Kerala's fight against COVID-19 pandemic set to intensify, says new Chief Secretary

New Delhi: Kerala's new Chief secretary Dr. Vishwas Mehta Monday said the fight against COVID-19 was set to intensify with the resumption of land, air, and

The guard against the spread of the pandemic should evolve into a movement of the people, said Kerala's new Chief Secretary, Dr. Vishwas Mehta

After assuming office at the Government Secretariat here, Mr. Mehta said Kerala faced a particularly severe challenge in preventing the transmission of the disease from those bound home from epidemic hotspots within the country and abroad. The State also needed to tread cautiously so as not to cause new flareups when the economy opened up,

free travel resumed, and life shuffled back to normalcy. Mr. Mehta said the police might find it challenging to assign an officer to every home which had people in quarantine. Hence, the guard against the spread of the pandemic should evolve into a movement of the people. Members of the neighborhood watch, volunteers. and elected office-bearers of local selfgovernment institutions should forge themselves as a bulwark against the spread of the coronavirus. Individual citizens should view wearing masks, maintaining physical distance and following the health protocol as their civic responsibil-

Mr. Mehta indicated that the manner of the fight against the pandemic would change as the country eased COVID-19 lockdown restrictions and the diaspora returned home in higher numbers. Hence. the resistance against the spread of disease was likely to be a long haul.

He indicated that Kerala could not allow the pandemic to disrupt its "priority proiects". Pandemic prevention and the State's development have to go hand-in-

One day seminar on the future scenario of agriculture after Covid-19

Udaipur: A one-day seminar on the future and landscape of agriculture after Kovid-19 was organized at Maharana Pratap University of Agriculture and Technology, Udaipur, on the webinar. The workshop was organized by the Directorate of Research, Maharana Pratap University of Agriculture and Technology. Scientists from all over the world were invited to the seminar to discuss the agricultural landscape after Covid-19. In this, about 1000 scientists, students and officials of various universities, national agricultural institutes, agriculture departments have participated along with eminent subject experts

The seminar was chaired by the Vice-Chancellor Dr. Narendra Singh Rathore, in his presidential address, said that the impact of COVID-19 had been seen on a full scale in the agricultural industry and service sectors of the country. About 52% of the population in the country is dependent on agriculture, and 70% of the population lives in the village, for this, the production of functional quality foods, farm mechanization, use of intelligent intelligence in agriculture and smart to increase production and employment opportunities in the agriculture sector. In the COVID-19 pandemic, new opportunities to reach new dimensions to farmers have presented a new challenge to the country. Agricultural scientists should work on the development of village-based models in organic agriculture, integrated farming practices, market linkage, food processing, and farming industries.



Today, we have the challenge to achieve the target of producing 345 million tones of food in 2030 and given COVID-19, the emphasis has been laid on the health and nutrition of farm-

Dr. N. Ravi Shankar, Project Coordinator, Indian Institute of Agricultural Systems Research, Modi Puram, stated in his address that more than 45 integrated farming models had been developed to increase the income of the nation's farmers. With growing revenue, employment of 150 to 397 days can also be obtained through these advanced farming method models. There is a need to adopt diverse farming system models at the village level for quality food and pure environment during the COVID

In the seminar, Dr. Shailendra Singh Chauhan, Manager of the Regional Office of NABARD, told that for the availability, timely management of inputs after the Kovid epidemic, financial management and proper technical availability, farmers should benefit from various schemes of the Government of India related to the Producer Group. Drugs made to prevent corona infection and increase immunity

adan Mohan Malaviya Government Ayurveda College, Udaipur, has now taken the initiative to protect against corona infection and increase immunity and made from Ayurvedic herbs for immunity boosting by the committee of experts of the college. Three types of special medicine have been prepared.

The principal of the college Prof. Mahesh Dixit said that social distance, personal hygiene, and self-discipline to prevent corona infection, as well as Ayurveda medicines, can prevent disease and enhance immunity. Ministry of AYUSH has used Aayush decoction made from basil, dry gourd, cinnamon, black pepper to avoid the infection of Covid-19, use of turmeric in milk, and for the proper and optimum use of chemicals like Ashwagandha, Giloy, Mulethi, Pippali, etc. for the promotion of immunity. Guidelines have been

1500 kits of three medicine combo preparations: Pro. Dixit told that in the first phase, 1500 kits of three medicinal formulations to the people of Udaipur and adjoining areas, COVID Warriors, Police Administration, Media

personnel, etc., including Navrasayan Yoga, Mouth Wash, and Nasal Drop to be injected in the nose. All the drug formulations have been used in optimum quantity as directed by the Ministry of AYUSH in the medicine kit. IG and Collector released the guide:

Dixit said that a guide had been prepared by the committee of experts of the college and preparation of medicines, while a formulation has been prepared regarding immunity-boosting prepared by the college, in which necessary health improvement can be done by strengthening the routine. This guide was released by Inspector General of Police vinita Thakur and District Collector Smt Anandi. During this time, Dixit handed over these medicines to IG and Collector as well as Dr. Lakhan Poswal, Principal of RNT, and made them aware of its properties and uses. He informed that the data of all the people using medicines would be collected, and after the use of drugs, data will be kept of the changes in them. Also, the guide issued by the college will be placed in the main places, markets, government offices, etc. of Udaipur. This guide is also being provided in every medicine kit. Dixit also informed that after the success of the first phase, arrangements are being made to provide this medicine free of cost in the hospitals of the college.

Made these medicines:

Mouth Wash Yoga (Mouth Wash)

Pro. Dikshit said that the oral cavity of the mouth of our digestive and respiratory tract might contain up to 20 billion bacteria that cause diseases. In Ayurveda, to control these, the law of Achman, Kaval and Ganadhi has been prescribed. It has been decided by the expert committee of the college to build a mouth wash. By its use, the phlegm deposited in the throat and mouth, the mixture accumulated in the tongue and teeth, and the smell of the mouth and the stickiness is removed. It is beneficial in mouth ulcers, sore throat, tonsils, nausea, lethargy, anorexia, colds, throat and mouth ulcers, and burning sensation.

Nav rasayan yoga

Ayurveda describes chemicals to protect against the infection of COVID-19 by increasing immunity. Department of AYUSH Government of India, CSIR, And ICMR Research on the substances mentioned in Ayurveda is under progress in enhancing Kovid-19 infection prevention and protection. Nav rasayan Yoga has been made on the recommendation of the expert committee of the college based on the fluids directed by the Department of AYUSH. It has anti-oxidant, anti-bacterial, anti-inflammatory, anti-biotic, and immunomodulatory properties among the components of Navsayan Yoga. It helps prevent infection and enhance immunity, fever, cold, cough, sore throat, etc. Respiratory disease-related diseases like throat diseases, difficulty in breathing, etc., is beneficial in reducing mental stress and insomnia, an executive in related digestive disorders like loss of appetite,

indigestion, etc., removes toxic substances from the body. . Nasal oil

Dixit said that to prevent infection, strengthening of the nasal mucosa and respiratory institution, the Ayurvedic method has been mentioned in Ayurveda. Nourishing with drug proven oil strengthens the nasal mucosa, which helps prevent bacteria, viruses, dust particles from entering the body. Keeping in view, the expert committee of the college has approved sesame oil to be used as a vein, sculpted by law. By using it, toxins or toxins are removed, and it increases the immunity power. Frequent sneezing, nasal congestion, colds, catarrh, sinus, tonsils, headaches, mental stress, insomnia, half discoloration, hair loss, hair whitening, etc. are beneficial in diseases. This prevents the side effects of sterilization.
