

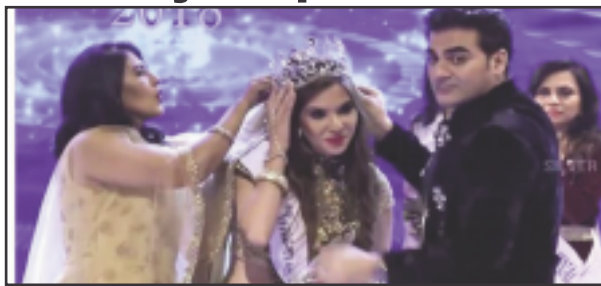


Literary and Cultural Festivals 'Jhankar-2018' concludes

Aackriti Malik won the country's top model title

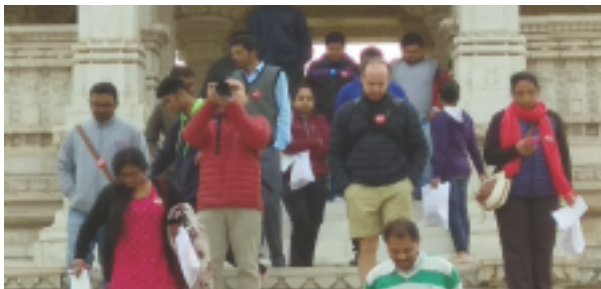

Jaipur: Rajasthan chief minister Vasundhara Raje today announced one-time loan waiver of up to Rs 50,000 for small and marginal farmers in the state, which would cost Rs 8,000 crore to the exchequer.Presenting the state budget in the Assembly, Raje also announced setting up a farmer loan relief commission where farmers can approach and present their side for getting relief on merit basis. As Raje, who also holds finance portfolio, announced the loan waiver, opposition Congress members led by the leader of opposition Rameshwar Dudi created uproar in the house. They said it was betrayal with farmers and the complete loan should be waived.

50 Differently-Abled, Poor Couples Get Married In Mass Wedding Ceremony In Delhi

"The mass wedding was organized by Narayan Seva Sansthan in Delhi's at Rajouri Garden"
New Delhi: At least 50 differently-abled and financially challenged couples got married at a mass wedding ceremony organized by Narayan Seva Sansthan on Sunday. These included differently-abled couples from Rajasthan, Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh. Family members and friends of the brides and grooms also joined the celebration.

The charitable trust, identified as Narayan Seva Sansthan, said that they had organized the ceremony "as a sign of solidarity towards the community". "The mass wedding ceremony is an endeavor from our side to elevate these individuals to become fully-functioning members of the society," the organization said, in a release.

It added, "Disability shouldn't inhibit one in any aspect, be it professional or personal sphere."

Prashant Agarwal, the president of Narayan Seva Sansthan, said that most of the young men and women who tied the knots had met during the course of free-of-cost corrective surgery at the hospital. Mr. Agarwal further added that the organization had also conducted a mass wedding ceremony of 92 couples in the national capital's Ramlila ground in June 2016.

The couples were also presented household items at the time of the 'Kanyadaan' ritual. "Families of the brides and grooms were treated with warmth as the marriages were performed with pomp and gaiety. Necessary household items were also distributed among the predestined brides and bridegrooms at the time of 'kanyadaan'," the organization said, in a release.

The event was attended by founder president Kailash Manav, Kailash Bhatnagar (Canada), co-founder Kamala Devi Agrawal, Bhagwan M. Venkatraman of Vrindavan, Dr. Sanjay Krishna, G. Salii, Pt. Sanjeev Krishan Thakur, Director Vandana Agarwal,

Bandoli was taken in the Rajouri Garden area at 9.30 am with traditional wedding songs of all 50 pairs. In the traditional costumes, groomed bride and groom were boarded in fancily decorated gardens. The front of bandoli was the band of band wishers, while the drummer in the middle behind the band's squad, the attendants and the relatives of couples who were attending the ceremony from different parts of the country were walking and dancing.

Director Vandana Agarwal and President Prashant Agarwal paid the ritual of the groom from the bridegroom. During this, there were rains of rose feathers on pairs.

When a disabled bride came with the help of crutches, the bride came in the lap of her family. For seven rounds, there was a teacher with puja and havan material on each altar. Who completed the Panigarjan sankar under in the direction of Chief Acharya Pandit Harish Pandey. In the ceremony, selected Divyangjan were also provided necessary equipments such as tricycle, wheelchair, walker, crutch, blind stick, hearing aid etc. In order to connect the poor and the people of Swayambhangan with the help of self-employment, they were fired from the vegetables and tea and breakfast and even sewing machines were distributed. After the marriage was concluded, the founder of Kailash Manav, President Prashant Agrawal, director Vandana Agarwal, Devendra Chobisa, New Delhi Ashram in-charge Suresh Singh Bhati, Dalla ram Patel in charge, Deepak Manaria, Rohit Tiwari and the guests were blessed with them for their new future.
