## 'Break the silence, talk openly' campaign in full swing



**Udaipur:** The first phase of 'Break the silence, openly talk' campaign being run in Udaipur district for girl child health and education has been successfully completed and 19 thousand 373 girls have been benefited so far.

District collector Mrs. Anandi said that in the first phase, this campaign was started in Jhadol, Kotra, Phalasia, and Saizada in July and in the campaign, health checkup of girl students was conducted in 280 schools. At present, the campaign is going on continuously and in the second phase also, the activ-

ities of the campaign are conducted daily in the schools of the four blocks.

She informed that teams of the medical department have reached 24 schools for dialogue and health check on menstrual hygiene through this campaign. The team not only treated but advised 61 girls as well as 39 mothers how to keep healthy and wealthy.

JyotiKakwani, the Nodal Officer of the campaign said that under the campaign, in the Sarada block, the hamlet of the peasants in Palodraa, Mahuwara, Dhavadia, Semari, Sallada, Sadimgari, Kherwara, Senior Upadhyaya Sanskrit school and Higher Secondary Badla and In Rishabhdev, programs will be organized in schools in Kojawada, PereraJagiri, and Jalpaka.

JyotiKakwani, the Nodal Officer of the campaign said that in this campaign, the medical interns of RNT Medical College, Geetanjali Medical College and Pacific Medical College and humanitarian voluntary organization have been special support.

All medical interns are regularly visiting everyday schools of four blocks, through dialogue and queries from the girls on monthly sanitation through film and dialogue.

During this campaign, two days before the education department and women and child development department, women of the village are being invited to the school for 'Break the silence' program so that mothers can also be familiar with this sensitive subject. So far about 6 thousand women have also benefitted from this campaign.

### Treatment with Dialogue:

DM told that during the 'Break the silence, talk openly' the campaign, along with the dialogue, every school is also being ensured that every student gets a health check-up by the medical team of RBSK and the students whose hemoglobin according to the health protocol They are specially treated.

So far, 189 out students examined have been found less than 8 and in total 17 girls have got less than 5

these girls have been referred to the Maharana Bhopal hospital. In the campaign, Informational Handbook has been distributed on 'My body, my talk' and 'Menstruation hygiene for juveniles' by the Department of Women and Child Development.

### Rajasthan Government won the battle of possession of historic Udaipur House in New Delhi

Rajasthan government's long-awaited battle for the possession of historic Udaipur House in New Delhi has come to rest with the recent directives of Supreme Court. The property is situated near the Tees Hazari court at Civil Lines in Delhi. The Historic building was built before Independence by the then ruling Maharana of Mewar, which was occupied by Delhi government post-independence.

The majestic building is sprawling over 12000 meters of land at a prime location of Delhi, whose current worth is evaluated around 1500 crore. Before Independence, when Luteyn's Delhi was being designed, the property was built by Udaipur's Royal family. That time the British asked the Maharana of Udaipur to build a mansion in Delhi like other princely houses.

Post-independence Delhi government was granted the possession only for use. However, in 2010, Ashok Gehlot, the then Chief Minister of Rajasthan held talks with Delhi government to hand over the property back to Rajasthan, but the plea was declined. Following which the government took the issue to Supreme Court.

Recently Supreme Court issued directives to both the governments to settle the issue. After which a meeting among the representatives from Rajasthan and Delhi was held, where it was decided to hand over the property to Rajasthan government.

### Now DL and RC by post

**Udaipur:** As per the decision taken by Government, driving license and vehicle registration certificate will now reach directly to the residence of an applicant by post. The decision has been taken to avoid the hassles faced by consumers while visiting the middle-men or the agents for their vehicle's license and registration work.

Similar to passport delivery by post, DL and RC will now be delivered at your doorstep. Some of the DLs and RCs have been already been dispatched will be a 24 hour delivery by post. Regional transport office receives applications for 450 RCs and around 250 DLs per day.

After the formalities, the applicants have to visit the RTO to pick their licenses or registrations on working days.
