sensor on the back. LeEco Le 2 runs on Android Marshmallow 6.0 with EUIS 5.6 custom UI on top. It supports 4G VoLTE, 3G, WiFi, Bluetooth 4.1, GPS, and GLONASS.

Xiaomi Redmi Note 3 (3 GB RAM Edition)
Xiaomi has launched the best phone under 15000 with Redmi Note 3. This is probably the most premium smartphone under this category. Xiaomi Redmi Note 3 is the first Redmi phone to feature a fingerprint sensor. The design all metallic which is beautifully crafted. The device comes with 5.5-inch 1080P screen with sunlight display, reading mode, night display, and color temperature adjustment. The display comes in handy while using it in the daytime as well at the night.

The Redmi Note 3 runs on Android Lollipop 5.1 with MIUI 7 flavor on top. The handset packs a Qualcomm Snapdragon 650 Hexa-core processor with Adreno 510 GPU. This is the first smartphone to feature a Snapdragon 650 chipset which is one of the

powerful chipsets from Qualcomm. It boasts a 3 GB of RAM with 32 Gigabyte onboard storage and the external storage is expandable up to 32 GB. The Redmi Note offers a fingerprint sensor with 0.3 seconds unlocking functionality. The device sports a 16-megapixel rear camera with 0.1s ultra fast PDAF, dual LED flash, and 1080P video recording. On the front, it has 5-megapixel selfie camera which captures really good selfies. The best part of this device is the battery life, it comes with a huge 4050 mAh battery with Quick charge support. This phone is completely different from others and offers rich media experience. It is the upgraded version of Vibe K4 Note which was released a few months back.

Lenovo Vibe K5 Note sports 5.5-inch Full HD 1080P IPS display with 401 PPI. The display is good enough to consume media content. It is powered by a 1.8GHz MediaTek Helio P10 octa-core processor with Mali-T860MP2 GPU. Although it's not the best processors going around but does the job well. The 4 GB RAM is loaded inside which helps to perform even better for multitasking and high-end gaming. The Lenovo phone packs 32 GB of internal storage which can be expandable up to 128 GB. It runs on Android Marshmallow 6.0 with Vibe UI.

DH2 remote controller. Lenovo is offering these gadgets for free on launch date. It features Dolby Atmos for high-quality audio playback. On the back, it has a fingerprint sensor which works like a charm. The design is all aluminum body just like it's competitors. The build quality is much better compared to Vibe K4 Note. The Vibe K5 Note flaunts 13-megapixel rear camera dual LED dual tone flash. The rear camera is decent but not the best in the competition. It has 8-megapixel selfie camera which is quite good for taking casual selfies. All this stuff is handled by a 3500mAh battery which is OK but won't last very long. If you are looking for a smartphone under 15000

with high-quality media consumption then Vibe K5 Note should be your choice.

Xiaomi Mi Max

Xiaomi is well known for its quality products and Mi Max is no different. Xiaomi Mi Max packs the punch to be the best phone under 15000 with a huge display. The phone is not meant for everyone out there because of the gigantic screen. The Mi Max sports a humongous 6.4-inch 1080P IPS display with 342 PPI. You can say it's the extended version of Xiaomi Redmi note 3. It runs on Android Marshmallow 6.0 with MIUI 7 flavor on top. Xiaomi has already rolled out MIUI Update for Mi Max. So the software is up to date for this device

and works flawlessly.

Xiaomi Mi Max is powered by a Snapdragon 650 Hexa-Core processor clocked at 1.8 GHz with Adreno 510 GPU. The performance is smooth and you won't notice any lag. It has 3 Gigs of RAM, 32 Gigs of storage and has 128 GB expandable storage. The phablet shoots 16-megapixel rear camera with dual tone LED flash and PDAF. On the front, it has 5-megapixel selfie camera. The rear and front camera quality is similar to the Xiaomi Redmi Note 3. Expect good quality pictures in most conditions.

Mi Max weighs 203 grams and 7.55 mm thick. The phablet houses an impressive 4850 mAh battery which can last pretty long. It gets the fingerprint sensor on the back which is similar to the Redmi Note 3. The device supports Hybrid dual sim along with 4G VoLTE. If you are looking for a tablet with smartphone functionality then Xiaomi Mi Max is just made for you.

