However, education is a comprehensive term that can be defined as "the process of receiving or giving systematic instruction" or as "an enlightening experience," whereas knowledge is defined as "facts, information, and skills acquired by a person through experience or education."5 Knowledge is the desired out-

come of education. As the def-

inition suggests, there are multiple types of knowledge: general knowledge or information, knowledge that increases personal awareness and knowledge that increases skills.

For education to increase awareness, it must provide an individual with a better understanding of the personal relevance of the information. Providing general knowledge will not do that. Educating individuals on the definition and consequences of obesity is not likely to lead to behavior change.

Behavior change is more likely if education increases individuals' awareness that they suffer from obesity and are personally experiencing consequences of obesity. Tailored education is necessary to increase awareness

because tailoring ensures that the information is relevant to the individual. Tailored education is also more likely to include explanation on why the information is pertinent specifically to the individual.

Education is one of the most critical determinants of success for both individuals and society. Individuals who are highly educated earn more, are healthier, and are more likely to contribute to civic organizations, whereas individuals with lower amounts of education are more likely to commit crimes, suffer unemployment, default on loans, and be incarcerated. As such, education is associated with economic growth and progress and is considered one of the main sources of prosperity for both individuals and nations.



Camp Udaipur: A medical camp for paralysis, brain, and spine patients is being organized on October 29 by the Pacific Center of Neuro



November 4.

In this medical camp, Dr. Atulabh Vajpayee, Dr. Narendramal, Dr. Yogendra Verma, and Dr. Akhilesh Shruti, Interventional Neurologists of PCNS, examined cases of paralysis, migraine, epilepsy, dizziness, headache, back pain, etc. diseases related to brain and spinal cord for diseases such as head injury, tingling in the extremities, brain tumors, slip discs and head watering. On this occasion, Dr. Atulabh Vajpayee said that 3 Indians every 1 minute three Indians, ie, every 20 seconds, is suffering from brain stroke, and this figure is increasing rapidly. At this rate, every year, 1.5 million Indians are suffering from brain stroke, and 90% of these patients are unable to reach the hospital on time.

If any person feels any difficulty about body balance, eyes, face, hands, speaking manner, then be immediately alert. In such a situation, it is most comfortable and necessary that you contact the doctor directly.
