Putul Yatra- National Puppet Festival enthralls

New Delhi recently brought a treasure of traditional and contemporary Puppet shows of India during "Putul Yatra"(National Puppet Festival) held from 14th to 18 November 2019 at Bhartiya Lok Kala Mandal, Udaipur. It was a rare opportunity to watch the finest puppet groups of India with their tremendous talent.

I had a great time interacting with Puppet wizard Padmashri Suresh Dutta from Kolkata and Padmashri Dadi Padamii from Delhi along with senior puppeteers and National Awardees who graced the Festival with their august presence.

The play "Ichchapooran" based on the story of Gurudev Ravindranath Tagore was a masterpiece directed by Padmshri Suresh Dutta imbibing rod puppets, Human characters and by a huge puppet of Devi Ichchapoorani manipulated by two artistes. This play had elaborate sets and Music.

'Srirama institute of Shadow Theatre', Ananda Ashram, Kutarimunda, District Angul, Odisha, presented the play "Kranti of Pandit Jawahar Lal Nehru, the first Prime Minister of India. This play marked the celebration of his Birth Day as Bal Diwas. This was directed by Gaurang Charan Das, a senior Puppeteer of Odisha. Swami Vivekanand' was a play based on the short thematic stories of Swami Vivekanand since his childhood mentioning his philosophy. This string Puppet production of Bhartiya Lok Kala Mandal, Udaipur was directed by Dr. Laique Hussain. 'Gulabo Sitabo' a glove puppet showcased age-old traditional puppets of Lukhnow, UP directed by Pradeep Nath Tripathi. The traditional Shadow Puppetry group from Tamil Nadu 'The Indian Puppeteers' showcased tremendous talent in their Shadow play 'Sita ki khoj' under the leadership of senior stalwart of Puppetry Guru Sita Laksmi Shahukaru. Prabhitanshu Das of Tripura presented Chandalika' play of Gurudev Ravindranath Tagore with elaborate light and sound effects. His team, Tripura Puppet Theatre used contemporary Rod Puppets, 'Meher



the Troupe", Ahmedabad staged comedy play "Dalo Talwadi" which was directed by Man Singh Jhala.

Tholpavakoothu, A unique Shadow Puppet Theatre School of Kerala presented episodes from Ramayana using around 120 leather puppets, most of them around 150 to 200 years old. Some old puppets were made of Dear skin. The performance had dialogues in Sanskrit, Tamil, and Malavalam.

All the artistes were in traditional attire

with traditional instruments like Chenda. Ezhupara, and Ilathalm. They had lit 21 lamps behind the white screen.

"Dolls Theatre, Kolkata" under the creative direction of Sudeep Gupta presented yet another landmark puppet show "Taming the Wild" propagating themes to save mother nature. He used special Light effects, Black Theatre Technique, and the most appropriate Music. It was studded with very effective Mimeand Movements. Group from Delhi.

form Municipal board again, 6 times in a row.

Out of 70 constituencies in Udaipur BJP is able to retain not only in power but 44 out of 70 it's a good figure in spite of Congress wave and undercurrent against

Recently elections for 49 boards were conducted by election commission Rajasthan Udaipur is the only Nagar Nigam, where BJP is all set to get its mayor again. In 17 Nagar Nigam / Municipal Council election held Congress was able to get 9 votes while, BJP has to retain only one in Udaipur, rest 7 are be dependent on Independent

It seems that Congress will able to get in power in most Municipal Council / Nigams where the fate of the board is to be decided by independent. As per Nagar Palika are concern Congress was able to get clear mandate 11 boards, While BJP should get satisfied with five for, rest 13 the magic figures rest with independent.

It's clear that like previous election urban people are of the view that they prefer state Municipal combination for development. In the recent Lok Sabha election held19, BJP was able to clean sweep in all 25 Lok Sabha seats. There verdict BJP is Confine on nationalism and its commitment to financial reforms. No doubt in magic to Modi continue in a row second time in Lok Sabha. On contrary to the Hippocratic and aristocrat politics along with arbitrary Roll of Vasundhara was rejected by people and Express faith in Ashok Gahlot. In recent municipal elections despite abolished section 370 and Ram Mandir. BJP failed to get an advantage in this election on the contrary public showed faith in Ashok Gehlot.

The results were a setback for the BJP which has traditionally been strong in urban areas. The saffron party managed to win a clear majority in only six urban local bodies The consolation for the party was that managed to retain the Udaipur municipal corporations and won more seats than the Congress in the Bharatpur municipal corporation.

The Congress got 36.67 percent vote share in the polls while the BJP got 33.43 percent and independents got 27 percent.

In the face of fierce public anger against the mayor, Chandra Singh Kothari and team new faces were given tickets as per strategy. BJP get success in this election on the contrary Congress was failed to encash drawbacks and anti-incumbency.

The triumph card of Katariya was to propose Govind Singh tank as Mayor candidate. technocrat Govind Singh tank is RSS face and known for his foresighted reason for the development in RPSC chairman for 3 years. A number of projects he designs cost less than 50% of the DPR design by government officials. As he was declared an RSS candidate for Mayor. RSS team gets activated fully in this elec-

Now it's clear that Tak will be next mayor for Udaipur thanks to Kataria for his well-planned foresight vision for Udaipur. Congress is likely to fight Arun talk for the post of Mayor as a candidate policymakers and dynamic CM will try to get rift in BJP so that yet another Tak May chair Municipal Council but it seems next to impossi-

CWC Member Raghuveer Meena said, "We have a clear majority in 23 of the local bodies and we will form the board in another eight."

Political analyst Abbas Rizavi said the results were a relief for the Congress. "Despite the infighting in the party, the Congress has managed a good show. The results will strengthen Gehlot's position in the party."He said after the Lok Sabha the party was demoralised but with the win in the bypolls and the civic polls, the party functionaries will work with renewed vigour. out Of the total 2105 wards, Congress won in 961while the BJP won 737. Independents won in 386 wards while the BSP notched a win in 16 and the CPIM in 2.

.Dr Girija Vyas said the results were an endorsement of the work done by the Gehlot government and had broken BJP's illusion that it is strong in urban areas.

BJP tried to highlight issues of nationalism, the SC verdict on the Ram temple, abrogation of article 370 but these issues did not cut ice with the people. BJP also tried to pin down the government on the issues of failure to deliver on farm of loan waiver, unemployment dole and the rising crime rate, reimposing the toll tax on state highways. But voters seem to have rejected these issues too, adds Rizvi

Hindu dharma doesn't practice gender discrimination

New Delhi: On Sabarimala issue Vishva Hindu Parishad (VHP) today said that Unique Tradition of a unique Temple is not Gender discrimination. VHP secretary general shri Milind Parande said that Hindu dharma doesn't practice gender discrimination and the Sabarimala case is nowhere related to any gender discrimination but in true sense it relates to unique tradition of an unique temple.

On the 3:2 majority ruling of the apex court to send the case to a larger bench, Shri Parande expressed hope that the larger bench will also think whether the judiciary should interfere in the integral part of a religion? Out of many temples of lord Ayyappa, only Sabarimala has the limited age related(10 to 50 years) restrictions because of its unique nature and traditions. Lakhs of women devotees have faith in the temple tradition and protested in huge numbers in support of it.
