SCHEME TO PROVIDE FOOD FOR 8 RUPEES STARTED AT 14 PLACES IN UDAIPUR LAUNCHED



Udaipur: State Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot's pledge to "sleep no hunger" was completed on Thursday. According to the announcement of the Chief Minister, Indira Rasoi was launched in all the local bodies across the state to realize its resolution.

The scheme for Udaipur Municipal Corporation was inaugurated by District Collector Chetan Deora from 'Indira Rasoi' installed at the shelter site in Chetak Circle. He said that on the Chief Minister's initiative, every needy person will get hot and rich food with full respect for 8 rupees at the major 10 places

The scheme is operated through voluntary service organizations at 10 places in Udaipur Municipal Corporation and one place each in all the other municipalities of the district. Under the scheme, the beneficiary will have to pay Rs 8 for food, while the state government will be given a grant of Rs 12. He appreciated the efforts of the Municipal Corporation to provide a concrete shape to the scheme.

On this occasion, Udaipur MP Arjunlal Meena described it as an excellent gift for the residents. He said that this scheme would prove meaningful for the workers, passers, and public coming from different headquarters of the city.

Municipal Corporation Mayor Govind Singh Tank said that the operation of Indira Rasoi is a commendable effort, special attention will be given to quality and cleanliness. also, the person coming here will be served food with full respect and convenience. 
Independence Day celebrated in MPUAT

Socio-economic benefits through Ethnobotany - Talk by Dr Vartika

Udaipur: A National Webinar on 'Relevance of Ethnobotany in Contemporary socio-economic conditions' was organized as Silver jubilee celebration of SK Jain Institute of Ethnobiology (SKJIOE), Jiwaji University, Gwalior on its foundation day on 14 August, 2020. Dr Sangeeta Shukla, Vice-chancellor, Jiwaji University gave the welcome speech.

Guest of Honor and the Founder of the institute, Dr. S K Jain, wellknown as 'Father of Indian Ethnobotany' told about new avenues in Ethnobotany for employment generation. Dr S K Barik, Director, NBRI, Lucknow emphasized on scientific validation of ethnomedicinal plants and various ethno-ecological approaches in his Keynote address.

Prof. Avinash Tiwari, Honorary Director of SKJIOE, welcomed the participants and Dr Sapan Patel introduced all the Speakers of the webinar. Prof. Ashok K. Jain detailed about the founding of SKJIOE and its activities carried out in the last 25 years.

Dr. Vartika Jain who is working as Assistant Professor in Department of Botany, Govt. Meera Girls' College, Udaipur delivered her invited talk on the topic "Socio-economic benefits through Ethnobotany - Challenges and Prospects in India" in this National webinar. Dr. Jain gave various examples of employment generation through Ethno-food plants, Ethnomedicinal plants, Ethno-cosmetic plants along with examples of plants in art and craft and plants with multifarious utility like Drumstick, Silk Cotton Tree. Mahua etc.

She said that increasing the minimum standard of living is important for overall prosperity of society and discussed the challenges in income generation through various ethnobotanical practices. She suggested that capacity building programs could be arranged for proper collection, cultivation and conservation of plant resources along with value addition or processing techniques should be taught to young members of the community. A proper storage facility as well as quality assurance certification and marketing facility should be provided and the role of middlemen should be reduced so that the local communities can get direct benefit.

Other renowned speakers were Ethnobotanists Dr Prabha Bhogaonkar (Pune), Dr A K Goel (Lucknow), Dr K Radhakrishnan (Kerala), Dr Brij Lal (Palampur) and Dr Arvind Saklani (Banglore). In the panel discussion, all the speakers unanimously told that Ethnomedicine should come under the codified system of medicine so that its practices are not prohibited and self help groups could be prepared for helping in income generation of local people through local resources. In the end, Dr. Mahendra Gupta gave thanks to all the speakers and participants attending the Google meet Live streaming of the webinar.
