A sudden feeling of vomiting, change in behavior of a person

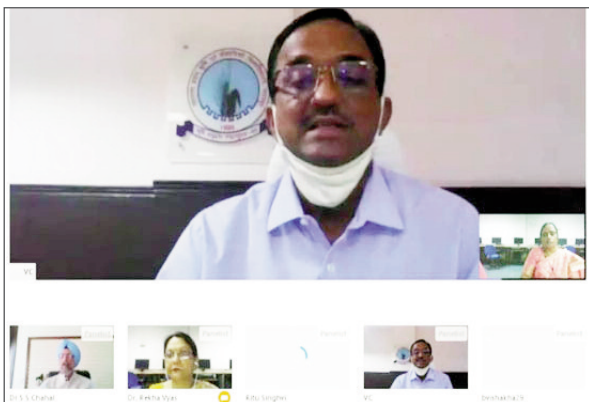
Irritating in small things, reduced eyesight

On the second day of the webinar, Dr. Narendra Singh Rathore, Vice-Chancellor, Lauding the webinar, ICT described today's need as critical. He said that we could give a new direction to agriculture even in the situation of Covid-19 by making

proper use of information and communication technology in agriculture and dissemination. That way, that food supply will be maintained in the country and the financial condition of farmers will also be strengthened.
