Due to the high cost of treatment of this disease, the entire treatment of the patient was made free under the Bhamashah Yojana. The patient was kept in ICU for some time, which led to an improvement in his condition, on which he was shifted to the ward. The patient was discharged from the hospital when he was completely healthy.
