

Foundation stone and inauguration of crores of works in Sahada

Chief Minister gave a gift in a virtual program

Bhilwara: Chief Minister Shri Ashok Gehlot, on Friday handed over various development works to the people of the Sahada region of the district through a virtual program. About 18 crores 30 works were inaugurated, and 13 works worth 45 crores were laid. He was accompanied by Speaker of the Legislative Assembly Dr. CP Joshi, Minister-in-charge of the district, Dr. Raghu Sharma, Minister Urban Development Mr. Shanti Dhariwal, PHED Minister, Dr. BD Kalla, and high officials from Jaipur during the program.

District Collector Shri Shivprasad M. Nakate, District Superintendent of Police Mr. Vikas Sharma, ADM Administration Mr. Rakesh Kumar, Additional Chief Executive Officer NK Rajora, Chief Medical, and Health Officer Dr. Mustaq Khan, were present in the video conference room of Information Technology and Communication Department at the district level. Joint Director SD Vyas and other departmental officers were present.

Addressing the program, the Chief Minister said that the pace of development in the state had not been allowed to slow down despite many obstacles. The state government is committed to the state's overall growth and the person sitting at the end. The Speaker of the Legislative Assembly stressed the need to keep pace with the changing times of many ancient governance systems. The Minister-in-charge gave information about the development work of the district and the medical sector in the state during the Corona period. Ministers Mr. Pratap Singh Khachariwas, Mr. Pramod Jain Bhaya, Mr. Udaylal Anjana, Mr. Subhash Garg, Mr. Bhanwar Singh Bhati, Mr. Govind Singh Dotsara, Mr. Saleh Mohammed were also addressed.

This work was released 4 crore community health center building in Koshithal, 1.85 crores primary health center building in Khakhala, Gram Panchayat Bitha, Narayan Kheda, Khemana, Khakharamala, Nanda inaugurated works worth about Rs 2.5 crore related to drinking water. Rooms, computers, in



schools of various gram panchayats of the area, including a police station building costing 2.52 crore in Raipur, 33 VK GSS constructed in Kot at the cost of 1.36 crore, Dhanalakshmi center of 24 lakh in Raipur, Kisan Seva Kendra of 10 lakh The works of crores of laboratory, furniture, etc. were also released. Apart from this, the works of roads between different villages were also released. A total of about 18 crore works were released.

Foundation stone- The foundation stone for widening 100 feet of road from Sahada Chauraha to Spin fed mill in Gangapur was laid. It will cost 16 crores under DMFT item under Rural Water Scheme

3.33 crore in Raipur and 2.48 crore in Borana, water tanks will be provided to the common person. Construction work of CWR and pump house and repair of the pipeline will be done at Mokhunda for 1.9 crores.

The foundation stone of various roads was also laid under the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana. A new building of Sub Health Center Fukiya will be constructed at the cost of 30 lakhs and the building of Khera of Rappavi Guda will be constructed from 51.87 lakhs. These were also done during the foundation stone program. About 45 crore rupees will be spent on all the works laid. The District Collector said that all these

works will be started immediately.

Other Gifts: The state government has left no stone unturned in the development of the Sahada region. Development work has been done on a large scale as per the requirement of the area. An amount of 7 crores has been sanctioned from DMFT for Raipur bypass. An amount of 6 crores has been released from the DMFT item for the construction of a new government college in Gangapur.

In the Hamirgarh subdivision area, 4 crore rupees will be spent on constructing the Vantage Causeway in Jawasia on Gurlana-Mandalgarh road. A total of 9 major works are under tender, on which an amount of 23.47 crores will be spent. All the tendering processes will be completed before March 15.

The supply of Chambal Beverage Project has been started in Gangapur city, which is now supplying drinking water in the city at an interval of 48 hours instead of 96 hours. Chambal water supply will be started in Koshithal and Raipur in March.