Motorola Moto G4 Plus

Motorola Moto G4 Plus smartphone was launched in May 2016. The phone comes with a 5.50-inch touchscreen display with a resolution of 1080

pixels by 1920 pixels at a PPI of 401 pixels per inch. Motorola Moto G4 Plus price in India starts from Rs. 13499.

The Motorola Moto G4 Plus is powered by 1.5GHz octa-core Qualcomm Snapdragon 617 processor and it comes with 2GB of RAM. The phone packs 16GB of internal storage that can be expanded up to 128GB via a microSD card. As far as the cameras are concerned, the Motorola Moto G4 Plus packs a 16-megapixel primary camera on the rear and a 5-megapixel front shooter for selfies.

The Motorola Moto G4 Plus runs Android 6.0.1 and is powered by a 3000mAh non removable battery. It measures 153.00 x 76.60 x 7.90 (height x width x thickness) and weighs 155.00 grams.

The Motorola Moto G4 Plus is a dual SIM (GSM and GSM) smartphone that accepts two Micro-SIM. Connectivity options include Wi-Fi, GPS, Bluetooth, FM, 3G, 4G (with support for Band 40 used by some LTE networks in India). T24's relocation to Ranthambore 'out of question'- NTCA



Udaipur: The team from National Tiger Conservation Authority which visited Sajjanganr Biological Park at Udaipur on Wednesday to take stalk of T-24 aka Ustad made it clear that relocating the cat back to Ranthambore Tiger Reserve is 'out of question'. "We are quite satisfied with the upkeep and kind of care and medical facilities the tiger is being given inside the park enclosure. He has been banished from Ranthambore and asked 'to be kept in captivity' and with decisions of two apex courts, there is no point in debating over the issue again and again" Y.K Sahu, chief conservator Ranthambore and member of the committee told Udaipur Kiran.

Members in the team also included H.S Negi, Additional Inspector General-NTCA, Dr Parag Nigam from Wild life Institute-Dehradun and Rajpal Singh, a tiger conservationist. After visiting Ustad's enclosure, the team discussed his

health conditions and medical reports with the veterinary experts at the park.

"As of now, our prime concern is his health and welfare. He cannot be moved anywhere as the animal had suffered from idiopathic megacolon earlier and is still showing the symptoms for the disease. He has been put to a special diet and under the care of experts from Indian Veterinary Research Institute (Bareilly). The officers will keep in touch with the medical experts to know his health condition and when he regains good health, then perhaps we may consider other options of a soft release" Sahu informed. On asked of the places that could be considered for his relocation, Sahu said it may be Kumbalgarh or a tiger safari where the animal can be released without fear. "

The enclosure where he is presently kept in quite a large one sprawled in a hectare. The facilities and sanitation are

up to the mark. But in future, when he recovers and if it is felt that for his welfare he should be moved to a better place, Kumbalgarh might be an option" Sahu said.

T24 was one of the three cubs born to the tigress known as Lahpur-Nagdi female and a male tiger called Jhumaroo. He is a direct descendent of Machhli, the world's most famous big cat that died recently. The three cubs T23, T24 and T25 grew up in the Lahpur Nagdi area before dispersing to establish their own territories.

When in 2010 the Tiger 12 was translocated to Sariska, Ustad took over his territory and became the dominant male of the Sultanpur-Phoota Kot area. On May 16 last year, after eight days of the death of a forest guard, the tiger was banished from Ranthambore wilds and taken in captivity at Sajjanganr Biological Park in Udaipur.

Two people were drowned at different locations in Udaipur on Tuesday while a man died after a kutcha house collapsed in Rajsamand. Landslides disrupted communication on Udaipur-Pindwara highway, several villages were left in dark due to electricity sup-

ply failure in the division. Meanwhile the rescue team discovered the body of a victim Devi Singh who was among the family of ten people who were swept away with their car in Sarni river at Bhinder on Sunday night. Four persons had been rescued on Monday by locals while three were drowned. Eight teams consisting of 150 persons car-

ried out the search operation entire day to locate two more of the missing persons identified as Jassu Kunwar and Mahendra Singh but couldn't succeed. In Rajsamand at Panna village in Thurawad gram panchayat, a man was killed and another injured after a kutcha house collapsed due to continues rains.
