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## MLSU and GGTU Jointly create A Record

**Distributed one and a half million masks in tribal area**  
**Udaipur:** Under the joint aegis of Mohanlal Sukhadia University and Govind Guru Tribal University Banswara, one and a half lakh masks were distributed in the tribal areas on Saturday corona awareness.

The Mohanlal Sukhadia University's main program was held in the adopted village Kailashpuri. Vice-Chancellor Professor Amarika Singh started distributing masks by offering tricolor to the children of a visually impaired family of the village. This was the first event after Kailashpuri was adopted. The vice-Chancellor said that the University in Kailashpuri



would organize various awareness programs. Sewing training, self-employment training, and skillful programs for youth will be organized. On this occasion, Pradhan Pratibha Nagda, up pradhan Pratap Singh Rathore, Sarpanch Narayan Lal, ZP Member Bhagwati Devi, Ashok Mod as well as Professor Pooranmal Yadav, Student Welfare dean of the University, Professor BL Verma Professor, Chief Proctor and Nodal Officer of Adarsh Village Dr. PS Rajput Doli Mogra, Dr. Anjali Singh, Dr. Shilpa Wardia, Dr. Kunjan Acharya, etc. expressed views. Repairing, colouring and touching are being done at various spots, huts, performance areas. The dates of Festival have yet to be announced, but Shilpgram is gradually getting activated. Last month a new hut from Nagaland joined the Shilpgram Huts family under 'Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat' Scheme. A workshop on regional instruments was also documented, all keeping social distancing. I always seek chance to visit Shilpgram to learn more and more. This time I wanted to visit Sculptors Workshop, but it has yet to take pace. Off course few Shops have been opened for the visitors. The craft persons have started exhibiting and selling their artefacts. This is encouraging to see Shilpgram partially active after Covid-19, Pandemic. It would be worthwhile to invite Folk and Tribal artists for their performances. This is high time as most of them have been starving. Their financial position is devastating. Such Cultural Centres must explore all possibilities to help them to maximum level.

While wandering and seeing work in progress I had a pleasant surprise to meet Ambaram Bheel and his wife Fatam (Fatehgarh, Jaisalmer), old couple associated with Shilpgram since inception. They had completed Rama hut of Jaisalmer and working on Sam hut. This was their 32nd year for Shilpgram. I met them almost after 10 years. Fatam recognized me immediately and told me that she used to listen to me while doing 'Farmaish' (anchoring) on stage during Shilpgram Utsavs. They have grown old but their love for Shilpgram compelled them to come every year. Sharing my sweet memories with this friend couple I thanked them. 'Mohan weaver and Cheliya tribal painter from Gujarat are no more, similarly many other craft persons who were associated in initial days of Shilpgram have passed away or are too weak to come but we would keep coming to Shilpgram as long we are alive' said Ambaram with glittering eyes.

After meeting them my old memories with Shilpgram took me to the past.

Shilpgram (Inaugurated on 8 Feb, 1989) is brain child of Madam Aditi Mehta, the founder Director of West Zone Cultural Centre who developed the barren land of Hawala village and created Shilpgram. Padmshri Haku Shah, noted designer from Gujarat helped Aditi Mehta in achieving her vision in creating Living Ethnographic Museum. The huts of representing Crafts of Gujarat, Rajasthan, Maharashtra and Goa were built with the indigenous materials and workers with appropriate plan-



tation. The workshop places had been the integral part of each hut whether it was of Weaver or Potter. The visitors had chance to see process of creation from very close. The folk artists were available to show their talent. The annual Shilpgram Utsav created Mini India show casing crafts, culture and cuisine of India at one place.

With the passage of time many things have been developed, many changes have taken place and small plants have become big trees giving shelter to many types of birds.

Shilpgram has also given platform to many Folk and Tribal artisans and performers. Many of them reached very high level.

Few years back on the Silver Jubilee of Shilpgram Utsav, I met Raas dance group leader, Haku bhai Joshi from Maliya Hatina and Yakub bhai Sidi from Bharuch who had also performed in the inaugural ceremony of Shilpgram. After 25 years the groups had young artists replacing their old generation. It is always proud to see Folk artists who have retained their old Traditions. Young Bhagap Player from Alwar Yusuf Mewati's father Umar Farukh and his Grandfather Zahur Khan Mewati have also allured audience for many years. These are few examples how Shilpgram has patronised our age old folk and

tribal arts. I know many people of Udaipur who are regular visitor of Shilpgram and people who did not miss Shilpgram Utsav.

This time Shilpgram Utsav may also take place in next month depending on the position.

I had a chance to discuss This significance of Makar Sankranti on FM Radio with Shri Mahendra Singh Lalas, Programme Executive of Akashwani, Udaipur.

Makar Sankranti, dedicated to Lord Sun is the first festival of the year celebrated across India. Makar Sankranti has spiritual, divine, harvest and social significance. ## Sangeeta Shukla : Promising name in Numerology

In numerology, the use of the laws of mathematics is practiced through the numerals to present a detailed description of various aspects of man, his ideology, subjects of life, etc. In numerology, the nine planets are calculated on the basis of their characteristics. Just as the influence of planets in the horoscope works, similarly the role of numerals in numerology is very important. Each number is associated with some other planet, such as the number 1 represents the Sun, the number 2 represents the Moon and the number 3 represents Jupiter. Numerology covers numbers from 1 to 9, zero (0) is not included in it.

Mrs. Shukla tells which planet has which effect on which points and these nine planets have their influence on human life. Birth and Destiny number are constant, it is not possible to change them because the person's date of birth cannot be changed in any way. Names can be changed. In numerology every letter has a number such as A = 1, B = 2 etc. In numerology, by changing the spelling of the name, the name can be made lucky according to birth and Destiny number. If we try to know the history of numerology, we will find that according to Mrs. Shukla, its history must have been more than 10,000 years ago, their roots started to flourish in Egypt, Babylon and Greece and gained prominence through the works of Pythagoras.