Chambal aims to provide

pure drinking water by December 2021 to 252 villages in the assembly constituency. ACJM Court has started in Gangapur. The Public Works Department has approved 20 works of roads under the SRF Fund, on which an amount of about 21 crores will be spent.

Picture of development in 2 years: In the last two years, 4030 works of 154.62 crores were completed in the Sahada Assembly constituency. Similarly, 1653 works of 94.52 crores are in progress. Two hundred ninety-seven works worth 85.88 crore have been approved, whose tender is under process.

Ministers also announced:

Recently, the ministers made various announcements for the development of the area; during their visit, Urban Development Minister Shri Shanti Dhariwal announced to start sewerage and drinking water projects in Gangapur Municipality after approval from Asian Development Bank. Construction of stadium and auditorium at Gangapur was also announced, which will facilitate the players who take inspiration from the late regional MLA Shri Kailash Trivedi.

The community-based approach required for disaster management - Dr. Anil Gupta

Udaipur: National Institute of Disaster Management, Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India and College of Community Sciences, Maharana Pratap University of Agriculture and Technology Udaipur, organized a one-day national webinar on community-based disaster risk assessment and management on February 10. The Chief Guest of the webinar, Dr. Narendra Singh Rathore, Vice-Chancellor MP U AIT, said that this webinar on Disaster Management and Risk Assessment needs the hour and said that recently the country had suffered a tragedy in Chamoli, Uttarakhand.



Due to various types of natural and human-made disasters, people have to suffer a loss of life every year. If the community is trained in disaster management and risk assessment, then the loss due to disaster can be reduced. Speaking on the topic of Community Ecology and Disaster Management in the livelihood and economic sector as the keynote speaker, Dr. Anil Kumar Gupta, Chairman, ECRRM, National Disaster Management Institute, Ministry of Home Affairs, and Government of India said that community-based approach to disaster management and evaluation There is a need to adopt an approach. He said that any community should be strengthened for all development programs, including disaster preparedness and mitigation, and plans should be made for all types of disaster management preparedness, keeping the area-specific society and community at the center. Dr. Gupta has contributed significantly to the National Disaster Management Policy formulation in various departments through the National Institute of Disaster Management. The National Agricultural Disaster Management Plan, National Health Adaptation Plan, Crisis Management Plan, etc., have contributed to many policymaking.

Giving a welcome address at the beginning of the webinar, Dr. Meenu Srivastava, the community college, MPUAT, welcomed everyone and said that disaster never affects the population group equally. Gender discrimination is an important dimension, and in any disaster, Women and children are more affected and vulnerable. At the beginning of the webinar, Dr. Ajay Sharma, the dean of the College of Engineering, also addressed and said that all students and faculty of agriculture, community science, and engineering need to have knowledge and skills in disaster management.

More than 276 students and faculty participated in the abstract webinar, coordinating the webinar's event, Piyush Chaudhary of RCA and Mr. Harshit Sharma, a young professional of ECD RM of National Institute of Disaster Management. The program was conducted and thanked by the Head of the Department, Dr. Gayatri Tiwari.

Hindustan Zinc established India's first underground first aid station



Udaipur: Safety is an unbreakable aspect in Hindustan Zinc's work culture, and by expanding this aspect, the company has set up India's first underground first aid and ambulance center at its Rampura Agucha mines. It is equipped with an underground first aid and ambulance center fresh airbase, which is specially designed for underground mines. A rescue team has been deployed here to appoint qualified medical professionals and rescue chiefs to lead it.

This first-of-its-kind rescue and treatment system within the ground will be operational 24 hours, and a dedicated rescue and paramedical staff will be deployed here. This underground mine station also has a dedicated emergency vehicle equipped with AED, ECG, and reviving apparatuses. The station also has air-conditioned facilities for comfort, along with portable oxygen cylinders and saline bottles, BP monitoring instruments, dehydration messaging instruments, and pulse oximeters that can be used in an emergency.

