Is the Constitution of India safe ?

When a President of India addresses the nation on the eve of the Republic Day what should he speak about? What should the Prime Minister say in his speech when he addresses the nation from the ramparts of the Red Fort on the Independence Day?

What should be the message to the people of India when we celebrate the adoption of the constitution of India on the Republic Day? When we talk of the celebrations on a national day what should we focus on? Can anybody name a channel "Republic" and indulge in all kind of spurious activities in the name of journalism and still stay safe? Can a whole community be abused and insulted simply because the party in power has an agenda with a different interest?

Some of these questions are difficult to answer and are uncomfortable to a majority government at the centre. The Republic Day is celebrated to commemorate the adoption of the constitution of India. We remember Baba

Sahab Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar as the architect of the constitution.

It will be interesting to know who else were the members of the draft committee of the constitution. They included Alladi Krishnaswami Ayyar, N. Gopalaswami, B.R. Ambedkar, K.M Munshi, Mohammad Saadulla, B.L. Mitter and D.P. Khaitan.

These people framed the constitution of India which is the supreme law of India. The constitution of India was adopted on November 26, 1949 and came into effect from January 26, 1950. It replaced the Government Of India Act, 1935 as the country's fundamental governing document, and the Dominion of India became the Republic of India.

The document lays down the framework determining the fundamental political code, structure, procedure, powers and duties of the government's institutions.

It also states the fundamental rights, principles and the duties of the citizen. The constitution of India imparts constitutional supremacy, since it was created by a constituent

assembly and was adopted by the people of India with a declaration in its preamble. The parliament cannot overwrite the constitution.

The questions raised today are very pertinent to the discussion on the constitution of India. It gives freedom of religion to every citizen. But should a President of India in the capacity of the President of the Republic of India give donation for building a temple? Should the provinces of India frame laws in the name of safeguarding freedom of religion which interfere in the individual's freedom to choose a partner in marriage simply because he or she belongs to a minority religion? Should the names of towns and cities be changed simply because they have a different historical context? Can the basic principles like secularism and socialism be compromised? Can the constitutional institutions like the Supreme Court of India, The Election Commission of India and the national investigation agencies like CBI, ED and the departments like Income Tax be imagined to be playing a partisan role?

Can the announcement that the Temple in

Ayodhya will be complete in April 2024 just before the country goes to polls in May in the same year be treated as naïve and innocent without any political undertones?

Lastly, how should a nation look at the role of the Parliamentary government and people's protest? Should a government turn a deaf ear to the demands of lakhs of its citizens simply because it could maneuver the passage of some bills in the parliament on the strength of its members? Does public opinion doesn't have any place in a democracy?

On the Republic Day 2021 when thousands of farmers take out tractor parade parallel to the official parade in Delhi a number of such questions stare in the eyes of the people who have full faith in the constitution of India and in Indian democracy. The likes of Varavara Rao, Sudha Bhardwaj, Gautam Navlakha, Steins Swami who are in jails also demand answers to questions about the body politic. Who will answer these questions is a puzzle. As a journalist, however, our task is to raise them and make people ponder over them.

Special campaign will run in the district to give accountability through non-accountancy - District Collector

Sriganganagar: District Collector Shri Mahavir Prasad Verma said that a special campaign will be run at the tehsil level for non-accountability. District Collector Shri Verma said that in this regard, all the subdivision officers have been directed to carry out special campaigns in their respective subdivision areas to settle the pending cases of non-accountability and Patwari, Girdawar and Tehsildar will examine all the cases. He said that in cases where there is no legal hurdle in giving accountability, relief should be given by organizing a special camp for giving accountability rights to such non-account holders in the next 15 days and all subdivision officers should submit a cradle report to the District Collector.

The District Collector said that the non-accountable cases, where there is a legal impediment, or the accountability cannot be given, should be sent to the State Government and also make their suggestions, by making appropriate proposals for resolving it.

It is necessary to mention here that in the VC taken by Chief Minister Mr. Ashok Gehlot on January 13, all the District Collectors were instructed to settle such cases from non-accountability and the Chief Minister took it very seriously. District Collector Shri Verma gave the subdivision wise status of such cases, in which 933 of Suratgarh, 1093 of Anupgarh, Sadulshahar 333, Raisinghnagar 1543, Ganganagar 471, Karanpur 464, Padampur 212, Ghadasana 1142, Rawala (Tehsil) 927 cases have to be settled. District Collector Shri Mahavir Prasad Verma has appealed to the common man to take maximum benefit of these special camps and get accountability rights. This effort of the district collector in the direction of public interest is highly appreciated.

Transforming the way ahead for e-bikes

The Indian population largely moves on two-wheelers, with approximately one-third of all households owning one. Two-wheelers also account for as much as 75% of India's vehicular emissions, unfortunately putting the majority of the onus of emission reduction squarely on the shoulders of those riders. It is for this reason that the Indian government unveiled its EV subsidy programs, FAME (Faster Adoption and Manufacturing of Electric Vehicle). This has helped in driving the adoption of electric-scooters on Indian roads. However, the rate of adoption is still low primarily due to the heavy upfront cost and the lack of charging infrastructure.

This is where electric bicycles, aka e-bikes, play a crucial role. With their ease of use and maintenance, low upfront cost, high energy efficiency and portable design, e-bikes have rapidly been seen as the most viable option for intra-city mobility. Delivery personnel, for eg., have seen an effective rise in delivery fulfillments when using e-bikes as opposed to the traditional scooter and motorcycle. E-bikes have become a very eco-friendly alternative to the large two-wheeler using population.

Innovations in e-bikes are increasing rapidly. Bulky lead-acid batteries have made way for much more compact & lighter nickel cadmium and lithium-ion batteries. Innovations have also given rise to newer trends including folding e-bikes and IoT enabled smart e-bikes with app connectivity. With such development, e-bikes have become a highly sustainable and effective solution to the air pollution and traffic congestion woes of India. However, the cost of an e-bike is out of reach from most of the country's two-wheeler riders. The government's focus on EVs has still been restricted to only the motorized vehicles and hence, is inadvertently missing out on the massive opportunity at hand.
