This was informed by Dr. Vijay Pothkuchi, Rohit's father, a corporate leader and a management researcher with over 30 years of association with multinationals in the USA, India and East Africa, while speaking in seminar at Vidya Bhawan Polytechnic College, Udaipur on Saturday. There are two Verdentum products: Verdentum Professional and Verdentum.org. Verdentum.org is more focused on allowing volunteers to work on projects at a global or regional scale through collaboration and collection/sharing of data, while Verdentum Pro is intended for development organizations needing customized products to coordinate and collect data on development projects.

Verdentum is currently being used by a number of leading organizations in the development space. The Rural Development Trust (Ananthapur), the Nligiri Adivasi Welfare Association, and Accion Fraterna have already started implementation and several larger organizations are in the process of starting implementation—including HelpAge India, Amul, and IDMC. We are also in conversation with numerous international bodies, including UN Women and Brooke.

Verdentum's supporters include Physics Nobel Laureate Dr. John C. Mather and advisors include David Wilkins (Vice Dean, Harvard Law School), Peter Robertson (former Vice Chairman of the Board, Chevron) and KY Amoako (former head of the UN Economic Commission for Africa).

Verdentum is relevant in the context of India where there is little availability of internet in rural and remote areas as it works offline too.

## Increase in FDI in Pharmaceutical Industry make medicines out of reach of the common man



**Udaipur:** "Increasing FDI in the Pharmaceutical Industry will eat away the job opportunities for the young people of the country and also make the prices of medicines soars high that the medicines will be out of the reach of the common man." This was stated by comrade Rakesh, Vice President of Tajasthan Medical and Sales Representatives Union in the inaugural address of the annual general body meeting of the Union held on Sunday at Shirali Bhavan Udaipur. He said that the state government is praising itself for checking the prices of stunt used in heart ailments, but the

reality is that the prices have been checked under the pressure of the Union. He said that no GST used be charged on medicines. He said that the Union government has allowed 100% FDI in pharmaceutical industry. This will make this industry dependent on foreign companies and make com-

mon people incapable of buying medicines.

Surendra Singh, secretary of the district committee raised the issues of the Medical representatives and expressed the demand of the members and said that the organization will fight for recognition of trade union in all companies, formation of grievance committee, regular wage settlement and check all kinds of victimization of the members for working in the union. He presented the report of the Udaipur unit of the committee.

Comrade Saurabh Gautam criticized the anti labour policies of the central and union government. He said that the interest rate of PF contribution was decreased from 8.8% to 8.6% by Employees Provident Fund Organization in its meeting on 19 th Dec. 2016. After fierce opposition by all the trade

unions except BMS, it was raised to 8.65%. This decrease was done because the central government had invested 6168.15 crore rupees in share market which got reduced to 5920 crore rupees. To meet this loss the government reduced the interest rates on PF contribution.

Former Zonal Secretary of All India Federation of Universities and College Teachers Organizations (AIFUCTO) Prof. Hemendra Chandalia said that since 1991 the policies of the union governments have been anti-labour. He said that nearly 94% of the work force in the country is in the unorganized sector who are the worst sufferers of the policies of LPG. He demanded that the teachers and employees of private colleges and universities, Engineers in IT industry and other middle class workers

should be organized in trade unions in order to fight the anti worker policies the world over. President of the district committee of Center of Indian Trade Unions (CITU) Rajesh Singhvi said that all trade union activists need to unite and help in each others struggles. He said that the state government has withdrawn the hike in electricity rates only because of the farmers agitation led by the Kisan Sabha not on its own. He said that the electricity rates raised for the urban population has not been withdrawn. This calls for another movement in the towns and cities of the state. District Secretary of the CPI(M) Comrade Mohan Lal Khokawat and secretary of CITU comrade Shamsher Singh Nandwani were also among the speakers of the day. The programme was convened by comrade Pradeep Singh.

## Awareness programme organized



**Udaipur:** An awareness programme was organized by the Department of Telecommunications (DoT), Min. of Communications on Electromagnetic Field (EMF) Emissions and Mobile Towers. This is part of a nationwide public outreach campaign to dispel myths about EMF Emissions and quell unfounded fears of citizens through scientific evidence. Rameo Arya, Deputy Director General Rajasthan, delivered the inaugural address highlighting the importance of mobile connectivity across the state and emphasizing on the need of cultivating a scientific temper and deepening collaboration between the public, Government and industry for growth and progress of Rajasthan. Dr. Arun Chougule, Professor & Head, Department of

Radiological Physics, SMS Medical College, Jaipur, Shanti Lal Meghwal, Zila Pramukh Udaipur, Shri Ravinder Shrimali, UIT Chairman & Secy of Udaipur Smart City, Shri J. Premraj, Director (TERM-DoT), Rajasthan graced the occasion as the Speakers of this programme. Shri Lokesh Dwivedi, Deputy Mayor, Udaipur along with other senior officers from the Central Government, States of Rajasthan, eminent persons and public representatives were also present. An expert panel comprising of telecom officers and doctors presented the scientific facts clarifying various myths on possible health hazards from mobile tower radiation. Delivering the welcome address, Shri J. Premraj, Director, TERM-DoT said, that there is no scientific evidence

backing the claim that EMF radiation from mobile towers, which are below the safe limits prescribed by the International Commission on Non-ionizing Radiation Protection (ICNIRP) and recommended by the World Health Organization (WHO), can cause adverse health effects. Shri Shanti Lal Meghwal, Zila Pramukh Udaipur told "The misconception with our population in villages on EMF emission is wrong and installation of towers should be allowed in their respective locality".

Mr Arya pointed out that WHO has referred to approximately 25,000 studies, conducted around the world over the past 30 years, and based on an in-depth review of scientific literature, has concluded: "Despite the feeling of some people that more research

needs to be done, scientific knowledge in this area is now more extensive than for most chemicals. Current evidence does not confirm the existence of any health consequences from exposure to low level electromagnetic fields."

In the next session of Friday, actual site testing was carried out to measure electromagnetic frequency (EMF) emissions from mobile towers in Udaipur.

It was found that the mobile towers in Udaipur were transmitting well within permissible limits and, in fact, in most cases much lower than the prescribed limits in India. The testing was conducted for BTS at Hotel Damanis, Chatak Circle Udaipur and the results were shared with the people present at the sites, stating that all towers are safe, substantiated by the low levels of radiation that showed up in the tests. In fact, the average radiation from towers monitored in three locations was 2.29 % of the limits set by the Department of Telecommunications (DoT), well within the prescribed limits. The level of emission at Hotel Damanis, Chatak Circle was 23.716 milliwatts per sq. mtr. (mwpsm). The next locations tested were BSNL Office and SBI Building, Chatak Circle which also had readings of 4.0 milliwatts psqm and 3.4 milliwatts psqm respectively.