According to Mine Rescue Rule 1985 (Rule 27), there should be a rescue team with paramedical staff at the Fresh Air Base in an emergency. Hindustan Zinc has taken an additional step forward in compliance with these rules by setting up the Underground First Aid and Ambulance Center. This will intensify the Center and Ambulance Rescue Team's response time so that prompt action can be taken in an emergency.

They decided to dive deep to render services for the society and formed the group called Voluntary Organization or widely known as Team VO. Due to a huge network of volunteers and some bitter experiences during their journey they decided to officially register the organization and wanted a name to represent the cause, eventually the name "Lit by Humanity" (LBH) evolved. Lit by Humanity provides free service for the visually challenged students, specially abled and underprivileged needy across the country. "Lit by Humanity" has a 12-member strong core team with 2500+ Volunteers contributing from over 13 countries. Post the lockdown restrictions of the current pandemic, they intend to register LBH as a society and become the torchbearers to generations. LBH are running Gadgets for a cause Fulfilling groceries requirements, Online sessions for visually impaired and lower socio-economic background students projects. NGO provide. Visual Assistance, Visual Reading, Virtual Teaching, Writing, Typing Assignments. Other activities Facilitating and fulfilling blood requirements, Creating awareness on Sign Language, Protection for animals and Pet Requirements, Filling Applications, Food Donation and Clothes Donation Drive, Helping other NGOs, Sponsorships, Organizing events, Visiting Orphanages and old age homes and Virtual Celebrations of various events.

District Collector appeals for de-addiction

District Collector Shri Mahavir Prasad Verma has motivated the people to keep away from drugs and alcohol by running drug de-addiction campaign in Sriganganagar District. He said that in the coming time, efforts for drug de-addiction will continue. On the basis of the interaction with the doctors, he appealed to the public that if any child behaves abnormal or changes his daily routine, the parents should periodically inspect the school bags, clothes, cupboards, etc. of the child. If abnormal behavior is found in the children, parents immediately seek the help of the administration and take advantage of the schemes run by the Government. He said that children waking up late, spending too much time in the toilet, sudden anger or irritability can be symptoms of drugs or any type of intoxication. Parents should be aware while observing the daily routine of children and stay in contact with teachers and seek immediate help if found their children intoxicated. He said that the pocket expenses of children should be kept under control and teachers also keep checking children's bags etc. in schools suddenly. District Collector Shri Mahavir Prasad Verma said that it is the responsibility of the society to help such people by keeping positive thinking and help them, so that results can be better. Adolescence is very tender stage in which children may get distracted and choose wrong ways to earn money and fulfill their desires. Shri Verma has taken interest to educate the youth himself by attending camps run by Police and excise departments. Sriganganagar District is quite near to Punjab and Pakistan border. District collector is doing all efforts to keep an eye on smuggling and other sources which can be harmful for youth. District Superintendent of Police Shri Rajan Dushyant informed that the drug de-addiction campaign is being carried out effectively in the District. In 2020 nearly 20 camps of public awareness were organized by the Police and hundreds of people were made aware at village level. Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the numbers had to be kept low but in the coming time, awareness camps with higher numbers will be organized. Police is taking strict action against drug dealers and drug users these days. Operation Prahar is also being run, in which many arrests have been made and millions of intoxicating pills and materials were recovered. The District hospital has a system of counselors and psychiatrists, who are helping people for de-addiction. In 2020, 1156 patients were counseled and children in schools were also made aware and motivated to be careful about drugs. CMHO Dr. Girdharilal Mehra is also taking interest to prevent youth from drugs etc. Voluntary organizations & Institutions like Tapovan Institute of Drug Addiction and Rehabilitation, Manohar Bai Mandir Samiti in Sriganganagar District are also working in this. From 15 August 2020 to 17 February 2021, campaigns were conducted in 42 villages and people were made aware by showing short films.
