## Nationwide campaign to reach customers of banks started

**Udaipur:** State Bank of India in Udaipur district, as part of a nationwide campaign to reach out to customers of public sector banks & share the joys of the festival after the bank received a two-day event for the district's customers completed. The committee started in the Girwa campus. This is the first time since the consensus held in the meeting held in the Union Finance Ministry when so many banks are converging at one place and working in the interest of consumers.

State Bank of India Deputy General Manager S Vijay Kumar said that under the first phase, this is being done in Udaipur city in a series of events in 250 districts across the country, in which about

35 public-non-government banks and non-banking financial institutions Car dealers and builders participated & shared information to consumers about the various schemes and programs of the bank, it is benefiting from the loan schemes.

A lot of enthusiasm was seen among the consumers and a large number of urban and rural bank consumers reached here and took information about banking schemes. Consumers, along with knowing the process of downloading Bhima, Yono app, got the entries in Aadhar card rectified and got information about various agricultural loan schemes. Financial inclusion and digi-



tal payments and transactions were also given to the bank customers during the program.

Union Finance Secretary Rajiv Kumar

also came to take stock of this camp of Girwa organized in the interest of consumers and expressed happiness over the activities.

He said that the result of the suggestions being made in the banking sector in the last two-three years is that now the public sector banks have become stronger and banks themselves are reaching out to consumers by taking initiative.

He said that it is pleasant that after the reforms in the banking sector, 14 government sector banks have also entered the profit and consumers are getting better services.

In view of the enthusiasm of consumers benefiting from bank schemes, this two-day camp in Girwa has been extended by one more day. Now this camp will be held on 5 October.

Consumers happy with hand loan: Under the fair, each stall was decorated in a grand pandal with its own stall. On a large LCD screen, various products of various banks were being promoted and interviews with beneficiaries were also being broadcast.

Banks disbursed several loans to the people through online services on the occasion. Approval of 22 housing loans, 32 vehicle loans, and 25 e-Mudra loans were issued by State Bank of India. Similarly, by sanctioning 24 house loans, 15 vehicle loans, 2 education loans and 56 Mudra loans by other banks, hand over acceptance letter along with an interview of a beneficiary on stage.

## Conclave for sustainable agriculture arid and semi-arid areas



**Udaipur:** "A 21-day national training has begun on 03rd entitled "Increase in Water Productivity in Arid and Semi-Arid Areas for Sustainable Agriculture" by the Indian Council of Agricultural Research, New Delhi under the aegis of Maharana Pratap University of Agriculture and Technology, Udaipur, Department of Water and Soil Conservation Engineering, College of Technology and Engineering, Udaipur .

Dr. KK Yadav, Training In-charge, Maharana Pratap Agricultural and Technological University, Udaipur, told that in this 21-day training, various Indian Council of Agricultural Research of 6 states (Gujarat, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Telangana, Karnataka, Punjab and Rajasthan) of the country, New Delhi 25 scientists from institutes and agricultural universities are participating.

In the inaugural session of this training, Dr. Narendra Singh Rathore, Vice Chancellor, Maharana Pratap University of

Agriculture and Technology, Udaipur said that there is a need for the planned use of water in food production. He said that in our nation, food production per water unit, compared to other nations, is more, while the irrigated area is the highest in India. He said that water is most used in rice and meat production. The current training is relevant and its useful importance is to increase water productivity in agriculture.

The chairman of the program, Dr. Ajay Kumar Sharma, Dean, Technology and Engineering College, Udaipur, gave the outline of the 21-day training program and gave information about various activities to be done in the college. Speaking as guest of honor, Dr. Prabhakar Nanda, Project Coordinator, Institute of Water Management, Bhubaneswar told that it is necessary to increase water productivity in agricultural irrigation by incorporating new technologies. Because the per capita water availability in the country is constantly eroding, it is necessary to secure water for the future. For this, drip and sprinkler irrigation system should be adopted. Research Director Dr. A.K. Mehta addressing the participants said that today is the time for mechanization in agriculture and new technologies developed in the irrigation sector should also be disseminated. He insisted on taking more crops per drop, which is also the view of Hon'ble Prime Minister.

Head of Department Dr. Mahesh Kothari welcomed the guests and highlighted the need for the current training. Dr. PK Singh proposed a vote of thanks.
