Rotary Foundation to set up central fabrication unit in Narayan Seva

Udaipur, to provide relief to the Divyang who lost their hands and feet in accidents, Rotary Inter National Foundation will cooperate in setting up Central Fabrication Unit at Narayana Seva Sansthan Udaipur. In this, modular prostheses (hand and foot), calipers, etc., will be made available to the Divyang in the country and abroad according to their need.

The preparations before establishing the Central Fabrication Unit were observed by Rajesh Agarwal, District Governor (3054) of Rotary International on Sunday at Seva Mahatirth of Lio ka, Guda, along with him the President of Rotary Club Udaipur Mewar, Rotarian. Suresh Jain, patron Rotarian. Hansraj Chaudhary, Assistant Governor Rotarian. Sandeep Singhawadia, Dr. Arun Bapna, and other officials were also present.



Dr. Manas Ranjan Sahu, an orthotic-prosthetics of the institute, gave technical information about establishing the fabrication unit to the Rotary team and said that artificial limbs could be transported to the Rotary team after this speedy person with more speed. Rotarian. Governor Rajesh Agrawal said that Narayan Seva Sansthan

is one such resort of international people whose stopped lives are moving again.

He said that by setting up a fabrication unit for artificial limb manufacturing here, the Rotary Foundation would get satisfaction and happiness. The Unit will be set up with the joint efforts and cooperation of Damori Druid Hill (DeKalb Country, USA), Rotary International Foundation, and Rotary Club Udaipur-Mewar.

The state-of-the-art machine for manufacturing artificial limbs will be started, which will cost about one lakh 10 thousand dollars. Addressing Rotary Mewar Hansraj Chaudhary's patron said that Narayan Seva Sansthan had given Udaipur a new identity in terms of service worldwide. It is a matter of pride for the club to become a partner in the differently-abled service with such an

institution.

Earlier, Welcoming the Rotary Governor and the party, Director in-charge of the institute Palak Agarwal said that the institute was trying for this Unit for a long time. The Rotary International Foundation has filled the color of enthusiasm in innumerable people's lives by realizing it. It will enable artificial limbs to be produced on a large scale.

Giving details of 36 years of the institute's services, the Foreign Cell in-charge of the institute gave information to poor unemployed and disabled people in Corona period to take their necessities to their home. He said that the fabrication unit would be a milestone in the direction of modular prosthesis construction. Media Associate BP Gaur and veteran journalist Vishnu Hiteshi were also present.

UCCI Celebrates Udaipur Airport's First place in Excellence Survey
