Cook with Hritu

Chhena Payesh



Ingredients: Milk 1 1/2 litres, Saffron (kesar) a few strands, Lemon juice 1 1/2 tablespoons, sugar 1/2 cup, almonds blanched and chopped 5-6 Pistachios blanched and chopped 7

Method:

Soak saffron in two tablespoons of warm milk and set aside. Boil half litre of milk. As it comes to a boil add lemon juice and keep stirring till all the milk curdles.

Strain the whey and tie up the chhena in a muslin cloth and dip in ice water till it cools completely. Then squeeze till all the liquid drains away. Set aside.

Boil milk, add a pinch of saffron, reduce heat and let it simmer till reduced to half the original quantity.

Add sugar, stir and simmer till it dissolves. Mash chhena in a bowl. Add it to the milk. Simmer for two minutes.

Add almonds and pistachios and the soaked saffron and take off the heat.

Cool and serve.

Campaign To District, Taluka And Panchayat Levels

Government firms up plans to take the Digital Payment Communication

New Delhi: With a view to provide logistic support to the IEC activities- information, education and communication, holding camps for transiting to the digital mode of payment, the Government has undertaken a series of measures to provide incentives to the district administration which will give a boost to cashless digital payment systems across the districts, talukas and panchayats. NITI Aayog has enlisted a series of incentives for the communication campaign for the district authorities and administration to promote the transition to the cashless digital payment systems. These include incentives for digital payments for day to day financial transactions like buying or selling goods/services, transferring money etc. NITI Aayog will provide logis-

tic support for outreach activities at the district, taluk and panchayat level in form of the seed money of Rs.5lakh per district administration as a part of the communication campaign. The purpose is to enhance the seeding of Mobile and Aadhar numbers to the bank account, issue of Rupay cards wherever necessary, issue of PIN wherever necessary, downloading of app wherever necessary and finally achieving two successful transactions. The top ten best performing districts will be awarded the Digital Payment Champions of India award. The first 50 Panchayats which go cashless will be awarded Digital Payment Award of Honour. **The five digital payment systems are -**



- 1.Unified Payment Interface, UPI
- 2.USSD (*99#banking)
- 3.Aadhar Enabled Systems
- 4.Wallets &
- 5.Rupay/Debit/Credit/Prepaid Cards

The Hindi/English version of the brochure which gives step by step approach to each of

the five options is available on the website- www.niti.gov.in/conentent/digital-payments. In order to help spread the message of advantages of digital payment systems, NITI Aayog has collated and put up the entire sets of creative material - presentations/posters./FM radio spots/ films on its website dedicated to the digital payments-www.niti.gov.in/conentent/digital-payments. In addition, Common Service Networks are being mobilized to enlist the support of people and the merchants in going cashless.Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology has announced cash incentive

of Rs.100 for every merchant enabled to transact digitally. Two resource persons have been provided in each district collectorate to co-ordinate the CSE in each district. NITI Aayog has also solicited the views of the districts in terms of the challenges being faced by them, the solutions thereof and the manner in which they can be supported. It has lauded the efforts made by the district authorities in designing innovative Campaigns to help spread digital payments in their respective districts and urged upon them to share and document the best practices. It will go a long way towards ushering in an era of transparency and good governance for a corruption free India envisaged by the Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi.

Jaya under close watch of expert doctors; supporters pray for her recovery

Chennai: Tamil Nadu Chief Minister J Jayalalitha, said to be critical after suffering a cardiac arrest, on Monday continued to remain under close watch of an expert team of doctors at the Apollo Hospitals where she has been undergoing treatment for more than two months.

Doctors were closely monitoring the condition of Jayalalitha and trying their "very best", the hospital said early on Monday, hours after she suffered the cardiac arrest. The 68-year-old Jayalalitha has been put on extracorporeal membrane oxygenation (ECMO), a heart assist device, and was under the watch of experts, including cardiologists.

A large number of AIADMK cadres, including women, anxiously stayed put outside the hospital, which has been covered in a thick blanket of security. Worried party supporters

continued to pray for her recovery.

State DGP TK Rajendran on Sunday asked all police personnel to remain on duty from Monday "until further orders". "They should report in full uniform with their vehicles for law and order duty until further orders," he said.

Announcing the sudden deterioration in health, a statement by Chief Operating Officer and head of transformation of Apollo Hospitals Dr Subbaiah Viswanathan on Sunday night said, "she is being treated and monitored by a team of experts, including cardiologists, pulmonologist and critical care specialists".

Following the development, Tamil Nadu Governor Ch Vidyasagar Rao, who is also the Governor of Maharashtra, airdashed to the city from Mumbai and visited Apollo Hospitals on Sunday night. Union Minister Pon



Radhakrishnan, who arrived at the airport here on Monday morning, said all BJP leaders, including Prime Minister Narendra Modi, wished for a complete recovery of Jayalalitha and they were praying for her. He expressed confidence that Jayalalitha would soon recover and resume official duties. AIADMK ministers, who stayed put at the hospital since Sunday, left on Monday morning. They did not talk to the waiting mediapersons. Party workers, who had gathered in large numbers outside

the hospital after news of her cardiac arrest broke, braved midnight rains and continued to wait outside, praying for the recovery of 'Amma' (mother), as she is fondly called by her supporters.

Actor and party supporter, 'Gundu' Kalyanam, said the party workers had faith in the divine power and expressed confidence that Jayalalitha would recover.

President Pranab Mukherjee, DMK leader M Karunanidhi, his son and opposition leader K Stalin, Union Ministers, Congress leader Rahul Gandhi, chief ministers and a host of leaders have expressed concern over Jayalalitha's health condition and wished her speedy recovery. Jayalalitha was admitted to the hospital on September 22 after she complained of fever and dehydration, and was later treated for infection and respiratory problem.

RBI to issue new `20, `50 notes, old ones to be valid

New Delhi: The Reserve Bank of India announced on Sunday it will issue new sets of `50 and `20 notes that have to carry the year of printing, 2016, on the reverse side of the currency.

All older notes will continue to be legal tender. Documents posted on the central bank's website said the RBI will shortly issue `50 banknotes without an inset letter in both the number panels and will carry the signature of governor Urjit Patel.

The `20 banknote will have the inset letter 'L' in both number panels and carry Patel's signature. The security features of both banknotes will continue to be similar to the currency in circulation at present.

The inset letter is considered an additional security feature for a banknote that is said to indicate the press at which the currency denomination has been printed. The Mahatma Gandhi series of notes are called so because they prominently display Gandhi's portrait on the obverse side.

The issuance of new notes comes at a time the country is grappling with a cash crunch following the recall of `500 and `1,000 notes three weeks back in a bid to drain illegal cash from the economy. Millions of people have lined up outside banks and ATMs but have often gone home back dissatisfied because authorities have little cash to disburse as 86% of the currency in circulation has been taken off the market.
