Dr. Raghu Sharma Inaugurated development works at Haribhau Upadhyay Women's College



Ajmer: Medical and Public Relations Minister Dr. Raghu Sharma said that the youth's ethos should have been dedicated to the great men of the country like Pt Nehru and their whole life struggle for freedom, unity, and progress of the country. Today, unfortunately, facts are missing on social media. The condition of the country's economy is Odd in the situation. Policymakers meeting at the center should work to improve the situation. Medical Minister Dr. Raghu Sharma inaugurated the development works at Janardan Rai Nagar Rajasthan

Vidyapeeth Haribhau Upadhyay Women's College in Ajmer. He said that in the present condition of the country, the youth should learn from the lives of great men like the first Prime Minister of the country, Shri Jawaharlal Nehru, Shri Janardan Rai Nagar and Shri Haribhau Upadhyay, Nehru Ji spent 12 years of his life in jail. Pt.Nehru made the country economically social, educationally and technologically prosperous as Prime Minister. The present form of the country is due to the sacrifice of our mass heroes. He said that today people are being misled by twisting facts and history through social media. Youth should avoid such misinformation. The country faces the challenges of the economy, unemployment, and other challenges. Policymakers sitting at the center should focus on resolving these problems. Dr. Sharma said that the development of society is possible with the empowerment of women. Former Prime Minister Shri Rajiv Gandhi amended the Constitution to provide reservation to women in Panchayati Raj and civic bod-

ies. UPA President Smt. Sonia Gandhi is also making efforts for 33% reservation in Parliament and Legislative Assemblies. The state government is working seriously for the upliftment of women. The Medical Minister said that Rajasthan is the first state in the country which is going to give the right to health to more than 7 crore population. Our medical especially free medicine and screening scheme is the top in the whole country. Action will be taken against any doctor in any hospital if he writes medicines outside the hospital.

National Secretary Shri Dheeraj Gurjar said that society will progress only with the advancement of women. Only an educated society moves forward. He urged the Medical Minister to remove the problems of the college.

The Kul pramukh & chancellor of Rajasthan Vidyapeeth, B. L. Gurjar informed about the progress of the institute in his speech he stressed the need the all-time development of women in society while paying floral tribute to Haribhau Upadhyay, he said that his vision to the upliftment of women is inspired with Gandhijee. Gurjar raised the issues of drinking water, financial support, and civic amenities for Hatundi, later minister announced to resolve Gurjar shared



in brief about Hari Bhou "Hari bhau was born in 1892 at Bhaurasa village in present-day Dewas of Madhya Pradesh. In 1952, he was elected to the Ajmer Legislative Assembly from Shrinagar constituency as an Indian National Congress candidate and became the Chief Minister of Ajmer state from 24 March 1952 to 31 October 1956.

He was elected to the Rajasthan Legislative Assembly in 1957 from Kekri constituency and served as the Finance minister in Rajasthan government from 1957-62. He was re-elected to the

Rajasthan Legislative Assembly from the same constituency and served as the Education Minister in Rajasthan government from 1962-67. He was awarded Padma Bhushan in 1966. He died on 25 August 1972."

Vice-Chancellor Prof. S.S. Sarangadevot welcomed guests and hatundiries for their support and presence. Several dignitaries including former MLA Mahendra Singh Gurjar and Ramnarayan Gurjar were present on the occasion.

The Medical Minister also offered

Haribhau Upadhyay Women's College and village in his tour of Hatundi. The college administration demanded water from the Baisalpur line.

Dr. Sharma instructed the departmental officers on the spot to start work immediately by making proposals. Similarly, on the demand for a 100 ft road in the village, he asked the officials of the department to start work.

LIGHT HOUSE OF AYURVED SINDHI BAZAR



Udaipur:(Ashok Mathur) It is mainly due to the total commitments, firm determination, deep concern for the Welfare of the sick and innovative ideas of Vaidya Shobha Lal Audichya that the small-government Ayurvedic AUSHADHALAYA in Sindhi Bazar established in 1967 has become a role model for all the other hospitals in the state of Rajasthan.

