These Android Smart phones will enable the visually impaired students to 'Read & Write' using Accessibility Features on the device. These phones will allow these students to access their textbooks in DAISY format from the world's largest Online Library for the Print Disabled - 'Bookshare'. This will bring these students at par with other students by allowing them to comprehend, read and prepare their academic content for better understanding hence making them competitive & ready for any exam. These Accessible devices will also allow the students to access the power of the internet and also gain worldly knowledge. They will also be able to enjoy games specially designed for Blind users on their phones. The report says, India is home to the world's largest number of blind people. Out of 37 million people across the globe who are blind, over 15 million are from India. It is also known that quality education is an absolute necessity in order to succeed and progress in this knowledge driven world. Most of the current educational curriculum is oriented towards the use of the eyesight thus posing paramount challenges to the blind and visually impaired students.

Many organizations are working consciously and tirelessly to ensure these children get their due attention. Through Jeevan Tarang, Hindustan Zinc has provided these Android phones to the students from Class 1st- Class 5th of Pragya Chakshu School, Udaipur and to all the students of Badhir Baal Kalyan Vikas Samiti, Bhilwara accessing them the basic human right to educate & learn, a critical step on the path to economic, educational, and social development. Political parties and expensive elections are the root causes of corruption: Arun Kumar Shrivastav

Udaipur: "Political parties and the expensive elections in which millions are spent are the root causes of corruption in the country. Therefore the need of the hour is to hold all elections of the country simultaneously. Also, the income generated by the political leaders disproportionately must be confiscated by the state. There is a need to rouse the consciousness of the political workers and aim at electoral reforms." This was stated by Arun Kumar Shrivastav, founder of a Ngo named Fight Against Corruption Through Electoral Reforms, New Delhi. He was delivering the Fateh Kunwar Seth Memorial Lecture in Udaipur on Saturday. The title of the lecture was "Chunav aur Bhrastachar: Badlav ki

Apekshayen". He claimed that in 2014 Lok Sabha elections BJP spent some 40,000 crores while Congress spent Rs. 7000 crores. The election Commission has laid the limit of Rs. 25 Lakhs for Assembly elections and Rs. 75 Lakhs for Parliamentary elections. This is too much. How can a common political worker manage to spend this much, he asked. But the truth is, in every election at all constituencies this limit is crossed. Who funds these elections? If the capitalists do it, then they are bound to reap the benefits once the people they supported come to power. This is what is happening now. The capitalists funded the BJP and are now reaping the benefits. He said that there is no inner party democ-

racy in any political party. Those who have control over the finances command all. He claimed that Narendra Modi emerged as Prime Minister simply because only he could mobilize those 40 thousand crores which BJP spent in electioneering. Advani and other leaders could not do so, therefore they had to retire. He said that in Bihar elections BJP used 22 helicopters. Congress, RJD, and Janata Dal-United together had three. This expenditure in elections must stop if we want to control corruption, he said. The function was chaired by former Chairperson of Institution of Engineers, Udaipur chapter. He endorsed the views of Arun Shrivastav and added that poverty alleviation is the key to fighting the menace of corrup-



tion. In the beginning, Prof. Hemendra Chandalia, Editor of Mahavir Samta Sandesh welcomed the guests and presented the outline of the issue. He stated that corruption is not just financial. Keeping a large

part of the population in constant fear and insecurity is also corruption. maintained that the union government has failed to fulfill the promises made before 2014 elections and has started the dirty game of communal

divide. Harish Suhalka offered a vote of thanks. Engineer Piyush Joshi, Arjun Dan Daittha, State President of Janta Dal-Secular, Ashok Manthan etc. Participated in the discussion that followed.

Milk - 1 liter, Jaggery grated-1 cup, Yogurt 1/2 teaspoon

In the year 1960, the department of post of government of India issued seven stamps

The first issue was on famous philosopher Thiruvalluvar of 15 Paise on 15 February. After this second in the series were two stamps on the famous poet and dramatist Kallidas portraying Yaksha appealing to the clouds from meghduta of 15 Paise and Shakuntala writing a letter to king Dushyant of 1 rupee and 3 Paise.

Next in the series was stamped on Subramania Bharati with the price of 15 Paise on 11 September followed by the stamp on the occasion of birth centenary of Dr. Visvesvaraya who was famous engineer and industrialist on 15 September with the price of 15 Paise.

On 14 November a stamp on National Children's day was issued with the price of 15 Paise. The last issue of this year was the stamp UNICEF day portraying children greeting UNICEF emblem on 11 December with price of 15 Paise.