Entering it through a glass door like a private hospital, it is difficult to believe that this three-story building has all the facilities like space for daily yoga practice, all kind of Panchakarma, modern gadgets, invert, RO etc

One is welcomed by smiling faces of the highly devoted supporting staff meeting the cheerful young Vaidya Audichya who listens patiently to the problems of the patient is in highly assuring experience in itself. Most of the medicines prescribed why him on the basis of his Long and rich experience are available free of charge. Some others are provided by the medicines Bank set up by him. He also recommends yoga exercises. In the waiting, hall are displayed posters showing ways of preventing and curing different diseases. The bank has distributed medicines worth over 15 lac.

The day here begins at 5:15 with prakitrik chikitsa and yogic exercises done by an average of over one hundred person every day under expert guidance. Person from outside Udaipur also participate.

Looking at the fast increasing number of diabetes patients, on the first Saturday of every month, is held special camp. The 150 camps arranged so far have benefited it over 30,000 patients and the number is increasing repeatedly. It is proposed to provide free medicines for one month to all the patients. In addition to this 5 special campus are organized on every



Wednesday for patients of Thyroid, Stone, Migraine, Infertility, Acidity, Joint pain, etc.

Audichya has also enthused patients who have already been cured to hold shradhanjali chikitsa Shivir in memory of their departed relatives in over 100 such campus since 2003 over 3 patients have been treated.

Audichya has also organized over 50 medical campus in the remote terrible areas for the benefit of those who have no medical facilities. He also visits ailing Sadhu Saints in remote and distant areas in Rajasthan and even other states.

He participates actively in activities related to the promotion of Ayurved by delivering talks in Schools, Colleges and other workshop etc. So also in state level yoga Mela, International Yoga Diwas blood donation camps etc. He got planted thousands of Neem Giloy trees during the last monsoon season. No wonder for his commendable work, he has been honored with 60 kinds of awards by a different organization including district and state governments.

Congress dominates in election of local body chairpersons

Udaipur Division Local Body Elections | Congress heading the Board in Local elections in 3 constituencies, BJP in 2

Udaipur: BJP candidate Govind Singh Tak is new Mayor of the Udaipur Municipal Corporation. Govind Singh Tak received 46 votes, which was 2 votes more than BJP councillors elected in the UMC elections, the results for which were declared on 19 November. Congress candidate for the seat of Mayor, Arun Tak, received 20 votes, which is equal to the number of seats that the Congress won in the said election. 3 of the winning candidates did not cast their vote and one selected NOTA. The Congress candidates were elected as heads of 35 civic bodies, while the BJP contestants won in 13 seats and an independent in one. The ward councillors elected chairpersons in 46 local bodies, situated in 24 districts, on Tuesday, as the chairpersons in three civic bodies — Makrana Municipal Council and Rupbas and Nimbahera

municipalities — were earlier elected unopposed.

Abhijit Kumar of the Congress, who unsuccessfully fought the 2019 Lok Sabha election, was elected Mayor of Bharatpur Municipal Corporation. BJP's Sushila Kanwar and Govind Singh Tak won as Mayors of Municipal Corporations in Bikaner and Udaipur, respectively. Among the 17 Municipal Councils, the Congress candidates were elected chairpersons in 13, the BJP in three and an independent in one.

The Congress candidates won as chairpersons in 21 of the 29 municipalities and the BJP candidates in eight.

In the municipal election held on November 16, the Congress had obtained a clear majority in 20 local bodies, while the BJP's majority was confined to six. Prior to the election, the Congress and the BJP controlled 21 municipal bodies each and the remaining seven were with

were "fully satisfied" with the government's performance. "The Congress party is actively working for extending the benefits of welfare policies to the masses. Our chairpersons and councillors will work hard for development of urban areas."
